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## **FACULTY GRANTS ANNOUNCED**

**Dr. Jeffrey Huber** (library and information studies) received \$72,000 from the National Institutes of Health for "Woman to Woman: Community Health Information Project" from Sept. 30, 2001 to Sept. 29, 2002. The project's goal is to facilitate information access at select community-based women's health agencies in Houston. Specific objectives include creating a local health information network with TWU as its hub, training women's health agency staff to use electronic information resources to enhance their job performance, providing consumer health information support to clients at these women's facilities and increasing awareness of National Library of Medicine products and services. collaborative effort involving TWU, Houston Academy of Medicine-Texas Medical Center Library, Houston Area Women's Center, The Rose, El Centro de Corazon and the Lesbian Health Initiative at Montrose Clinic.

**Dr. Linda Marshall** (sociology and social work) received \$138,904 from the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services for the IV-E Child Welfare Training Project at TWU from Sept. 1, 2001 to Aug. 31, 2002. The project is a partnership between TWU and the State of Texas for child welfare training of bachelor of social work students. The program aims to provide specialized child welfare training to undergraduate social work students during the completion of their bachelor's degrees. It also gives the students field practicum experiences at TDPRS in Child Protective Services. The program's goal is to increase the number and qualifications of BSW graduates who enter child welfare practice.

**Elizabeth Snapp**, director of libraries, received \$175,000 from the Telecommunications Infrastructure Fund Board for the TIVF LB8 Texas Academic Library Grant from Aug. 31, 2001 to Aug. 31, 2002. The grant provides electronic solutions to enhance the printing and electronic delivery of library materials to students, faculty and staff at the TWU libraries in Denton, Dallas and Houston. The solutions include a print management system, equipment and software for digitizing oversize and rare materials, microform materials, converting materials for delivery via the Internet to e-mail boxes, and providing Ariel send workstations.

**Betty Henderson** and **Dr. Rebecca Krepper** (nursing - Houston) received \$100,000 from private sources for the Helene Fuld Health Trust Educational Mobility Proposal from Sept. 6, 2001 to Sept. 6, 2003. The proposal requests scholarship funds to support registered nurses who wish to return to school to earn a master's degree in nursing. These nurses will be selected based upon their potential for academic success in graduate studies.

**Dr. Gayle Hersch** (Occupational Therapy-Houston) and **Carolyn Kelley** (Physical Therapy-Houston) received \$21,178 from a subcontract with the University of Texas Health Science Center, which received a grant from the National Institute of Nursing Research. The grant runs from July 1, 2001 to March 31, 2002 and funds the Intervention for Stroke Survivors and Spousal Caregivers project. This project will be submitted to the National Institute of Nursing Research.
