## **INGRAMS, HUBBARD FAMILY NAMED FOUNDERS' AWARD RECIPIENTS**

Community volunteers Cene and Ken Ingram, a former Texas Woman's University Regent, and the Family of L.H. Hubbard, president of the university from 1926-1950, will be honored for their exceptional service to the Denton community and to Texas Woman's University as the 2015 TWU Founders' Awards recipients.

The awards will be presented at the annual TWU Founders' Awards Scholarship Luncheon at noon Thursday, April 9, in Hubbard Hall.

Proceeds from the luncheon benefit the TWU Chancellor's Endowed Scholarships, the most prestigious scholarships awarded by the university. Established in 2000, these scholarships are one of the largest awarded by TWU and are among only a few academic scholarships that offer a stipend to recipients in addition to paying tuition and fees. They are awarded to TWU students on the basis of outstanding academic achievement, leadership and service in school and community activities.

**TWU ARTS TRIANGLE WALKING TOUR SCHEDULED APRIL 2**

Area residents are invited to explore the spaces where the arts happen during a tour of Texas Woman's University's Denton campus.

TWU's School of the Arts will host the eighth annual TWU Arts Triangle Walking Tour from 5 to 7 p.m. Thursday, April 2.

The tour, which is free and open to the public, will begin at Hubbard Hall, located in the center of the campus. TWU dance, drama, art and music students will perform at various locations as the tour winds through the campus before ending with a reception and free refreshments at the Music Building.

The tour will begin with a lecture by guest artist Catherine Cabeen, a former member of the internationally renowned Martha Graham Dance Company and Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane Dance Company. Ms. Cabeen currently is the artistic director of Hyphen. Drawing from her professional experience as well as historical and contemporary examples from visual and performance art, her lecture will explore the idea that the way in which art is made can be as reflective of the artist's values as the final product.

The lecture will be followed by an interdisciplinary performance of a percussion composition by Dr. Elizabeth Kelly, TWU assistant professor of music. In this performance, musicians play a large-scale sculpture made of metal and wood while students from the dance department embody the qualities of the different materials.

The tour then moves to the second-floor lobby of ACT (the Administration Conference Tower) for the "This I Believe" Gallery. The TWU Book-in-Common for this academic year is *This I Believe II*, edited by Jay Allison and Dan Gediman. Work by students from visual arts will be displayed in the gallery. Additionally, students from the drama department will perform monologues and students from dance will perform solos based on personal philosophies from the book.

Continuing down Redbud Lane, the tour will pass large-scale sculptures by students of Tanya Synar and a Butoh dance performance choreographed by Dr. Rosemary Candelario. A pop-up sculpture garden in front of Old Main, created by students of Colby Parsons, will allow the audience to wander around and between inflatable art. Drama students then will perform sections of their current production, *Henry V*, directed by Steve Young.

The tour then continues through the Ann Stuart Science Complex atrium and finishes in the lobby of the Music Building with a performance by the TWU Chamber Singers, directed by Dr. Joni Jensen. Complimentary refreshments will be provided.

All TWU campuses **will close at noon** Friday, April 3.

TWU will offer **two additional online degree programs** beginning in Fall 2015. The **BS in sociology** program will offer all upper division undergraduate courses online as well as in a face-to-face format. The addition of the online delivery method is expected to grow the program by 25 percent. The **master of health care administration** (MHA) will be available as a mix of on-campus, hybrid and online classes at the Houston campus, with the on-campus class sessions offered via synchronous video to remote locations in lieu of face-to-face instruction. The program will be offered in the first year to Collin College and expects to enroll 10-15 students during that year.

ASSET awards a scholarship every year for the fall semester to a permanent full- or part-time TWU staff member enrolled in undergraduate or graduate courses.
