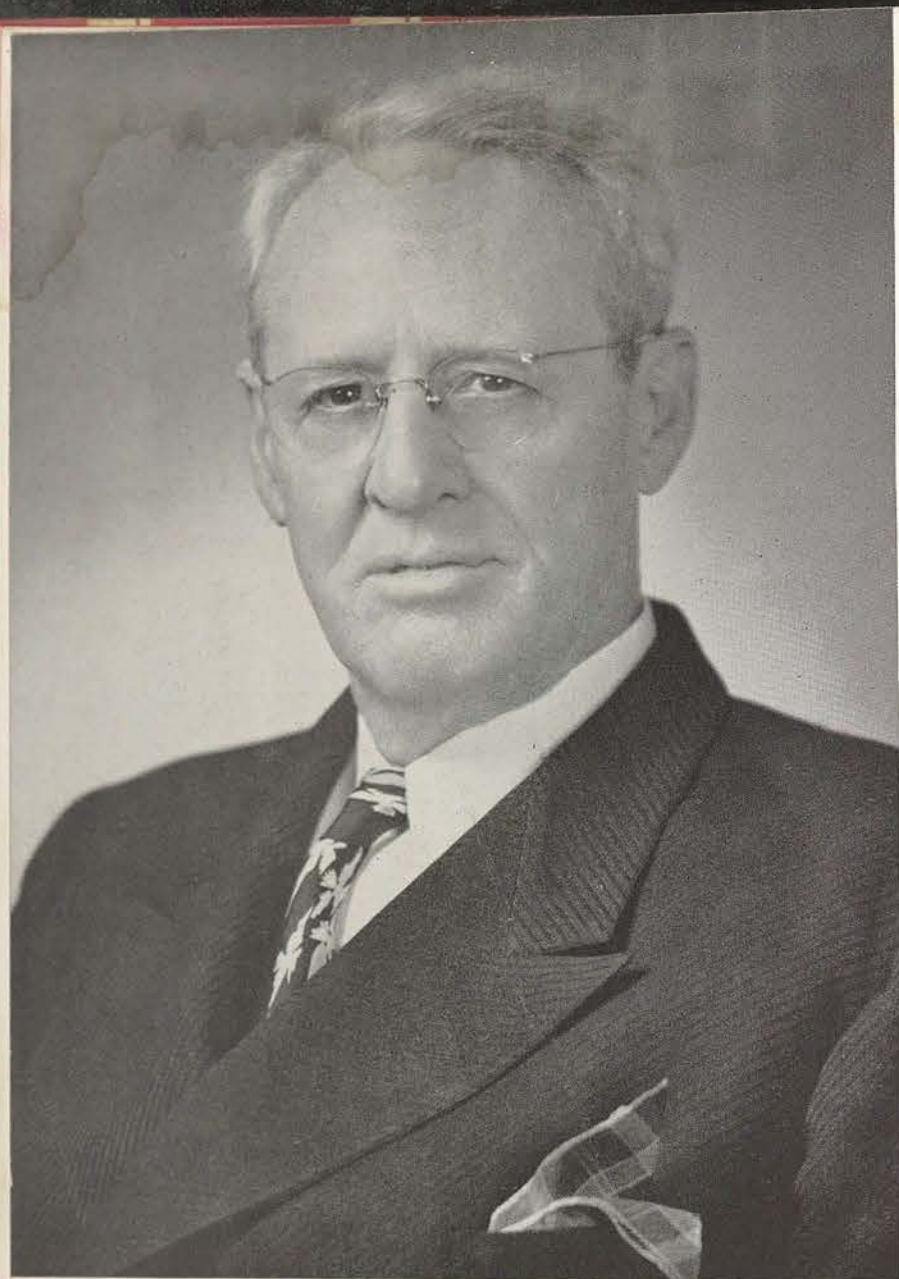
ALTHOUGH we must find our own ways through many passages that confront us, we may feel free at all times to call for assistance from our registrar, Mr. Francis W. Emerson.

Dean Emeritus of T.S.C.W.

Dr. E. V. White

DEAN E. V. WHITE, friend and advisor to more than 50,000 girls during his 33 years at T.S.C.W., retired in August, 1948, shortly after his sixty-ninth birthday.

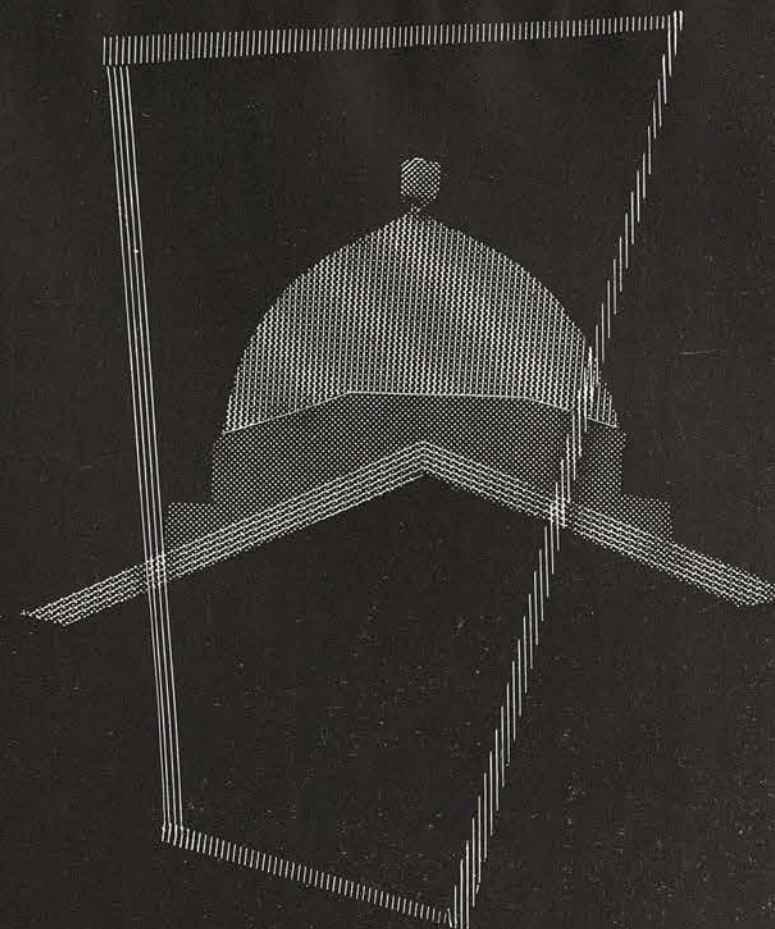
The tall, kindly Scotch-Irishman came to what is now T.S.C.W. on April 1, 1915. Only 500 students were enrolled in the "College of Industrial Arts" that year. There were 39 instructors. Four buildings had been erected — the Administration

Building, Smith-Carroll Hall, Household Arts Building, and old Stoddard Hall, which was torn down to erect the present senior dormitory.

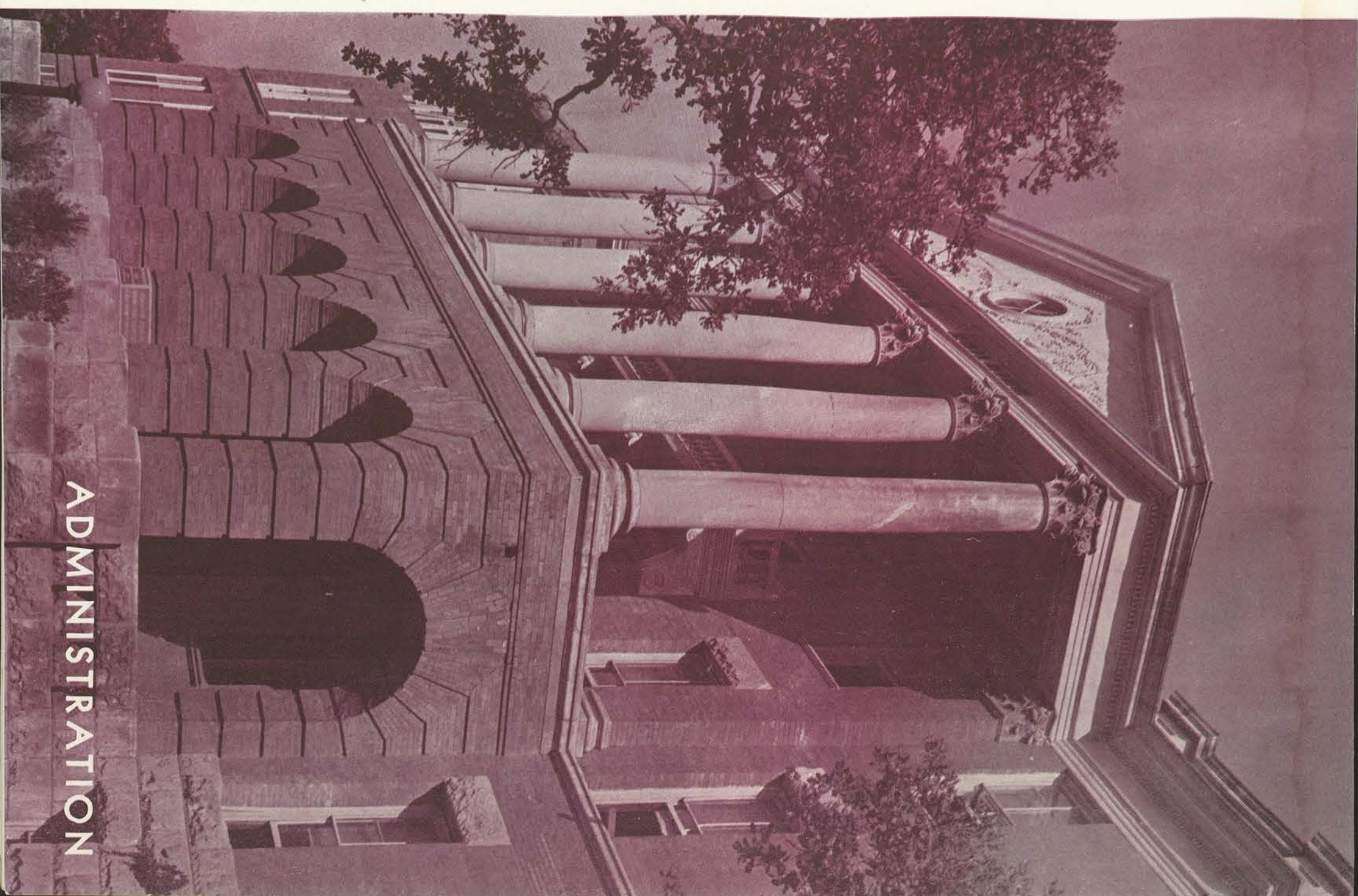
Dean White watched the college grow up. Today the enrollment is more than 2,100. The faculty numbers almost 200. The oak-studded hill is covered with modern instructional buildings with new additions under-way.

During Dean White's tenure, the college conferred 10,000 degrees. Many of those graduates profited from the system of faculty advisors which Dean White devised as a method for helping students select courses. All of those same graduates profited from the Dean's rich good humor and patience.

