



Problems of Diversity





UTA Libraries hosts Wikipedia editing event to honor Women's History Month

Research indicates that less than 20 percent of Wikipedia editors are women. UTA Libraries wants to change that.

The HERstory Edit-a-thon event will be held 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Wednesday in Central Library Room 315A. It's a come and go event where participants will learn the basics of Wikipedia editing and can apply those skills to updating Wikipedia pages about women, special collections archivist Samantha Dodd said. Refreshments are provided throughout, and no previous knowledge of Wikipedia editing is necessary.

The event aims to increase the number of female editors and articles about women on Wikipedia. There is a discrepancy in the amount of female editors versus male editors, Dodd said.
