TWU RECEIVES \$1.1 MILLION FOR SCHOLARSHIPS, FELLOWSHIPS

Texas Woman's University recently received two estate gifts totaling \$1.1 million that will establish an endowment for nursing scholarships and also create two graduate teaching fellowships – one in health studies and the other in dance.

Ruby Dean left \$785,000 to TWU to establish the Ruby Dean Endowment, which will provide scholarships for students pursuing a nursing degree.

Mrs. Dean was born in Carthage, Texas, in 1922. She and her husband David were married in 1953 and were lifelong residents of Fort Worth. Mrs. Dean and her husband supported many scholarships at various colleges and schools. While they had no children of their own, they were instrumental in the lives of many young people, helping them receive a college education with their generosity.

TWU alumna Dr. Janice C. Williams left \$340,000 to the university to establish two graduate teaching fellowships. The Williams Health Studies Fellowship will support graduate students in the TWU Health Studies Department. The Langston Dance Fellowship will assist graduate students in the TWU Dance Department.

Dr. Williams, who received her Ph.D. in health studies from TWU in 1973, taught in public schools in Texas and Louisiana. She also developed programs on teaching health at Texas State University, Virginia Tech University and Texas A&M-Kingsville. Dr. Williams passed away in 2011.

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TWU TO OFFER LEADERSHIP CERTIFICATE FOR STUDENTS

Texas Woman's University will offer a Leadership Certificate to TWU upper-division undergraduate students starting in fall 2013.

"By offering this leadership certificate to students, TWU is meeting the market's demands for graduates who already are established leaders," said Retired Maj. Gen. Mary Saunders, executive director of the TWU Leadership Institute. "The program also will give our students a competitive edge when it comes to starting their career after graduation."

The TWU Leadership Certificate is an academic distinction and will be included on participating students' transcripts. To receive a Leadership Certificate, students will be required to take 12 to 13 hours of approved courses. These courses include two mandatory leadership classes – one offered by the TWU School of Management and the other from the TWU Department of History and Government. Students also must complete a capstone project or participate in an approved internship that demonstrates their leadership skills.

Most classes that qualify for the certificate program also will apply to students' core classes and/or major requirements. Therefore, most students should not have to add hours to their degree plan to receive this certificate.

To qualify, students must maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 in each of the mandatory leadership classes. In addition, students must be classified as a sophomore with at least 45 hours of coursework completed.