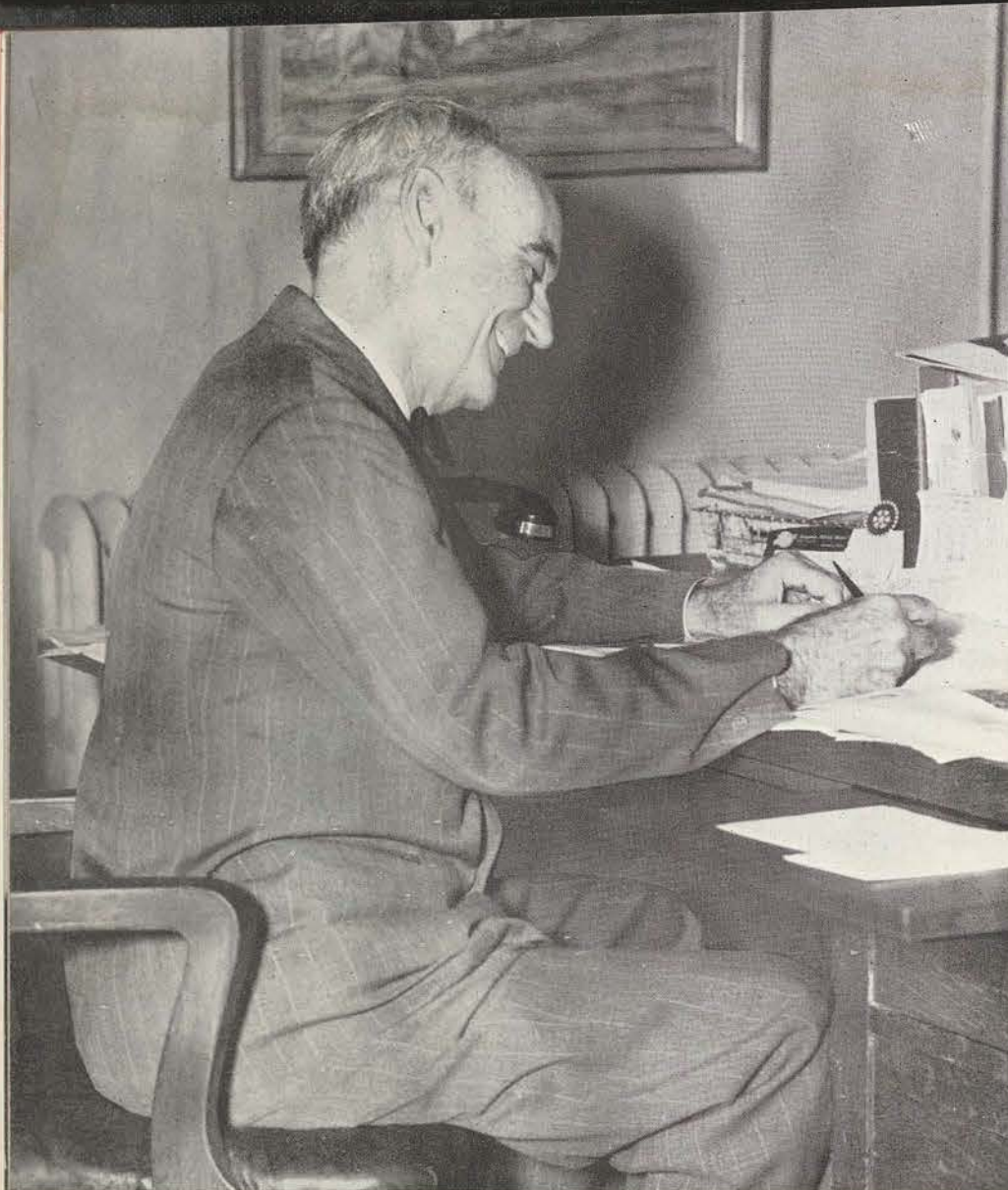
In October, 1948, the Board of Regents elected him dean emeritus of T.S.C.W. Commenting on the appointment to a *Daily Lass-O* reporter, the Dean said that he hopes the new title will help him in lobbying for the college at Austin where he expects to live after completing a history of T.S.C.W.

TO THE CLASS OF 1949:

In asking yourselves what T.S.C.W. has meant to you during your years as a student here, I would like to quote from one who has recently considered the values of college training. As he sees it these values are (1) the increase of your learning, (2) the ripening of your thinking, and (3) the refinement of your living. Then he adds: "A true test of education is whether or not it fits us to live more fruitfully. Learning for its own sake is sterile. Thought unrelated to life is inconsequential. Learning and thought, made useful in the enrichment of life, become essentials . . . College, properly understood, prepares for everything that is basic in life. It trains the mind and conditions the emotions. It provides balance and a sense of direction . . .

"Hervey Allen has a pertinent passage in *The Forest and the Fort*. It reads:

"There are, of course, minor and cardinal points of reference on the compass card of life. Compasses vary, and even strong characters can go off on a tangent. But once choose some fixed star to steer by, and talent, professional honour, experience and imagination become levers to move and tools to reshape the world. Wander blindly, and they may well become so much baggage to carry over the Mountains of Confusion."

College should help you to find your star." That it will do so is my fervent hope.

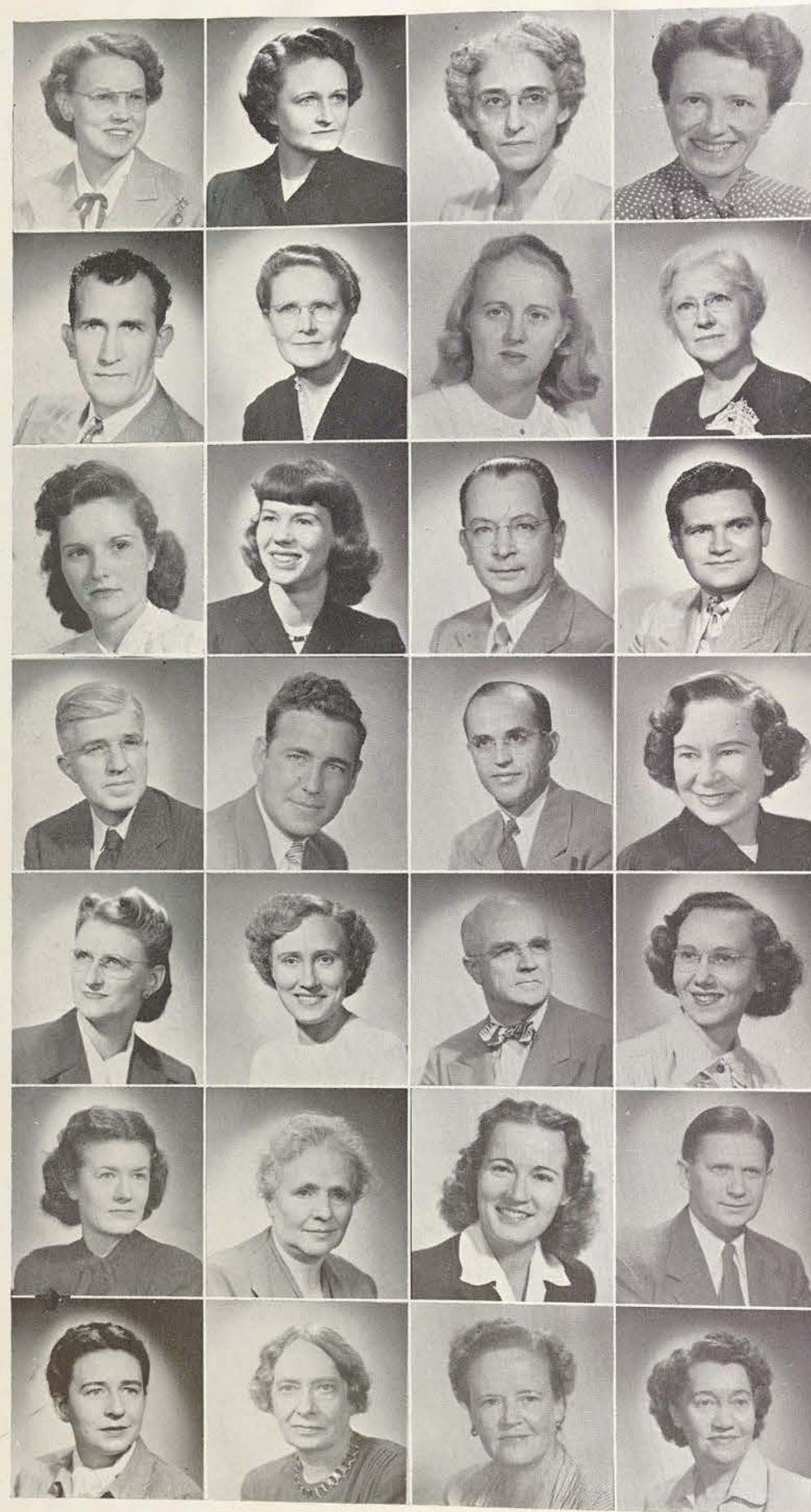

DEPARTMENTS



Education, Philosophy and Psychology

The main objective of the Department of Education, Philosophy, and Psychology is to integrate the influences of all the departments of the college to the end that teachers from TSCW will be desirable persons and effective teachers.

History and Government

One of the main interests of the History and Government Department is to give a solid background for understanding current thought, institutions, and developments by giving an understanding of how these have developed and of the principles upon which they are based.





Mathematics

The Mathematics Department endeavors to develop in its students an appreciation of the beauty and power of the oldest of the sciences. It also emphasizes practical mathematics, the importance of which to the modern world is increasingly apparent.

English

Students in the English Department esteem the power of self-expression through the written and spoken word. Creative writing and the study of literary masterpieces are for them the sources of joy that will increase and deepen with the years.



Sociology

The Department of Sociology endeavors to give students a basic understanding of the fundamental facts about the society in which they live. Students take the B.A. and M.A. degrees in sociology and the B.A. degree in pre-professional work.



Bible

The aims of the Bible Department are: (1) To induce students to read and love the Bible, and (2) To present Bible truths and depict the life and teachings of Jesus, as solutions for individual student problems and the needs of our world.

