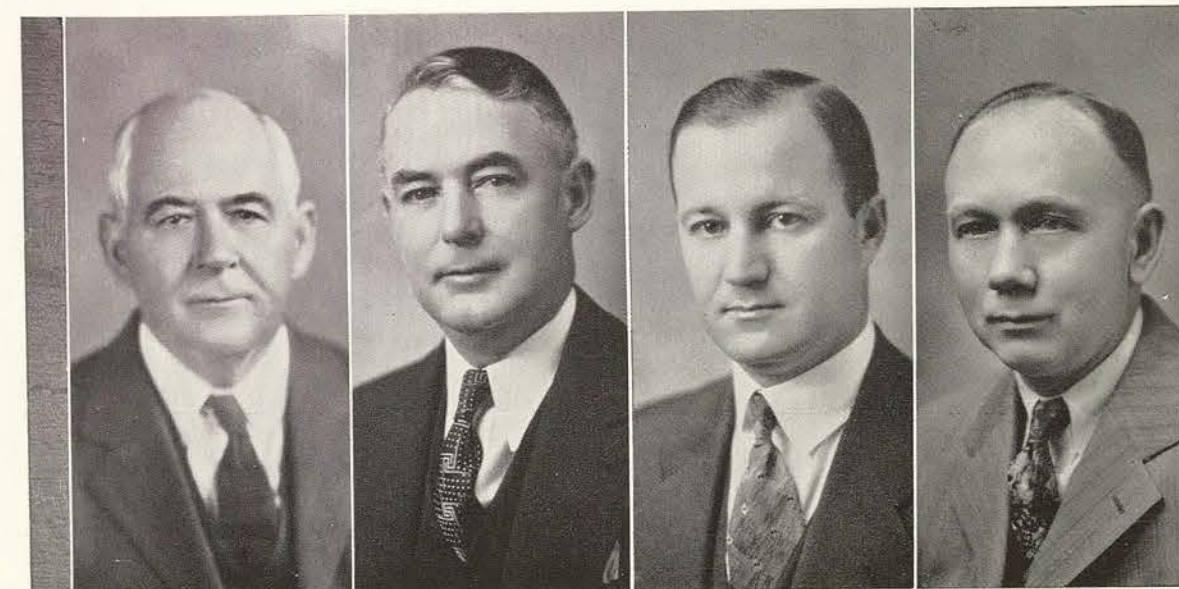
The Business Manager of the College has a most responsible position. The supervision of all strictly business operations of the college is in his hands.

Over half a million dollars each year is handled by the cashier, George Welsh. The college bank is maintained for the convenience of students and faculty members.





