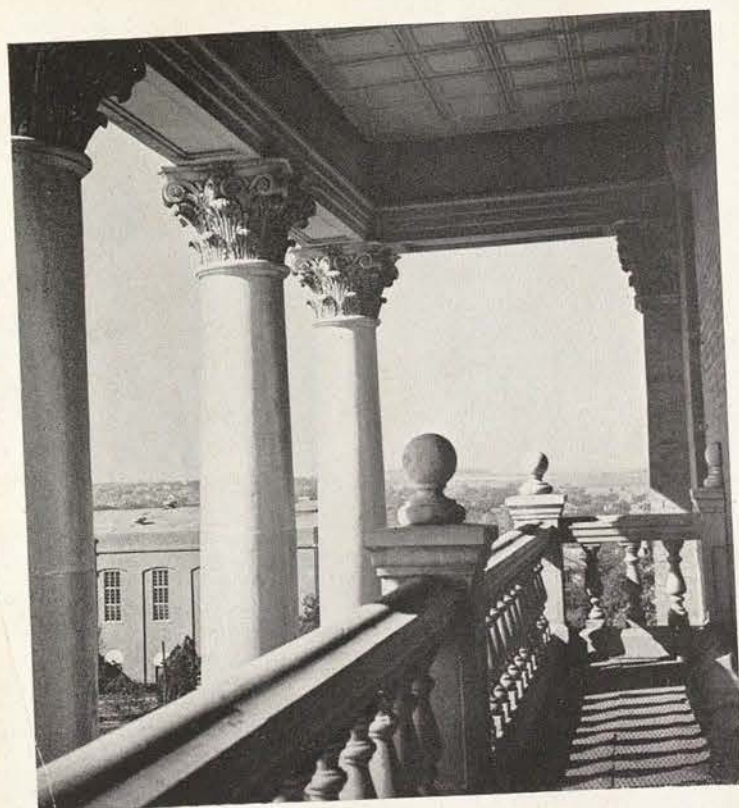

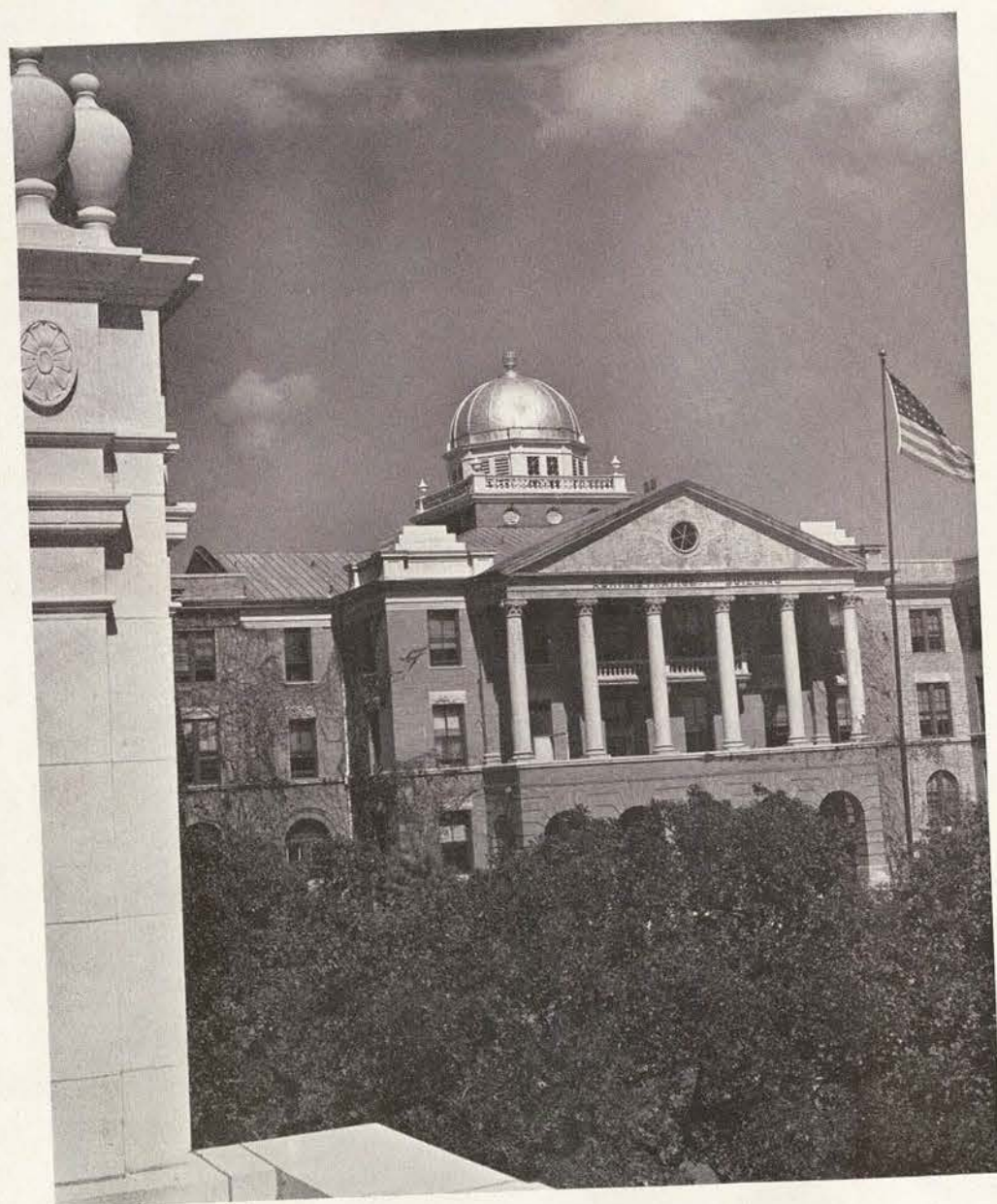

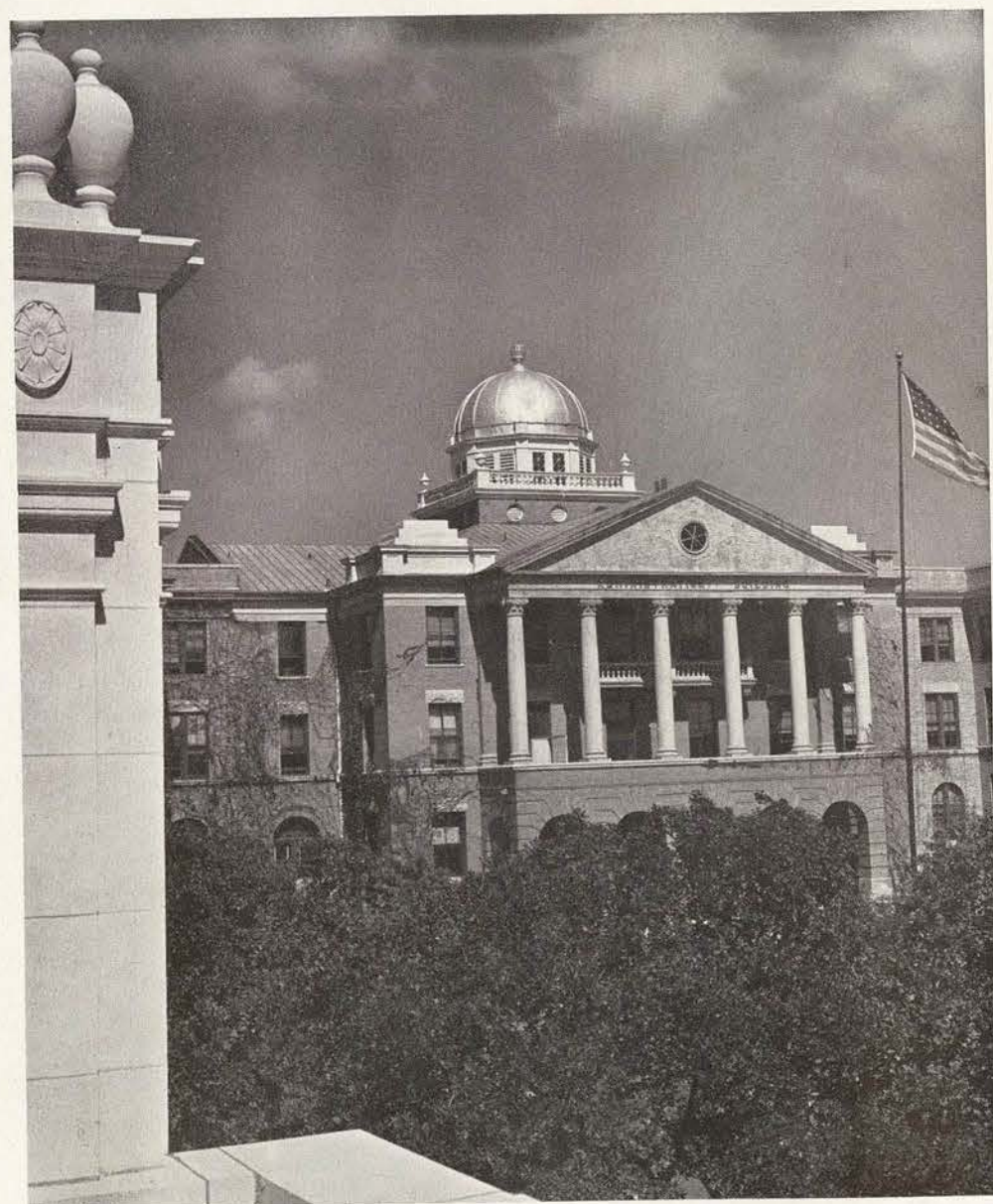