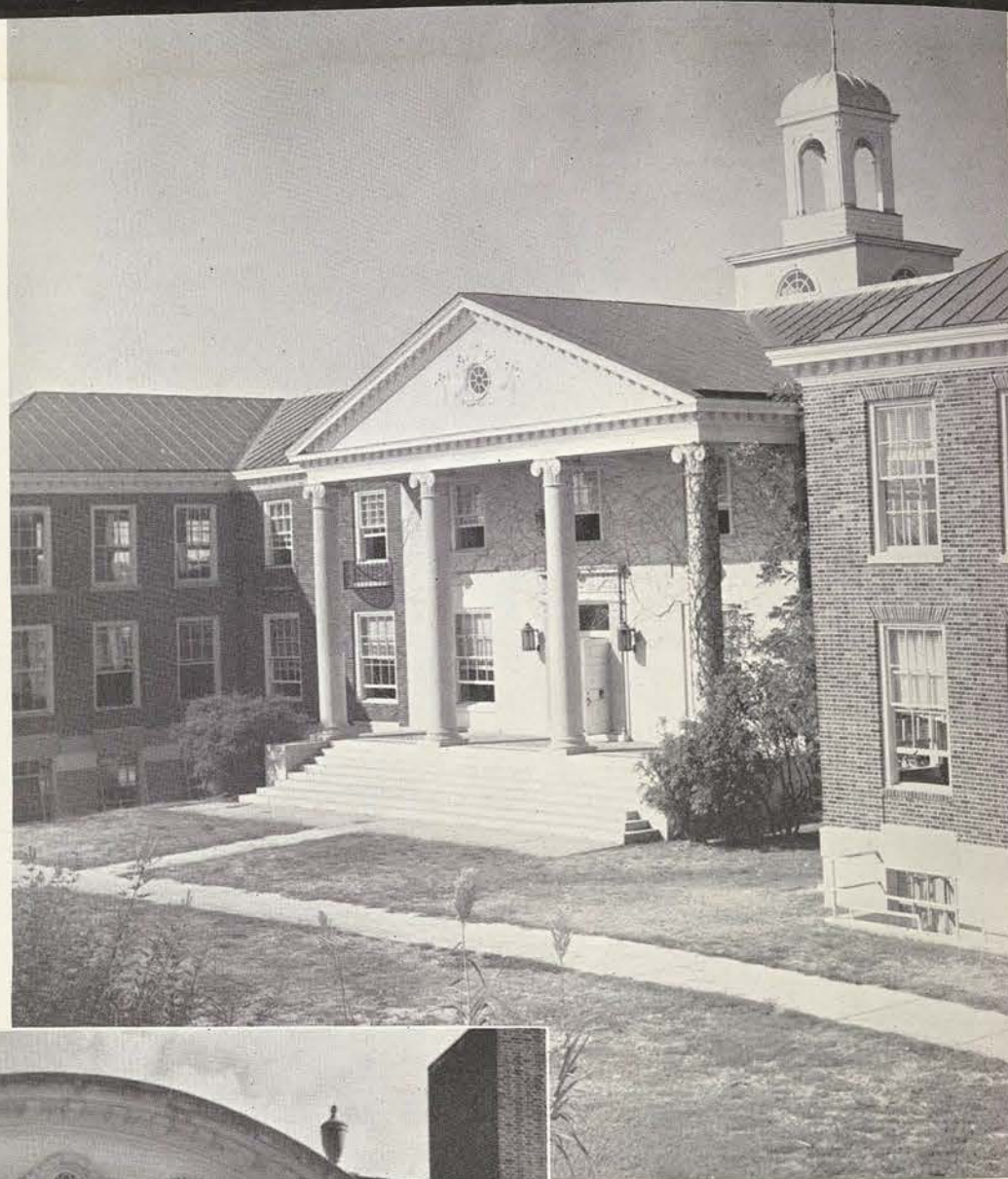


Foreign Languages

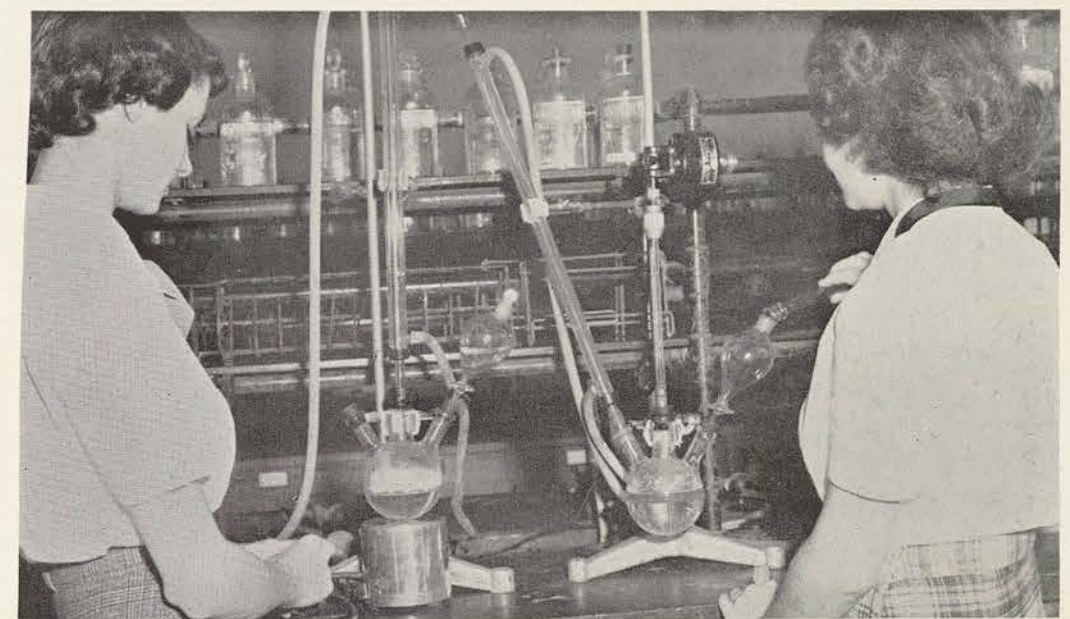
Biology

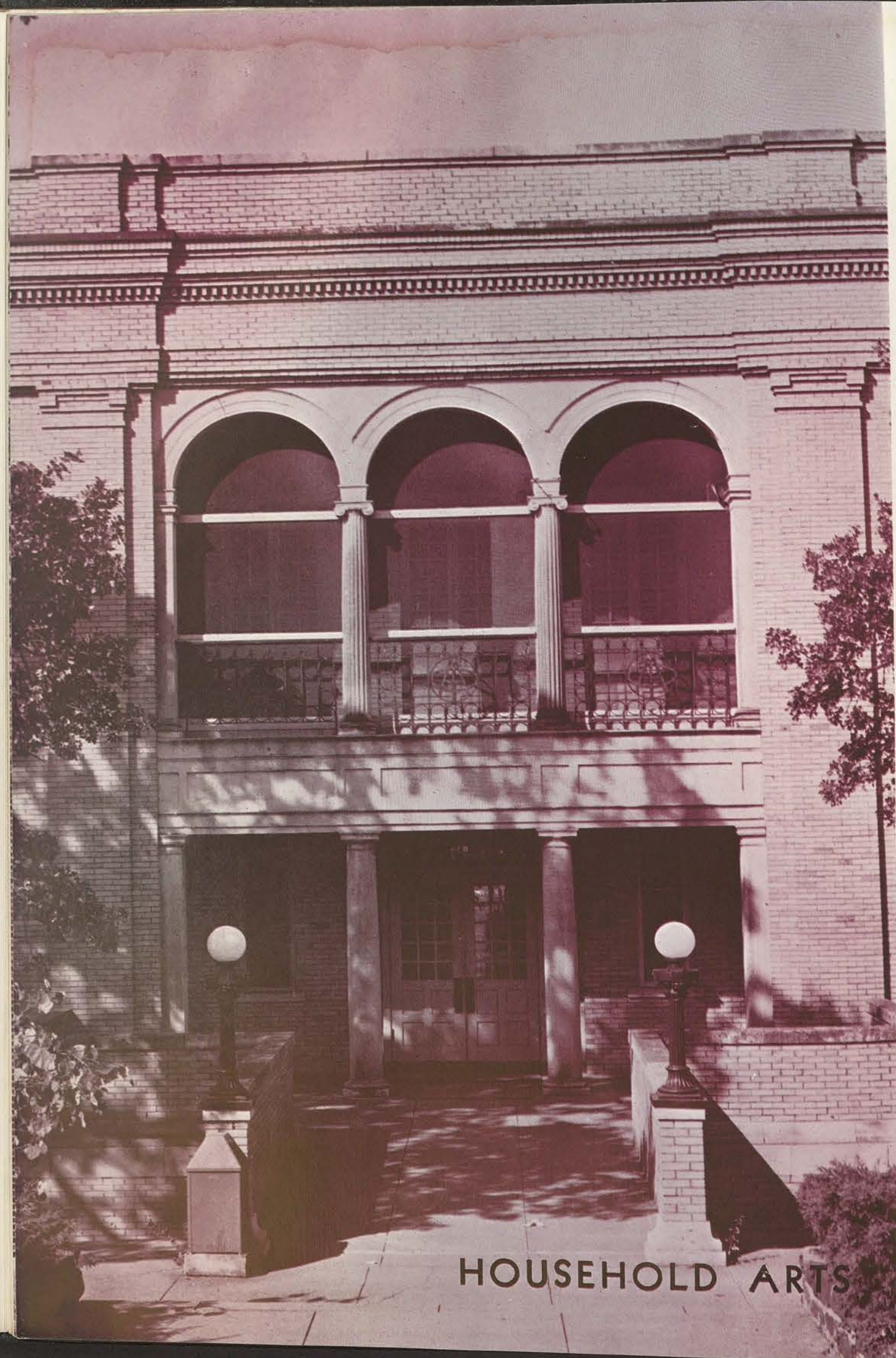
Chemistry

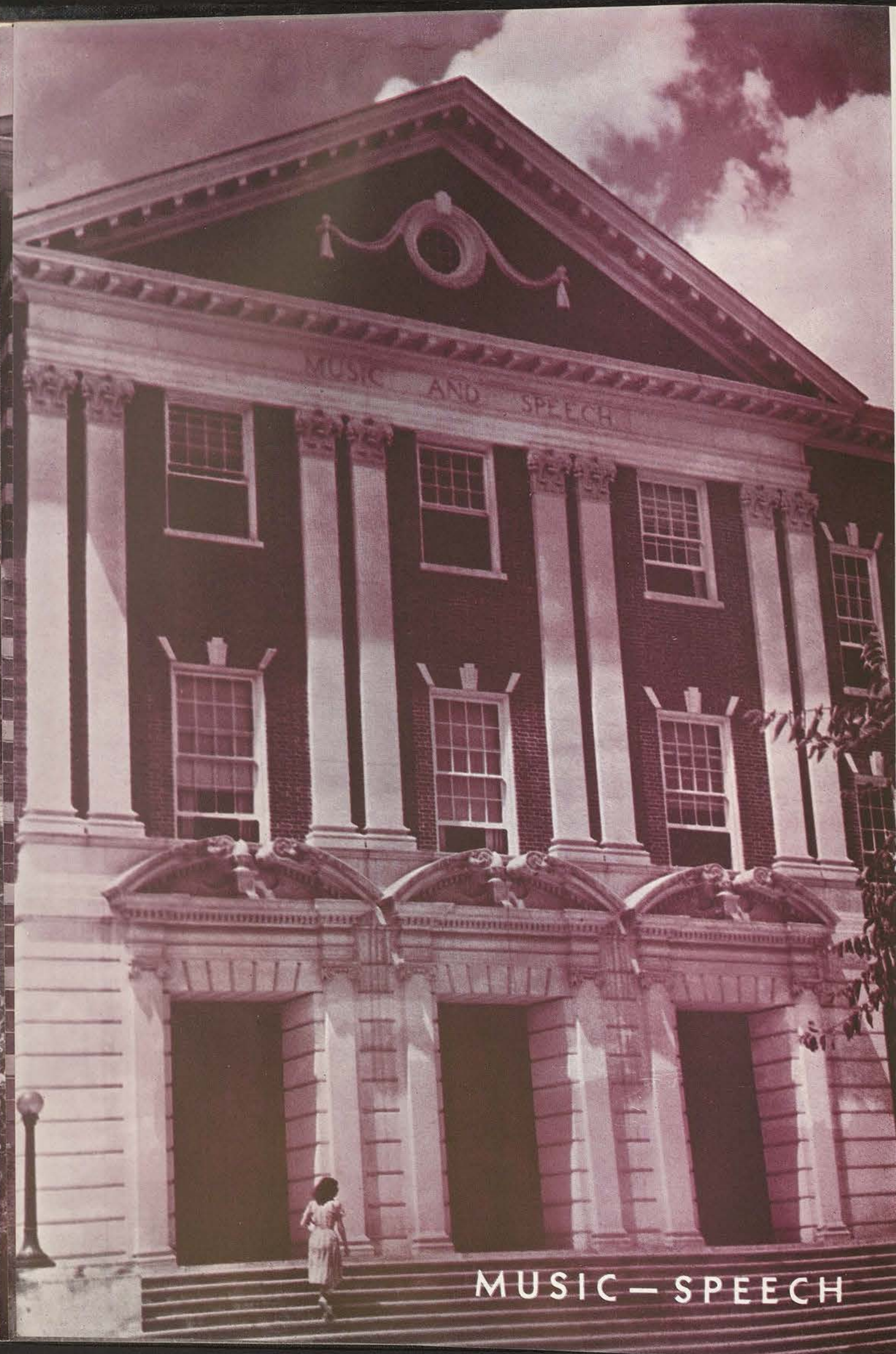