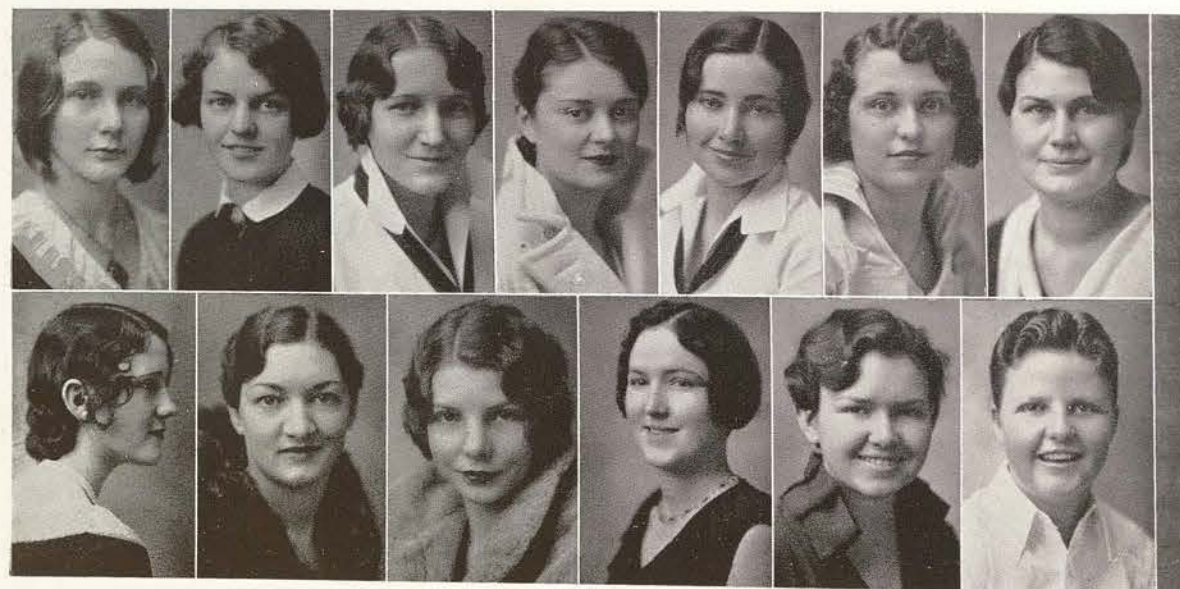

The Speech Department of the Texas State College for Women presented its senior majors in recitals during the spring semester.

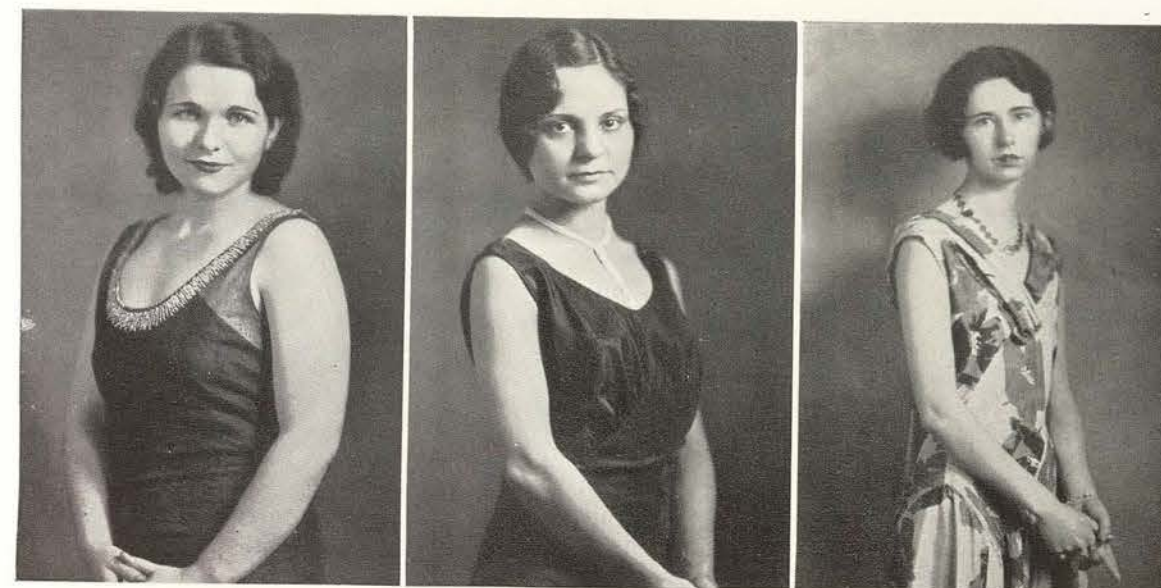
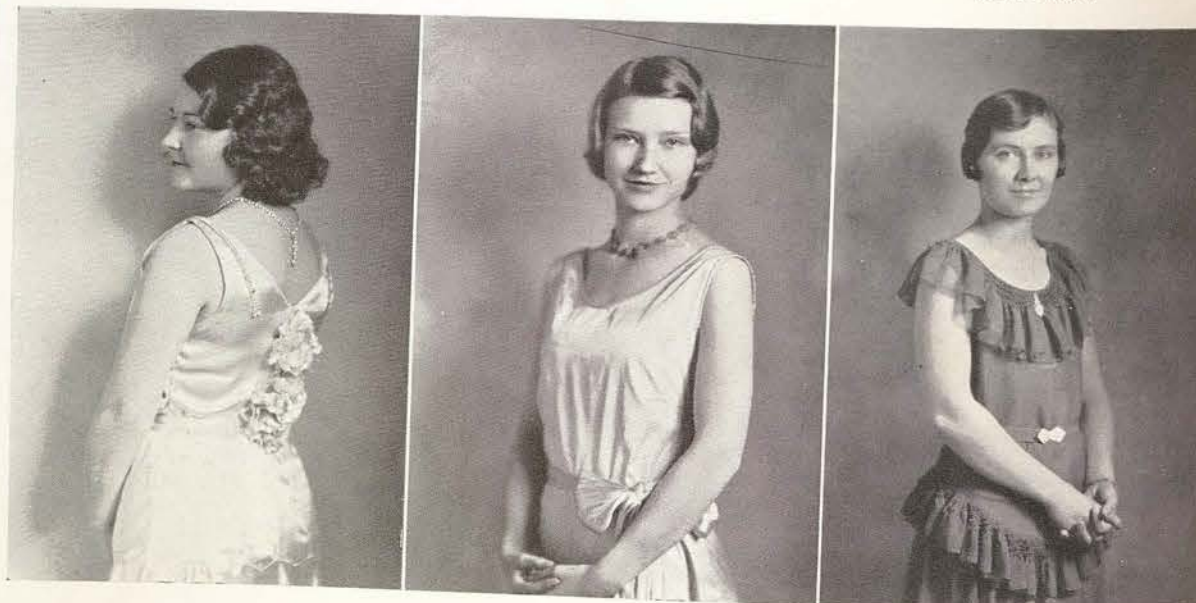