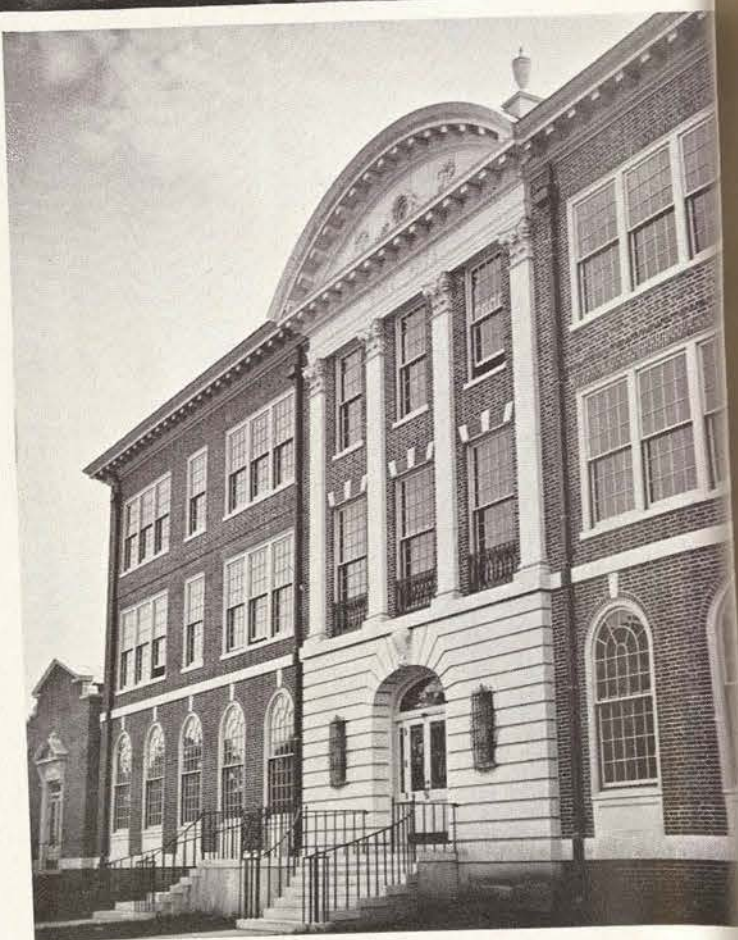

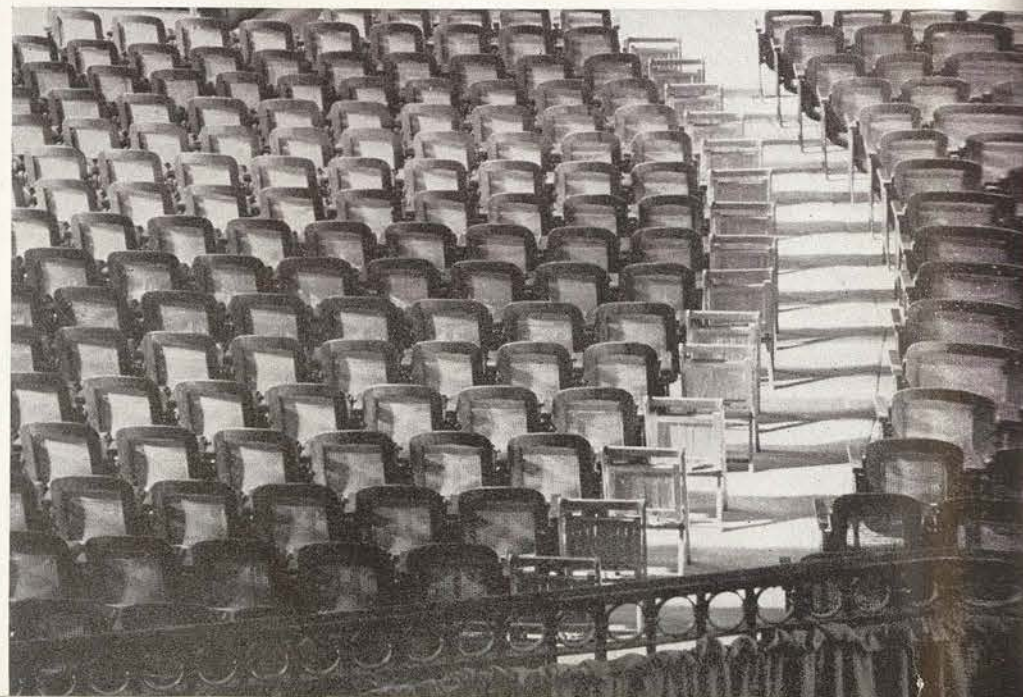

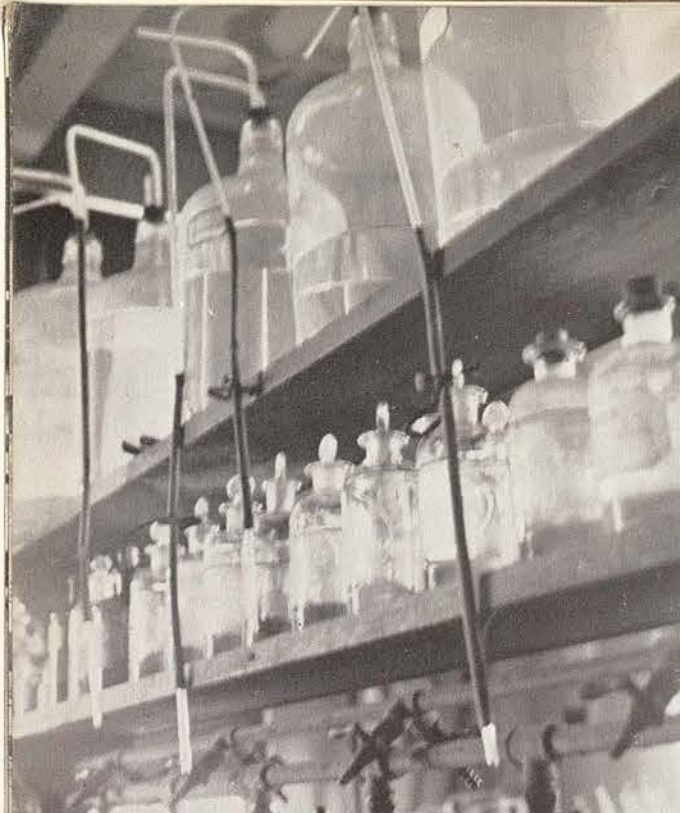


MUSIC AND DRAMA HALL

Artist and Drama courses draw thousands to this portal and section during the college year—also seat of Little Theatre and Home of College Prima Donnas.