Journalism

Music

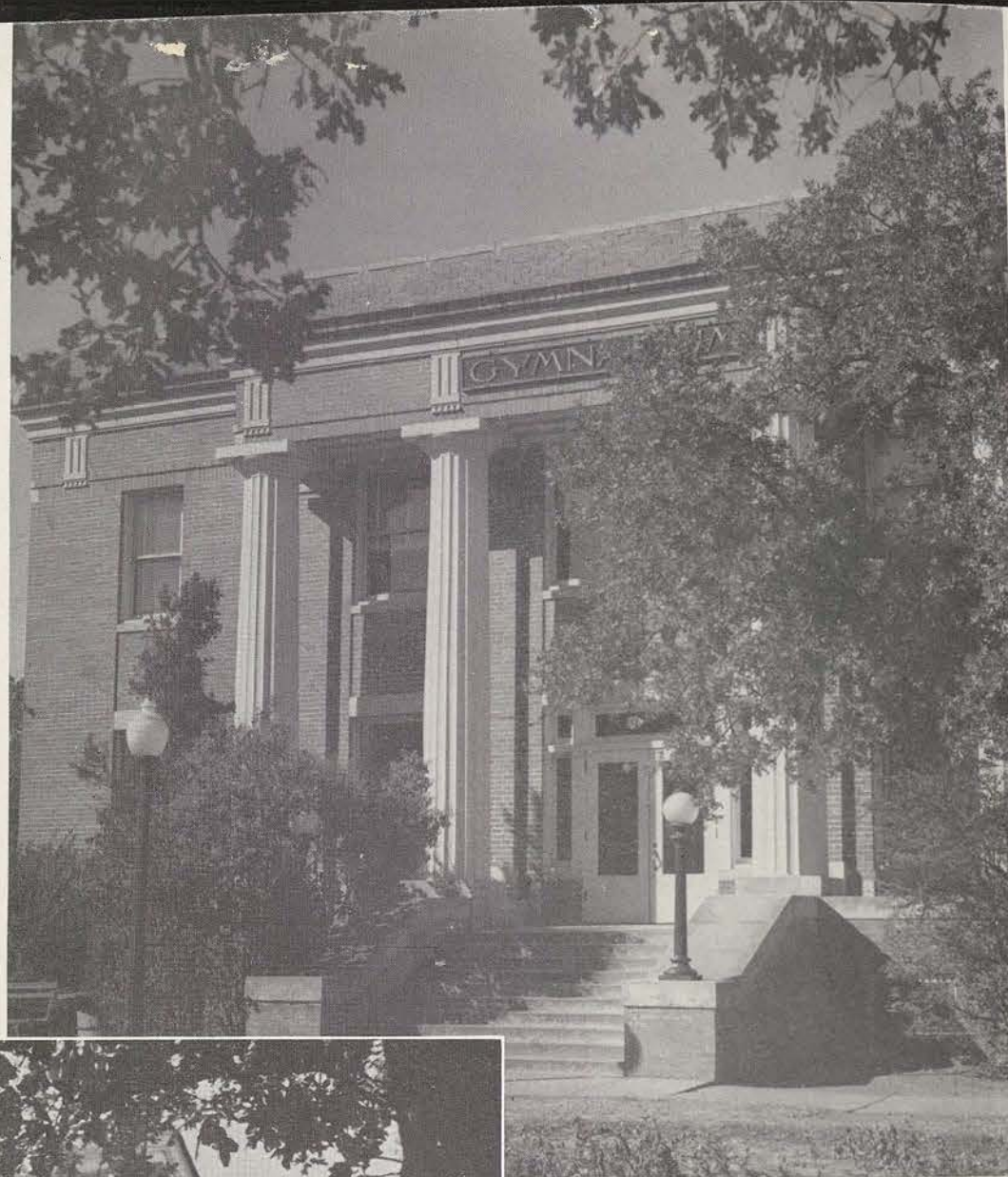

Health Service

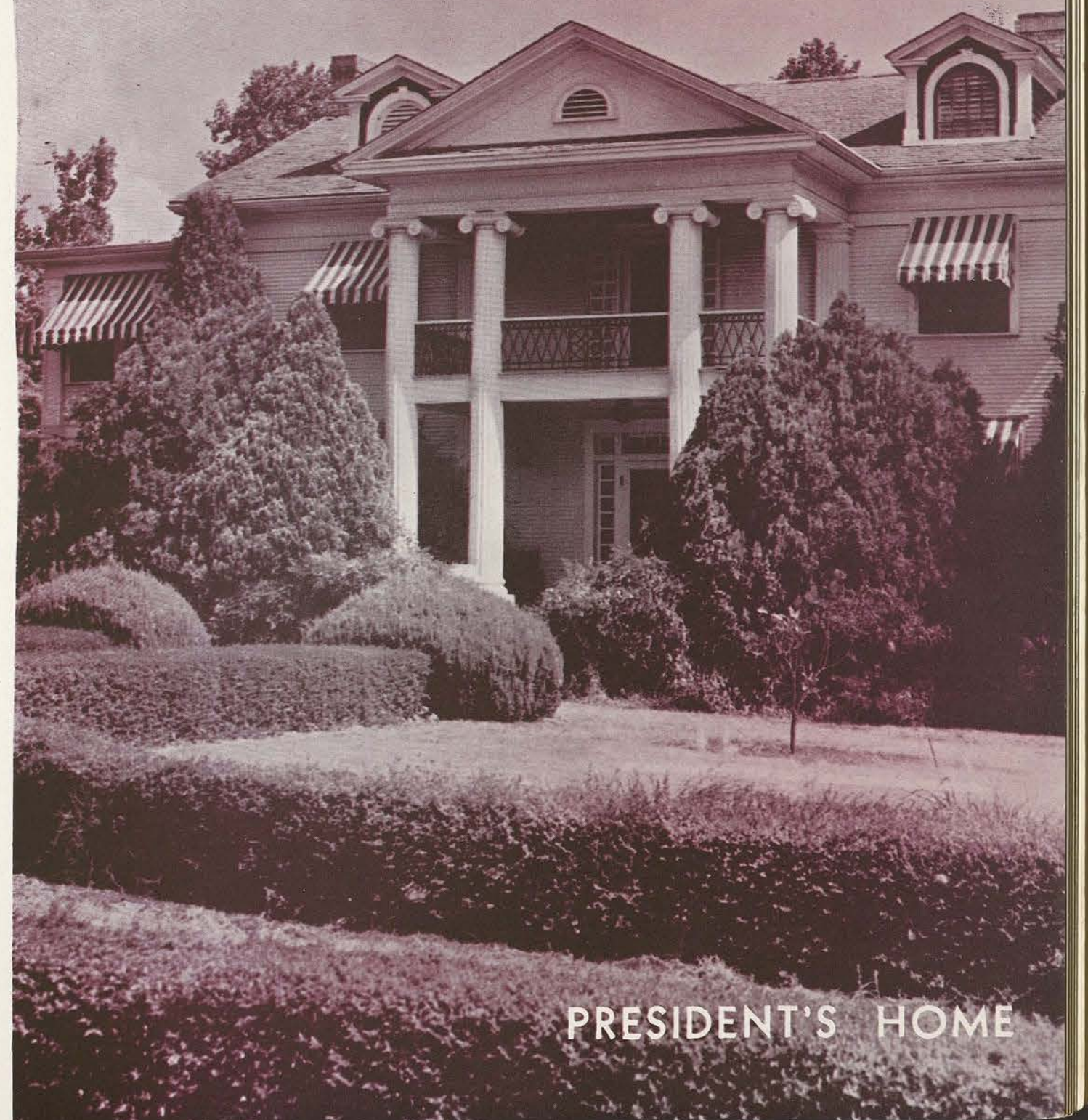

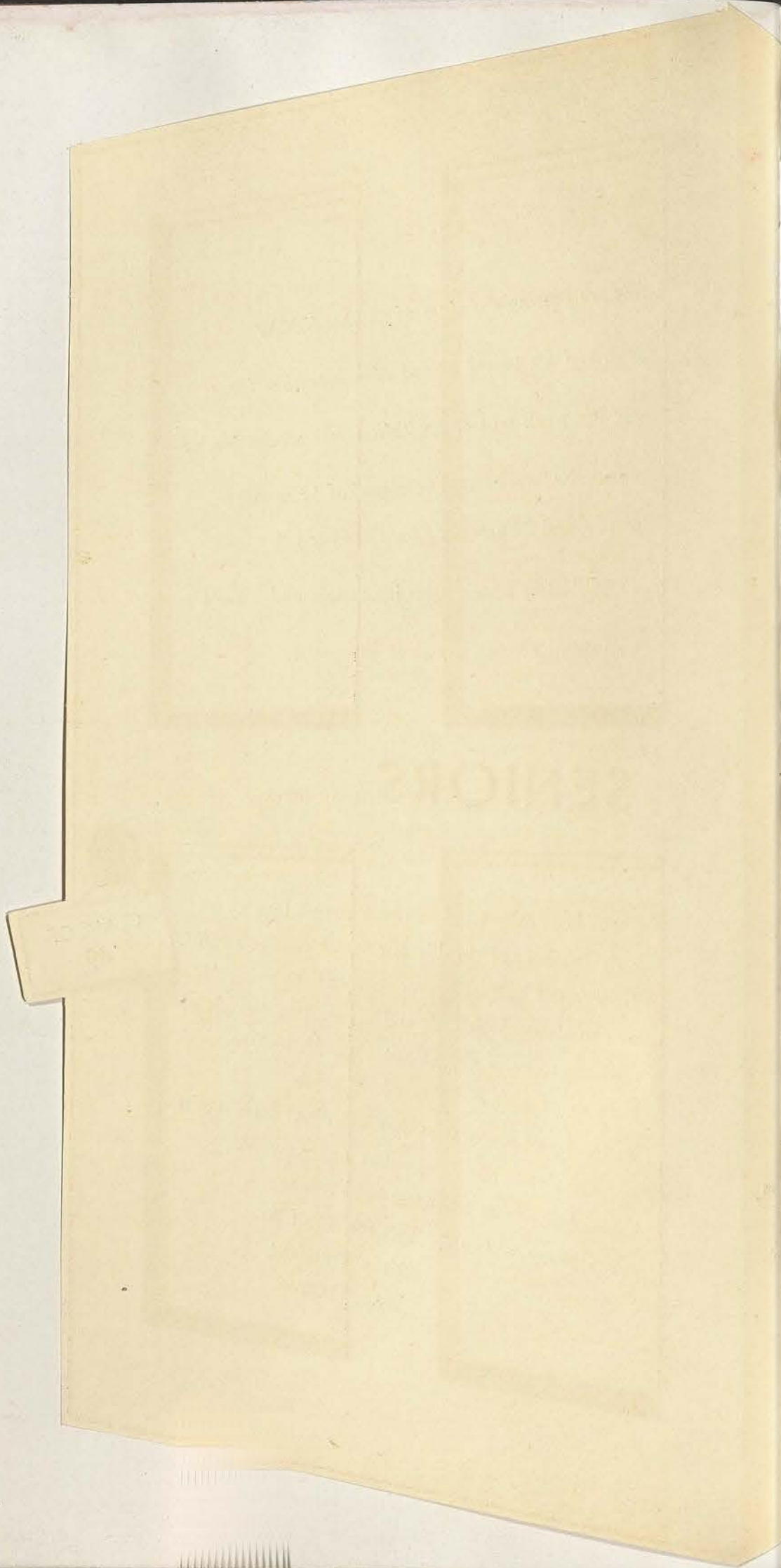
SENIORS were here!

