What Is Child Maltreatment?

- Definition: Any type of abuse or neglect which harms a child; often perpetrated by a parent, caregiver or other person who has authority in a child's life
- Common types: neglect, physical, sexual
- Prevalence:
 - 1 in 7 children experienced child abuse or neglect
 - In 2020, 1,750 children died of abuse and neglect

Reasons Child Maltreatment Occurs

Parent or caregiver factors

Family factors

Environmental factors

(Centers of Disease Control and Prevention, 2022)

Outcomes of Child Maltreatment

- Health and physical effects
- Developmental delays (cognition)
- Emotional, psychological and behavioral consequences

Policies Used to Prevent and Intervene Child Maltreatment

Child Abuse Prevention Treatment Act (CAPTA)

Strengthening Abuse and Neglect Courts Act of 2000

Challenges Experienced by Professionals Who Work with Families

Clear policy and guidance in dealing with child abuse

Willingness of professionals to intervene

Assessing if child abuse is actually occurring

Recommendations for Policy and Practice

 Better definitions on how to define and deal with child maltreatment

 Better policies in place to assist outlets such as schools and places where child maltreatment is first suspected