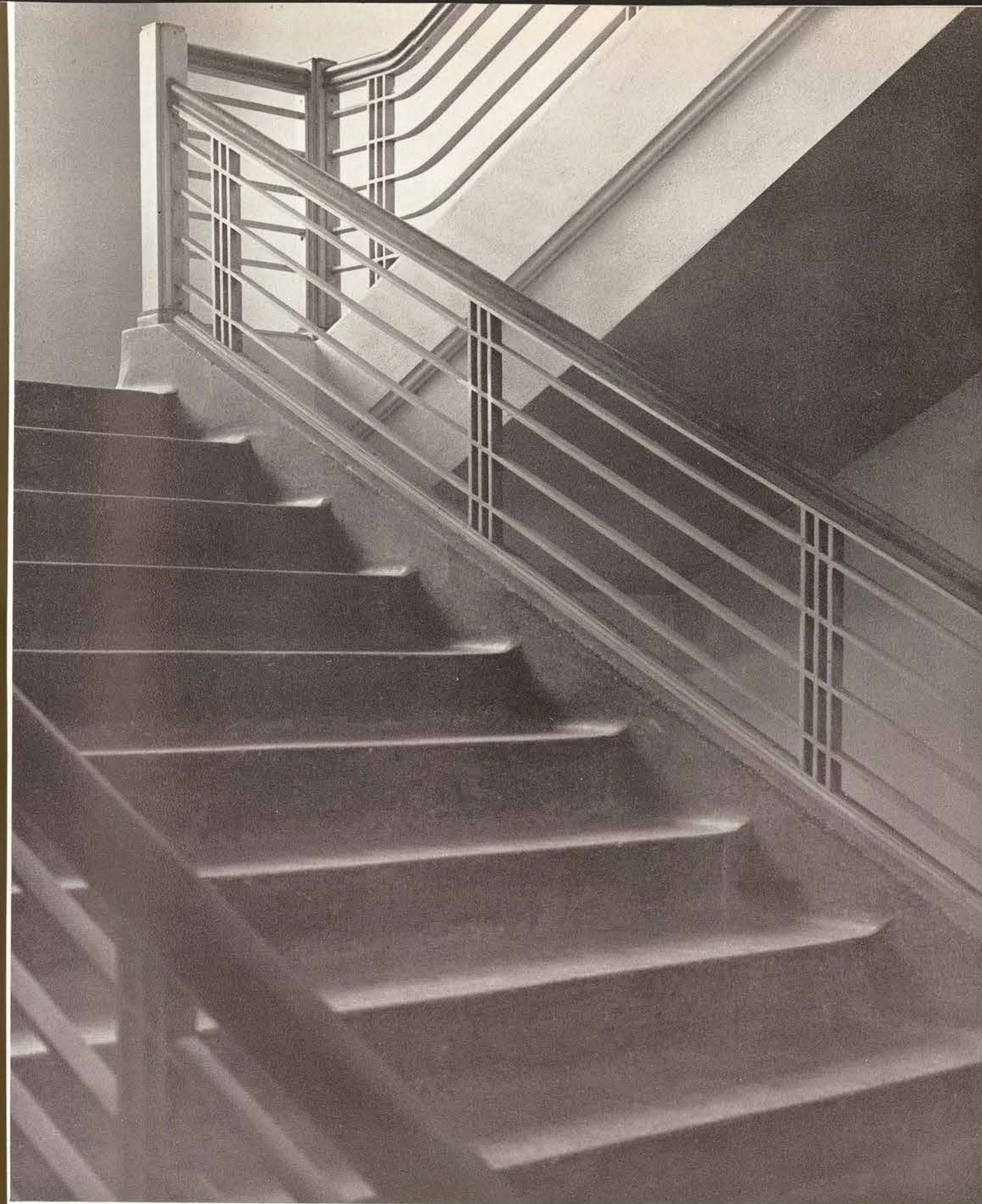
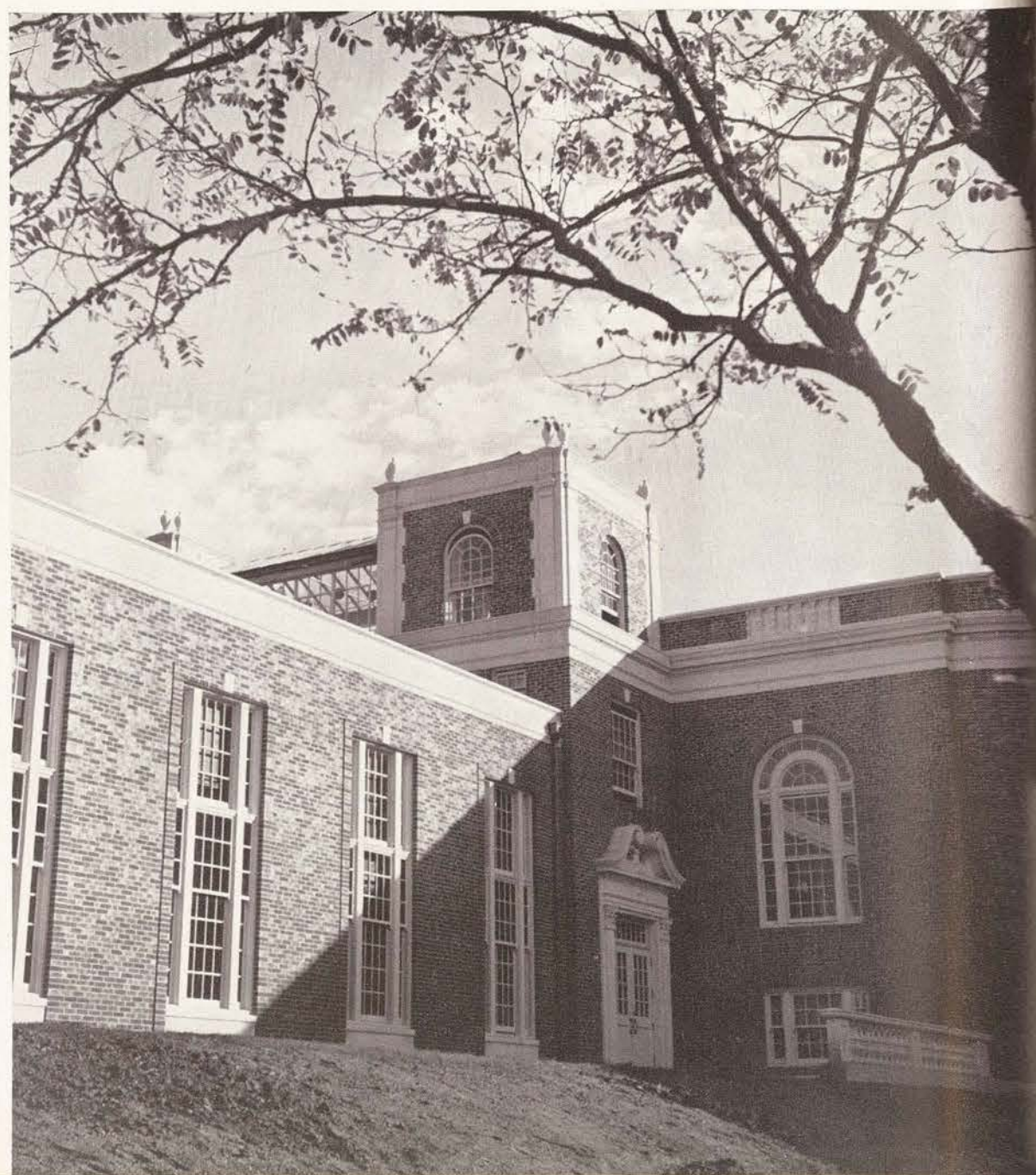