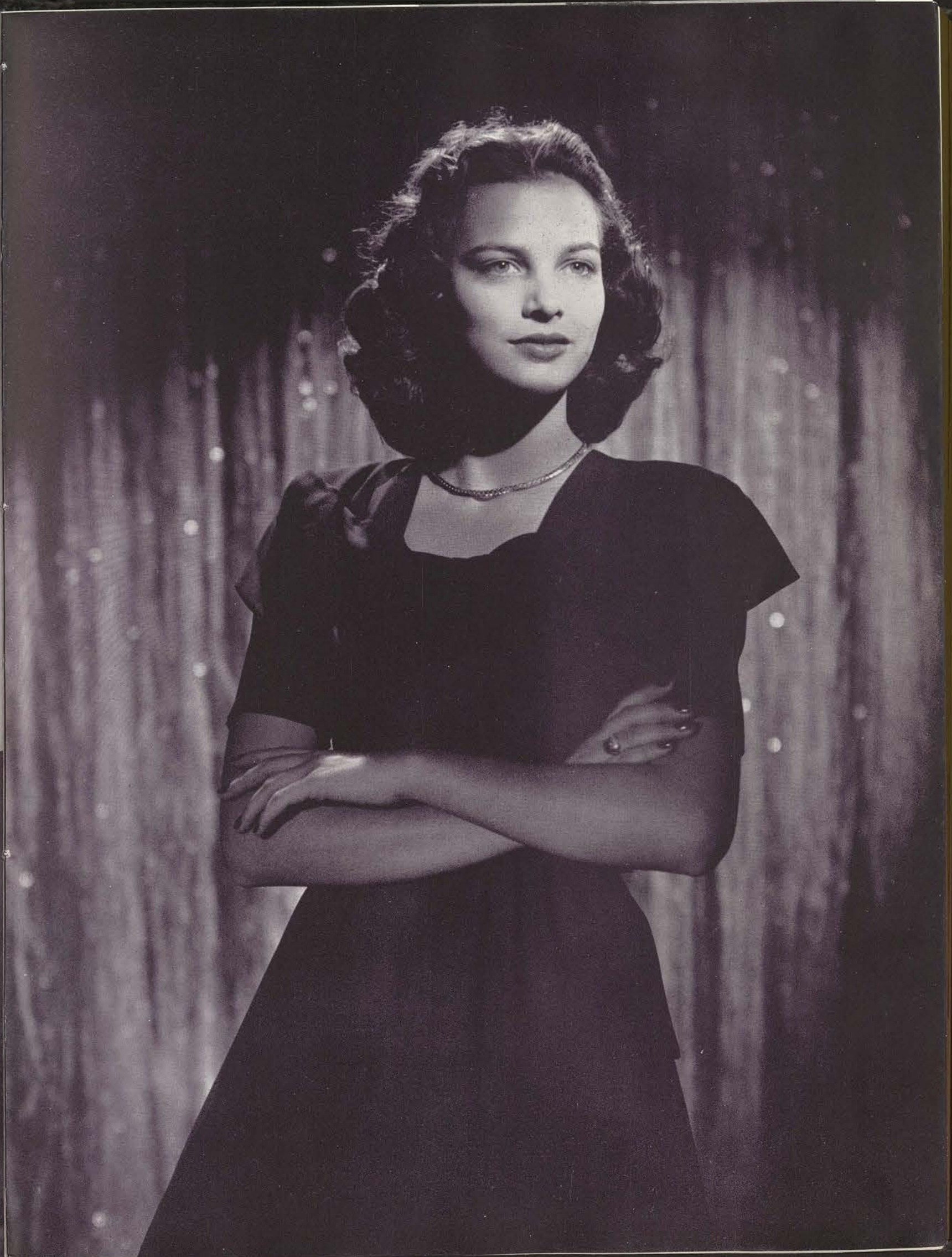

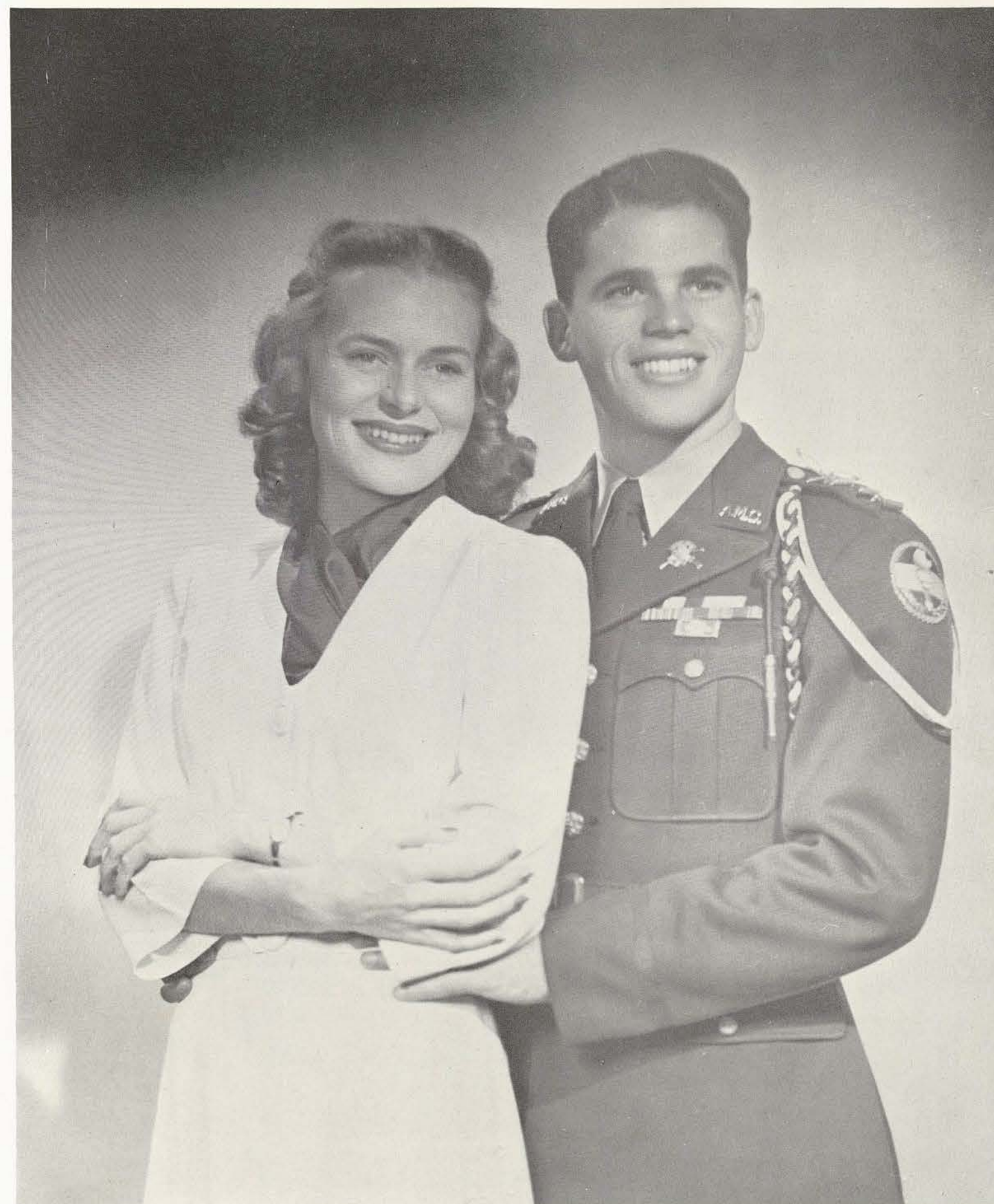

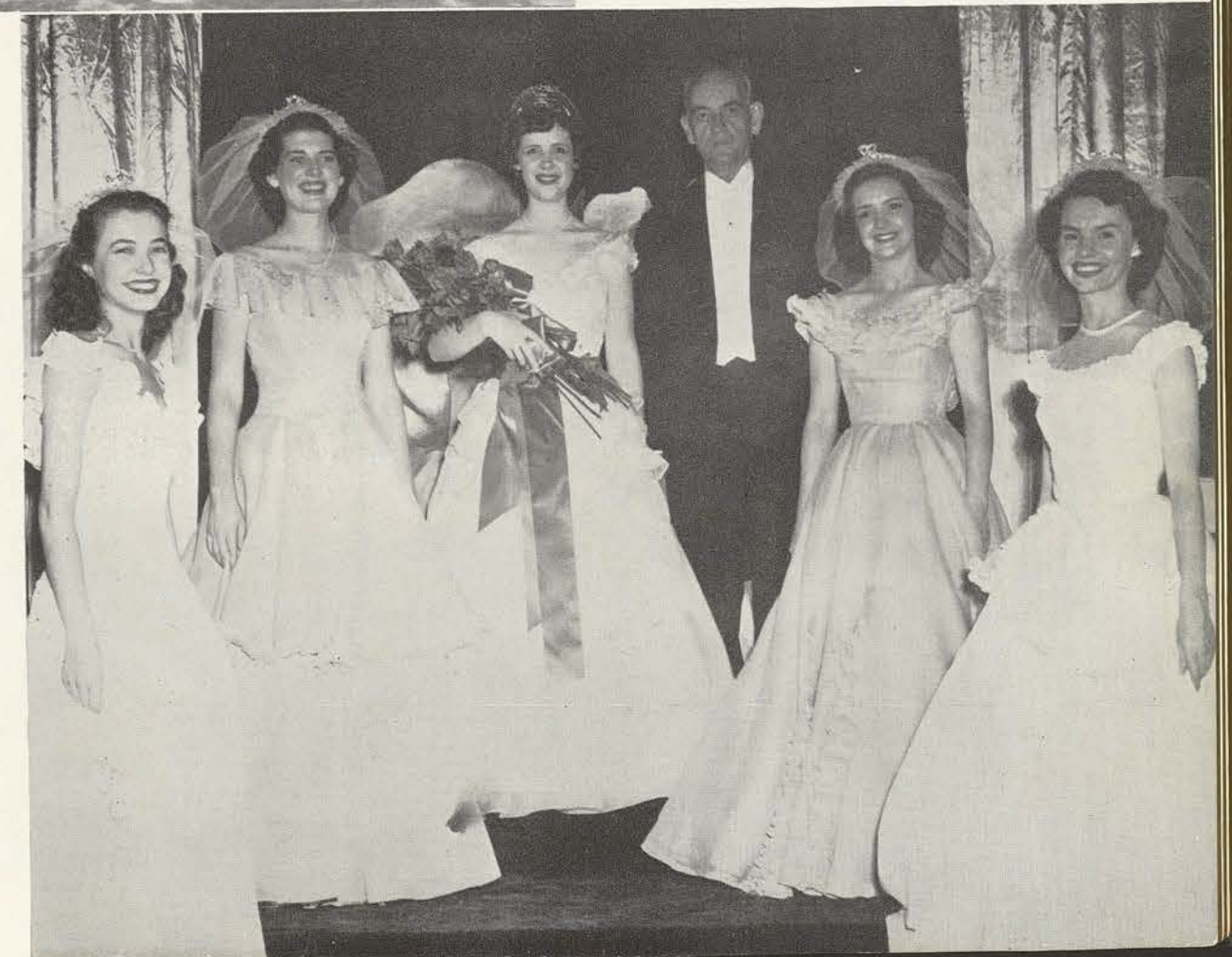

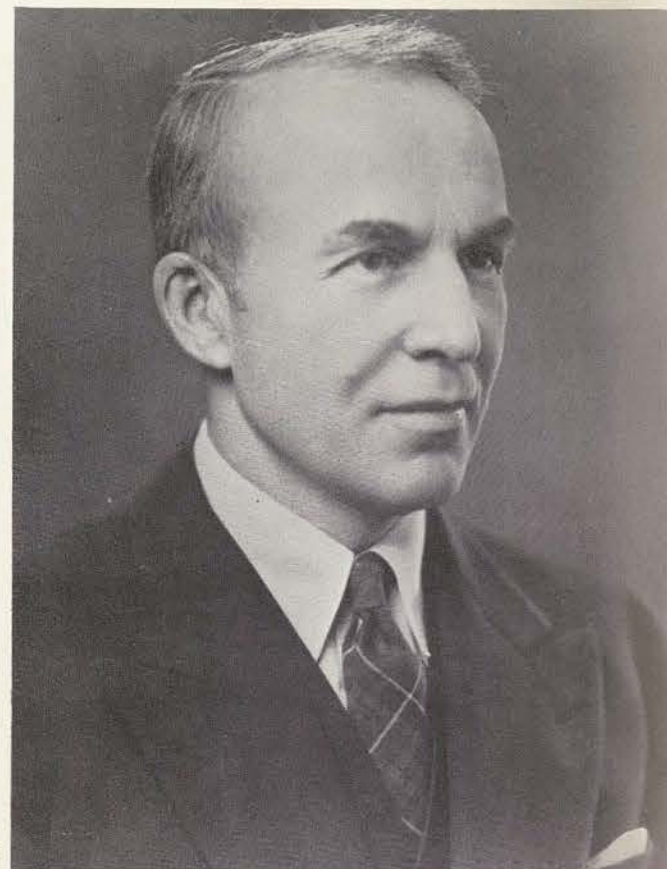


John Mason Brown

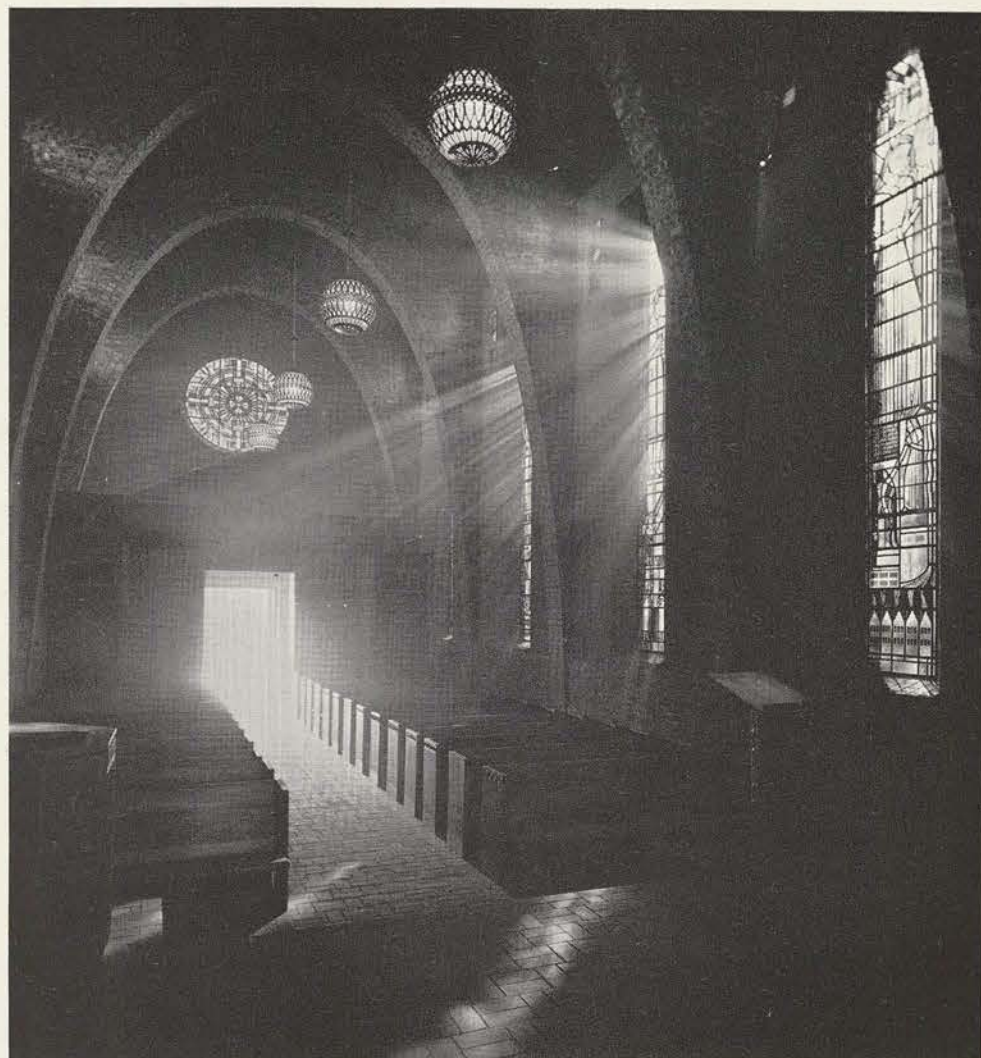

Her eyes are windows showing her skill in speech, teaching, music, social service, the dance, and nursing. Her love of nature is pictured in her chancel window—the bluebonnet, tulip, poppy, daisy, and rose.

Her love for her children is symbolized by the motherhood window gracing the front of her form.

So great is her fame that people from all over the 48 states have visited her home. Mrs. Franklin Delano Roosevelt dedicated her form. Present with adoring eyes were 4,000 students, ex-students, faculty members and persons who had learned of her fame and helped make her presence possible.

She bowed her head in prayer when the death angel beckoned away our beloved first lady of the campus, Mrs. Bertha Alitzer Hubbard. In tribute, the motherhood window was dedicated to Mrs. Hubbard.

Further love was bestowed on her memory by the erection of a baptismal font in May of 1948.

Since her birth in 1939, many children have come to her for worship, solace, and love. Consequently, she has watched 606 couples exchange their vows of holy matrimony.

Inspiring in her quietness, strength and simplicity, she is destined to lead her children and her children's children and their children through the tangle of life.

She embodies the thoughts and aspirations of all T.S.C.W. students.