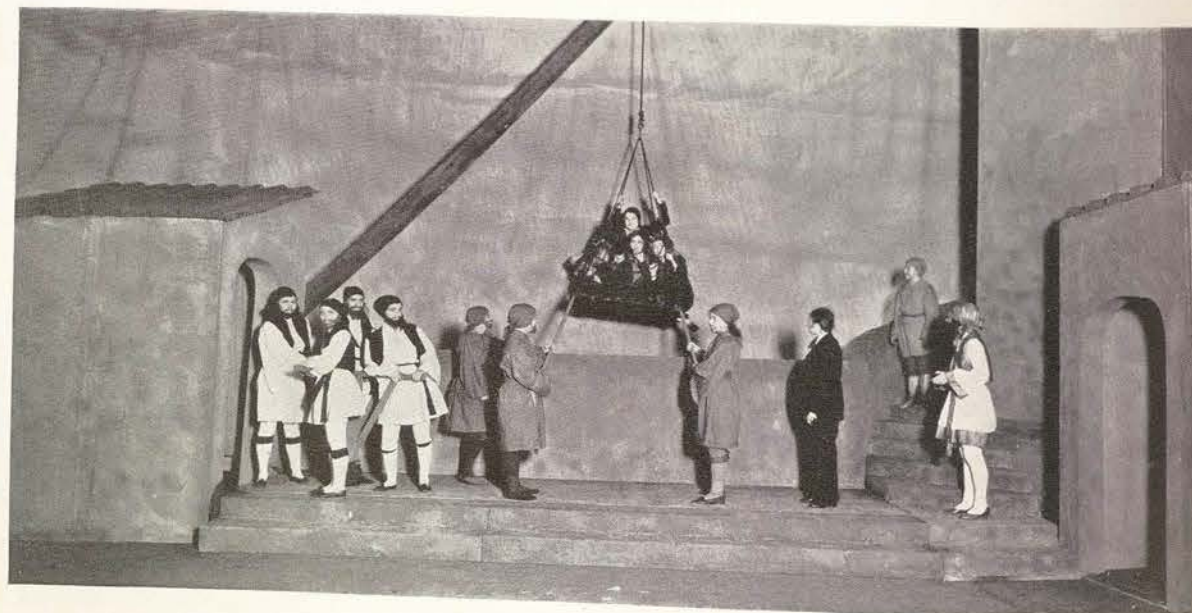
"Candida," by Bernard Shaw, a much deeper and more serious play was the second production of The Little Theater.