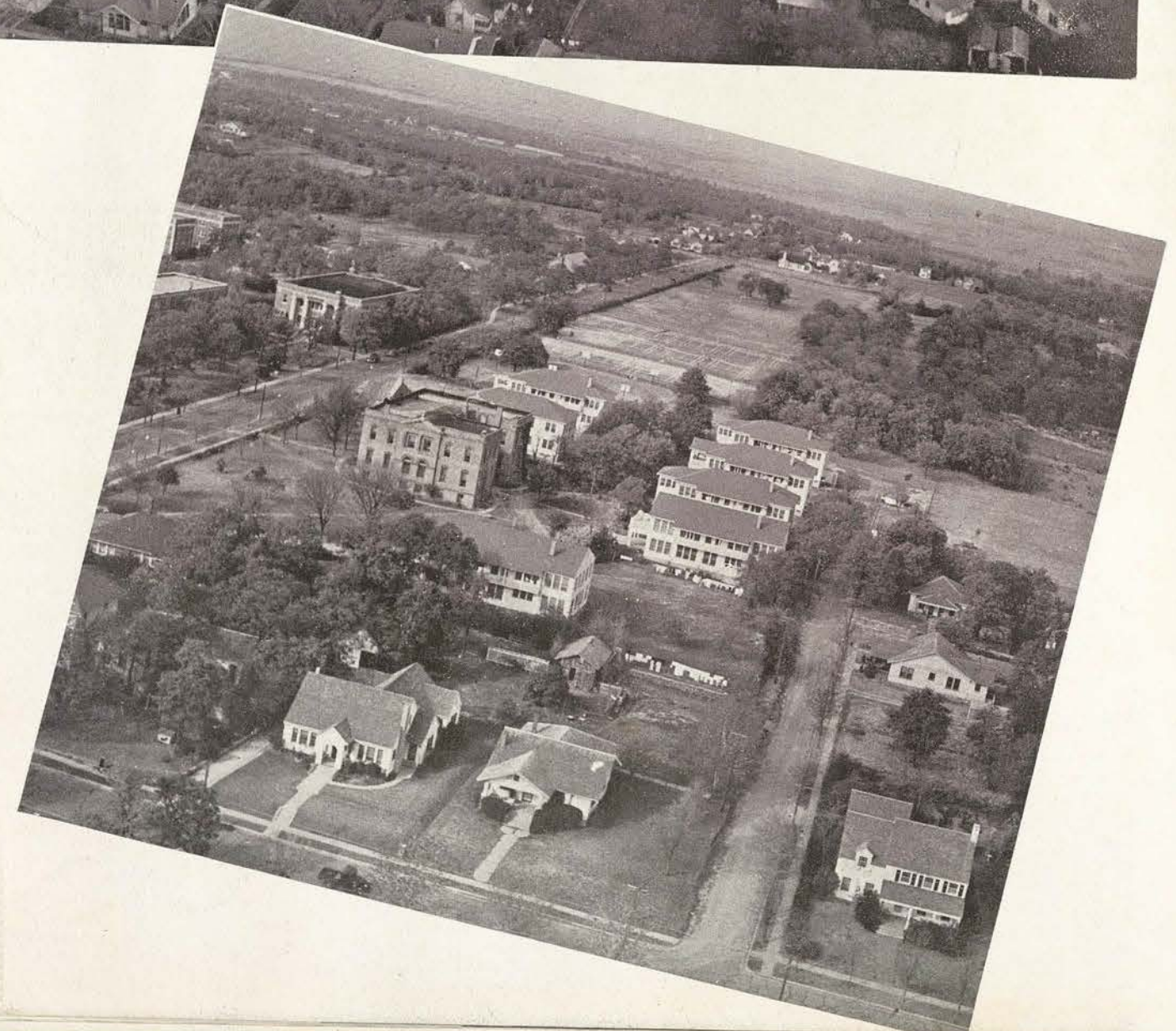


SCIENCE HALL

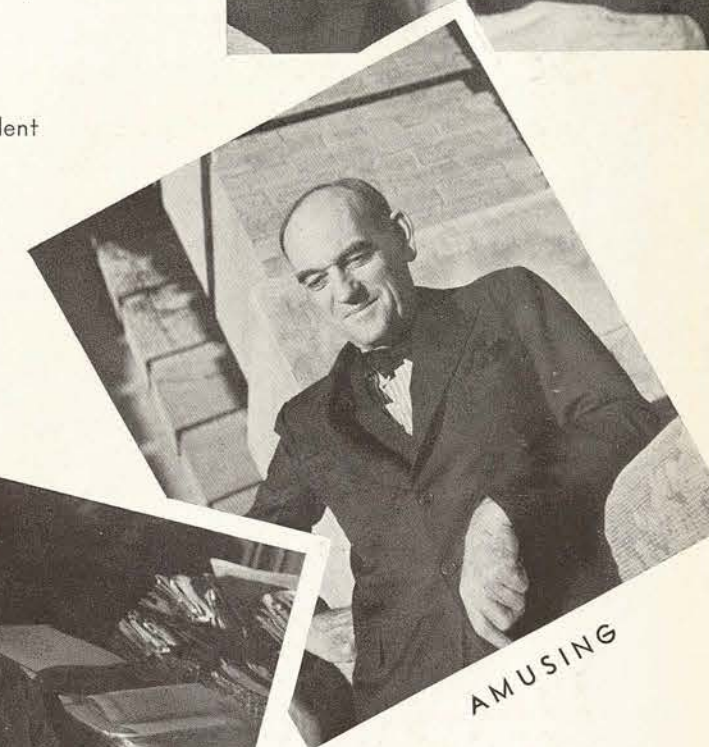
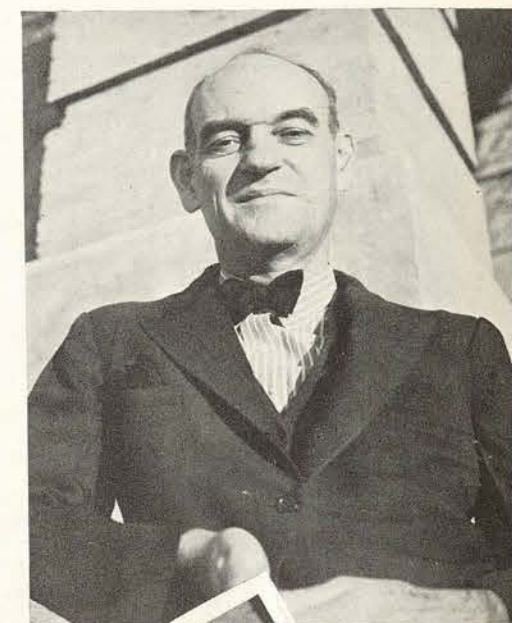
To the Members of the Class of 1937:

