ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP HONORS TWU'S PHYLLIS BRIDGES

Friends and former students of Dr. Phyllis Bridges, TWU Cornaro Professor of English, have established a scholarship in honor of the longtime TWU educator.

In a letter announcing the fund-raising effort, committee co-chairs Dr. Carolyn Rozier, dean of the TWU School of Physical Therapy emerita, and Dr. Glenda Brock Simmons, vice president for student life emerita, lauded Dr. Bridges' 50-year teaching career, including 42 years at TWU.

"Her inspired teaching ... has touched and changed many lives," the letter states. "It is time for all of us who know her to show our appreciation for all she has done in her career."

By establishing the Dr. Phyllis Bridges Scholarship Endowment, the committee seeks to create a lasting tribute to her and provide continuing scholarships to benefit students at TWU.

GDSC NAMES BARBEREE TWU COACH OF THE YEAR

TWU volleyball head coach Shelly Barberee recently was named the 2013-14 TWU Coach of the Year at the 13th annual Greater Denton Sports Commission (GDSC) Awards Banquet. She received the honor for the fourth time in her career (2003-04, 2006-07 and 208-09).

Barberee, in her 11th year as the head coach at TWU, guided the Pioneers to their fourth 20-win season and a trip to the NCAA Tournament this year. TWU finished the regular season tied for second in the Lone Star Conference standings and advanced to its 11th straight and 16th LSC Championship Tournament.

After posting a 22-10 record, TWU received an at-large bid to the 2013 NCAA South Central Regional Tournament. The berth in the NCAA tournament is the third in school history (1996 and 1997) and first under Barberee.

She also became the all-time winningest coach in TWU volleyball history this season. The Pioneers defeated Texas A&M-Kingsville in the LSC Championship quarterfinals on Nov. 21 to hand Barberee her 192nd win at TWU and helped her surpass the record set by Sandy Troudt (191 wins) from 1986-1995.

Barberee also played an instrumental role in the numerous individual accomplishments.

Senior Marcela Alves was named Daktronica All-South Central Region second team and five players earned All-Conference recognition. Alves and senior Chloé Tate were named to the All-LSC first team while senior Josie Santos and junior Kayla Rivero were selected to the All-LSC second team and junior Morgan Wilson received All-LSC honorable mention. Rivero and Tate were also named to the LSC All-Academic Team.
