Morrison, UNT professor of early childhood education.

"A Path Appears," a new PBS documentary premiering on KERA, follows journalists Nicholas Kristof and Sheryl WuDunn, and dedicated actor/advocates to Colombia, Haiti, Kenya, and throughout the United States. They uncover the harshest forms of gender inequality, the devastating impact of poverty and the ripple effects that follow and the effective solutions being forged to combat them.

KERA is screening episode two of "A Path Appears" in partnership with TWU and UNT. It features actress Jennifer Garner, who returns to her native West Virginia to visit families enrolled in Save the Children's Early Steps program, which introduces early learning to children living in poverty, and provides support for mothers.

The four-hour "A Path Appears" series will air in three weekly installments at 9 p.m. starting Jan. 26 on KERA TV.