HISTORY OF THE GRADUATE DIVISION

The establishment of a Graduate Division at the Texas State College for Women was authorized by the Board of Regents at its meeting held on March 22, 1930. Work leading to the degree of Master of Arts is offered, with majors in the following departments: Business Administration, Education, English, Fine Arts, History, Home Economics, Physical Education, Sociology, and Spanish.

Graduate work was started during the summer session of 1930, with an enrollment of seventy-six. During the summer of 1936 the enrollment was two hundred and ten. Since the establishment of the graduate division approximately seven hundred students have enrolled for graduate work; of these, one hundred and twenty-two have secured the Master's Degree.

During the first summer session the graduate student body was made up largely of our own graduates. In the last seven years graduates from widely scattered universities and colleges have registered for graduate work. Some of the institutions conferring the undergraduate degrees held by our graduate students are University of Chicago, Columbia University, Baylor University, Mary Hardin Baylor College, Texas Woman's College, Rice Institute, University of Washington, James Millikin University, University of Illinois, Southern Methodist University, Sam Houston State Teachers' College, East Texas State Teachers' College, North Texas State Teachers' College, Michigan State Teachers' College, Daniel Baker, University of Bucharest, University of Tennessee, Harden College, Trinity University, Austin College, and Howard Payne.

Dr. Willis H. Clark is director of the Graduate Committee with President L. H. Hubbard, Dean E. V. White, Dr. L. M. Ellison, Mrs. Ercel Eppright, and Miss Mary Marshall assisting him.