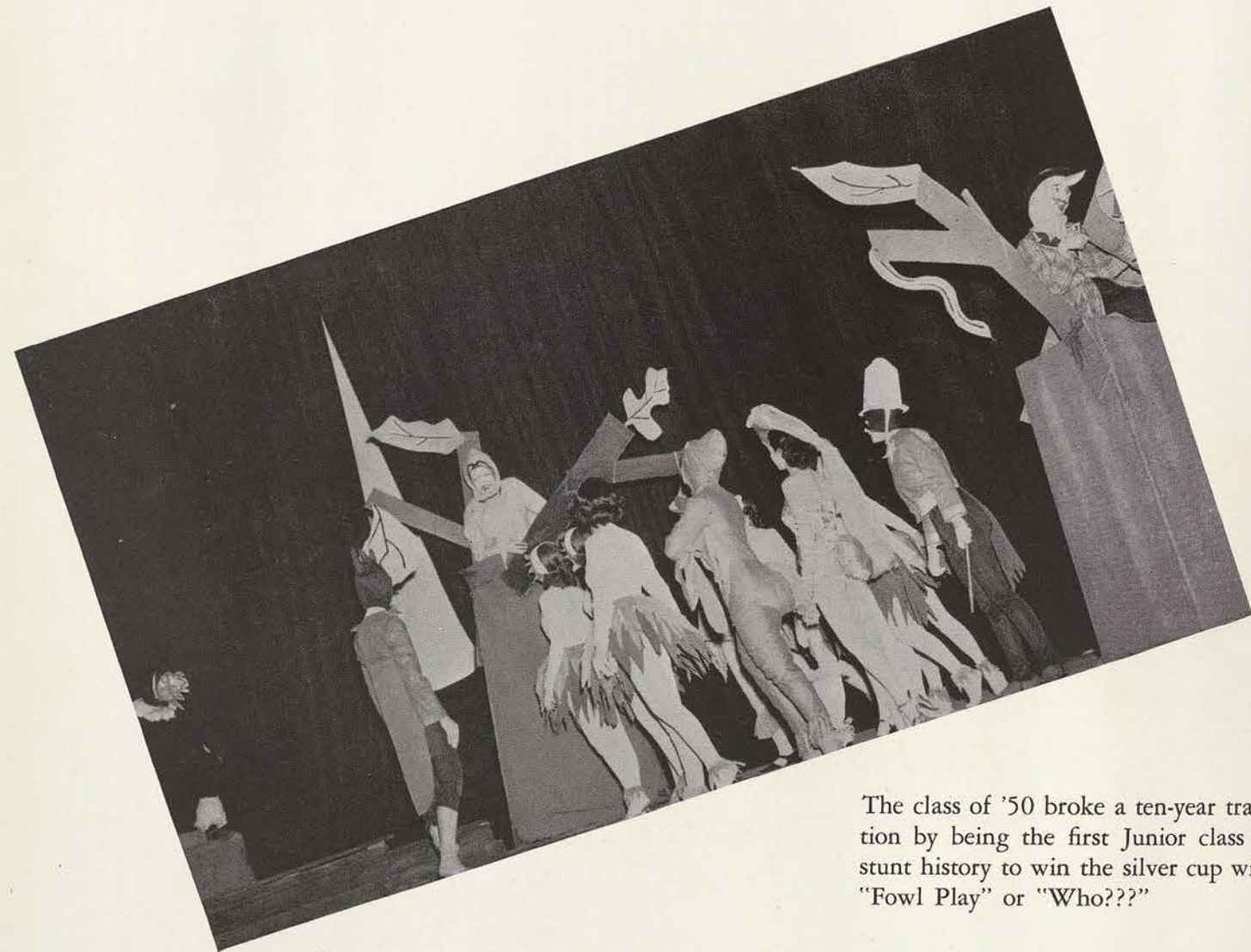
Portrait of MRS. MATTIE LLOYD WOOTEN, former dean of students, as seen in Stoddard's blue room. The painting was done by an ex-student.

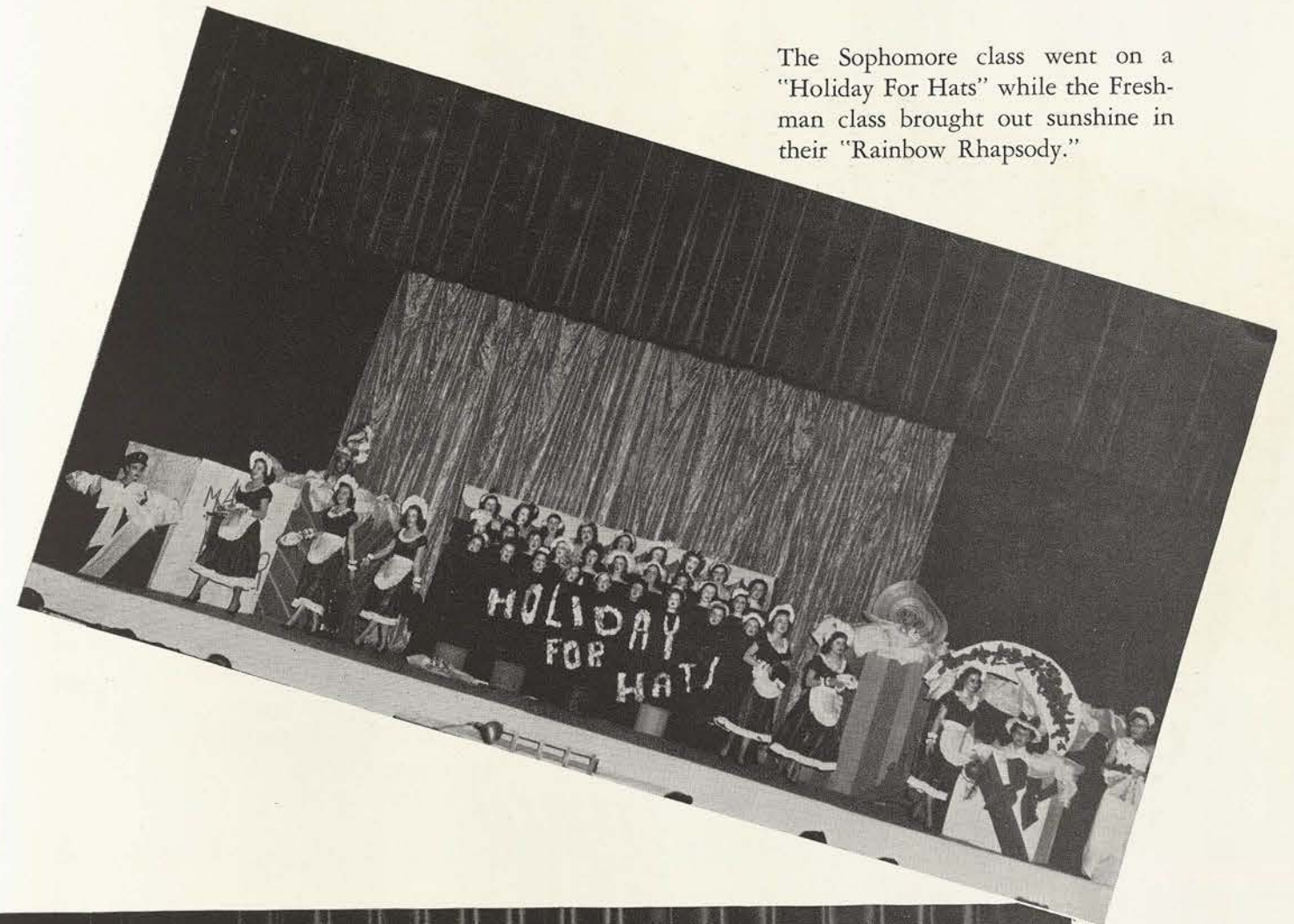

I am still wondering how anyone could design those cupids that floated above us at the VALENTINE DANCE. I have tried and tried, but still mine don't have that certain something.



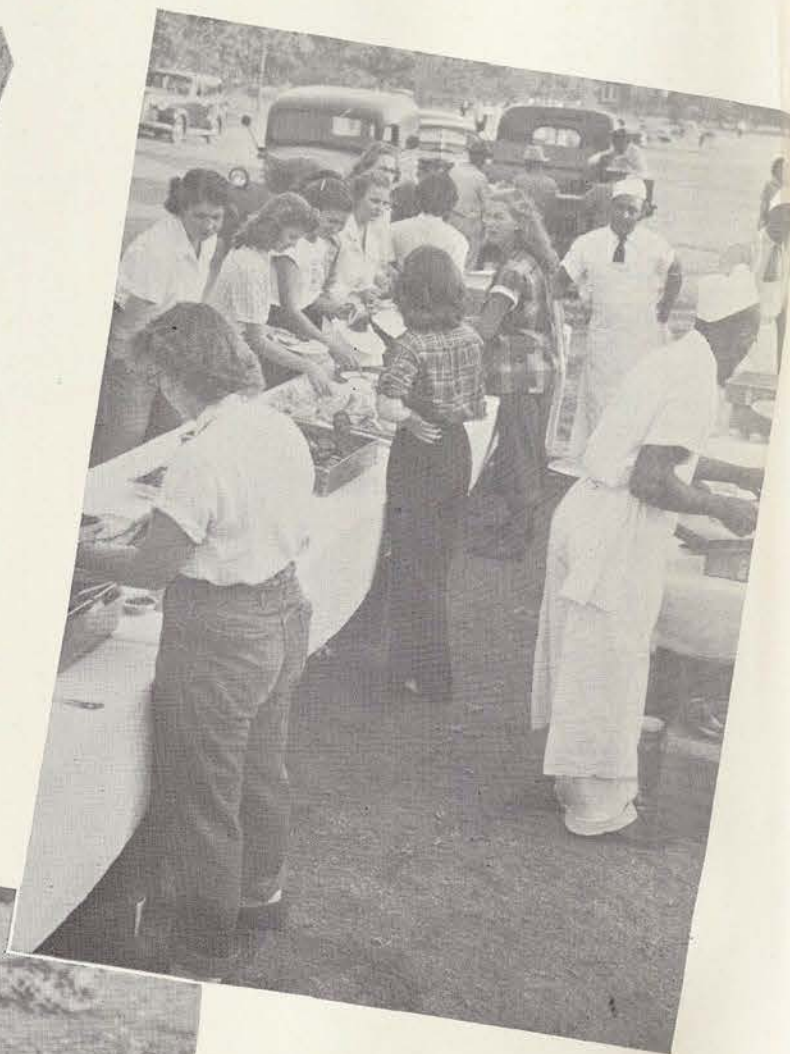

The short, plaid flyaway coat, popular throughout the bitter cold of winter, is practical for spring and even early summer.