AMALESE GOUGH

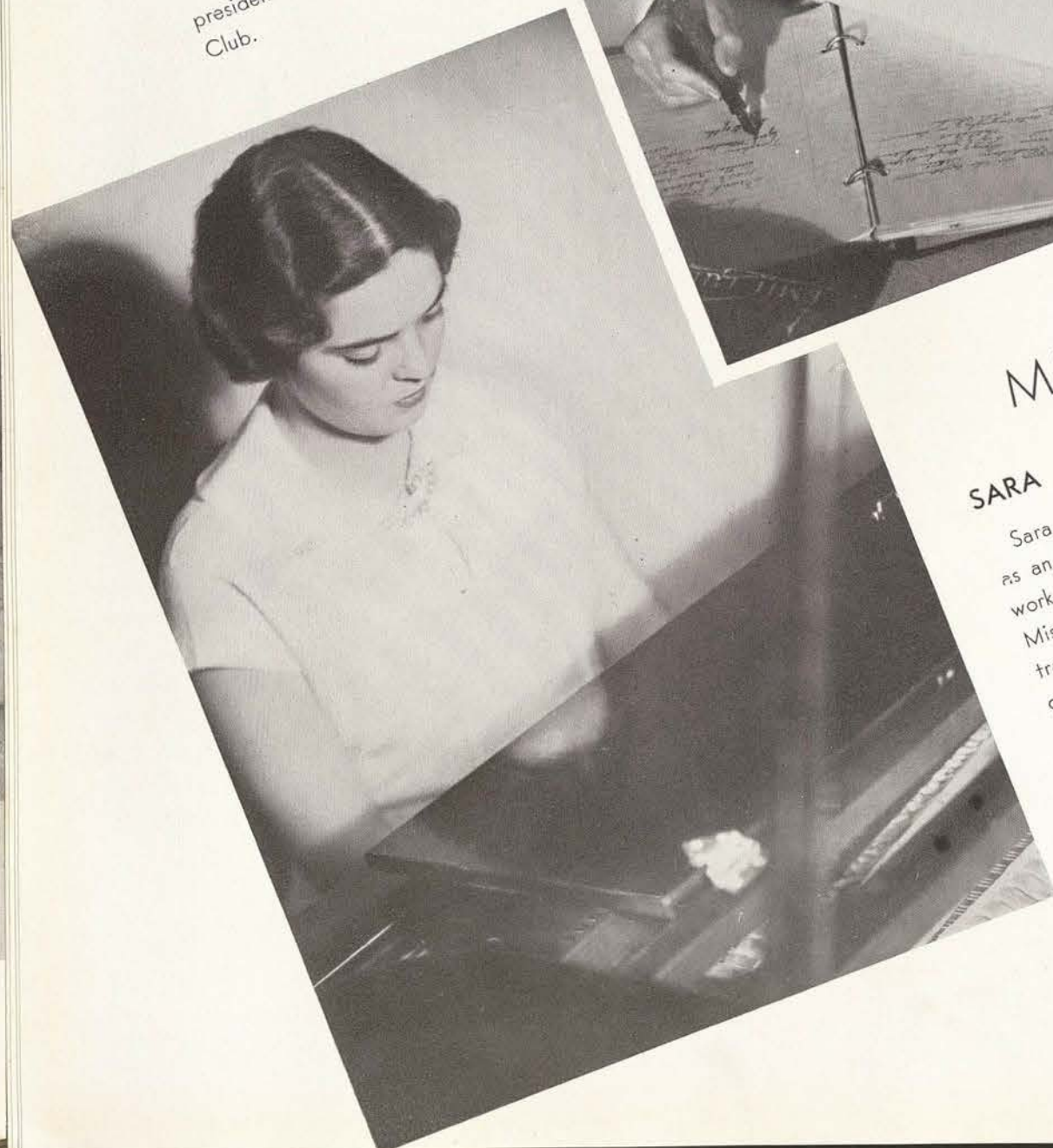