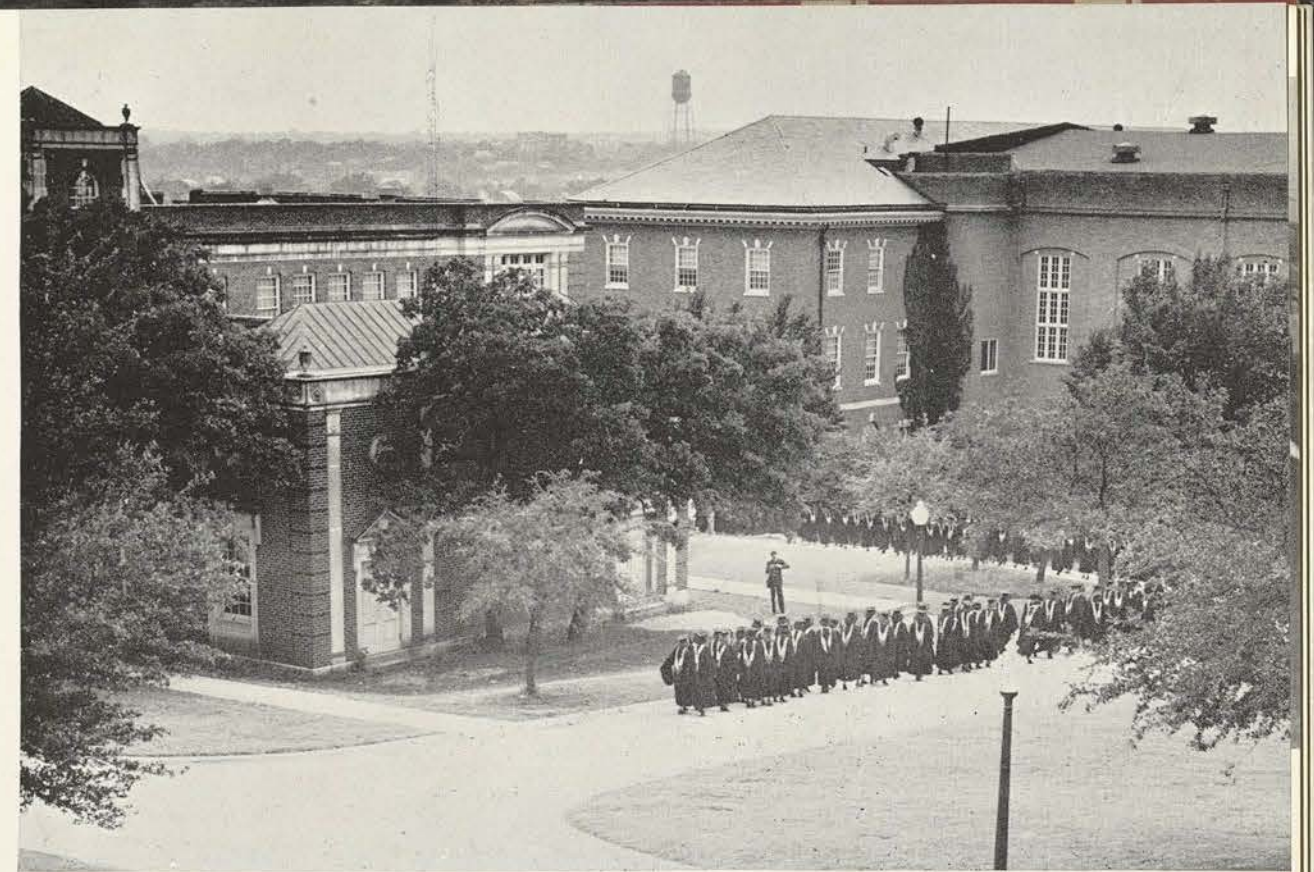

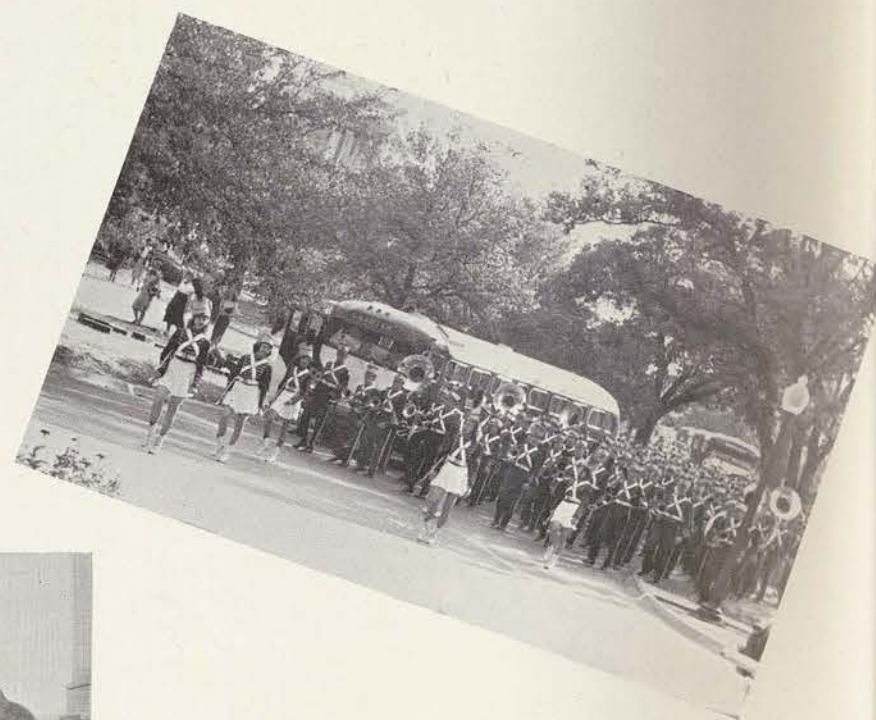

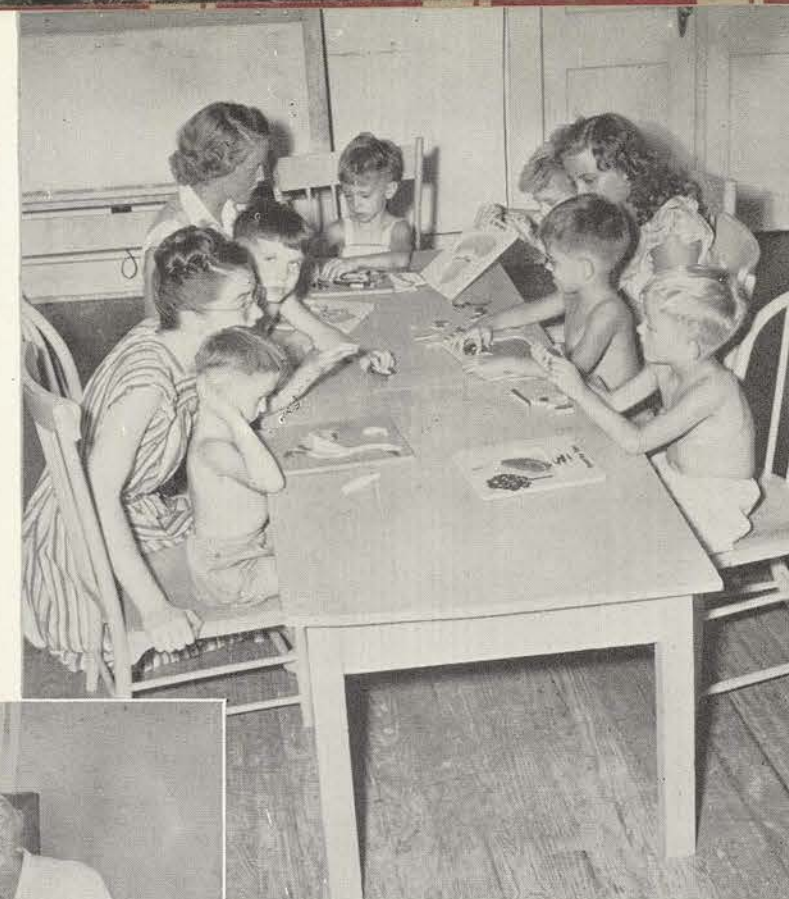

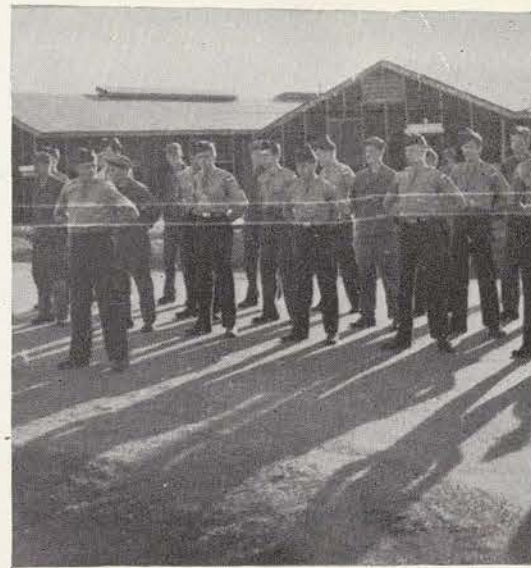

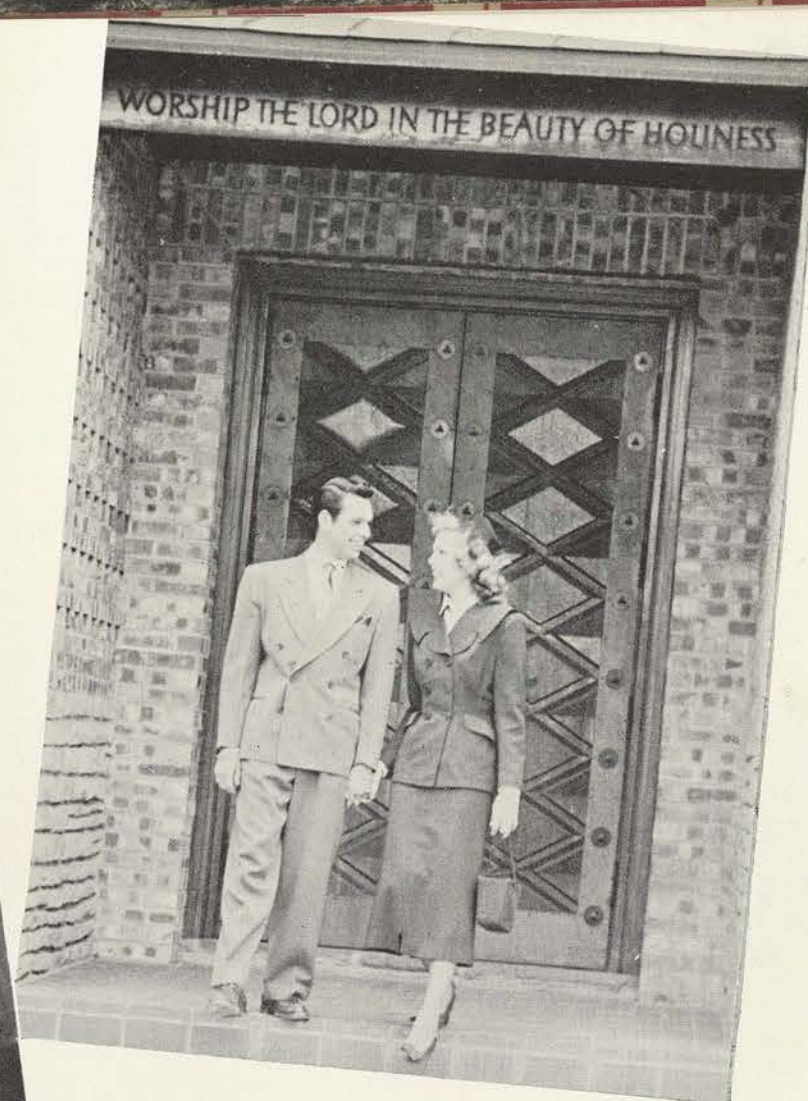

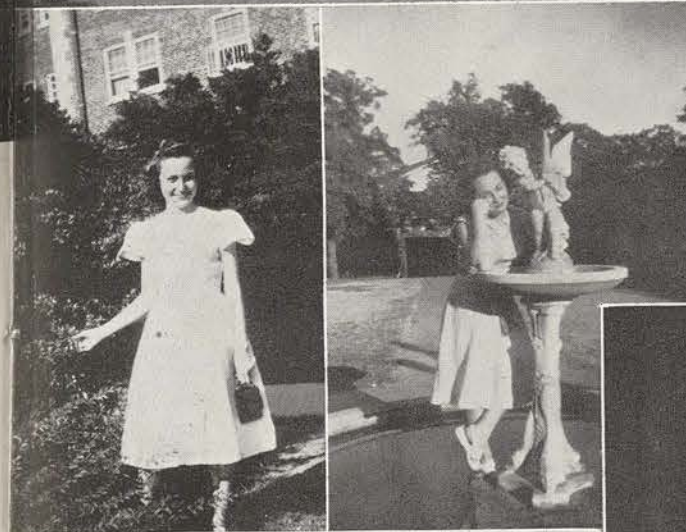