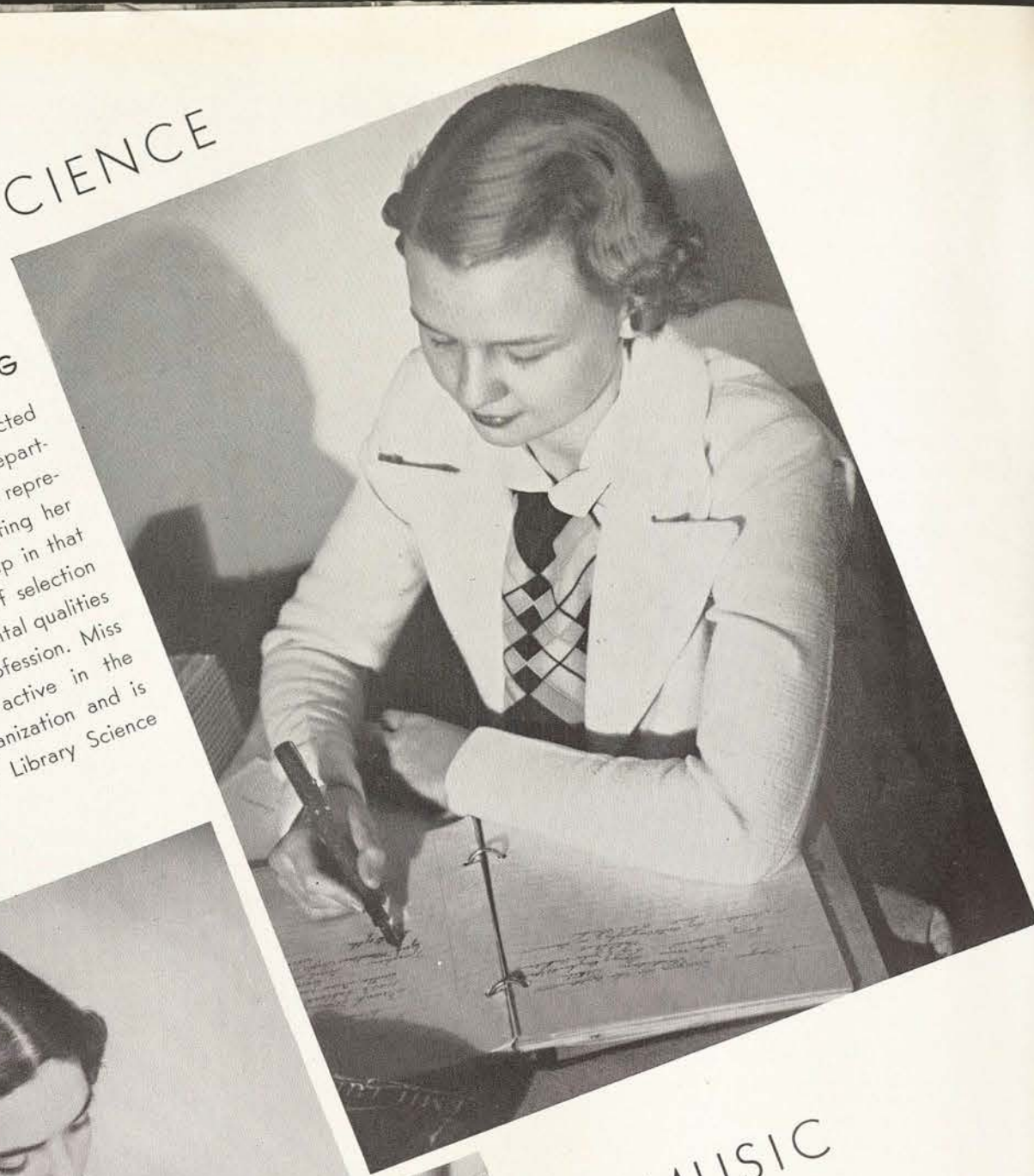

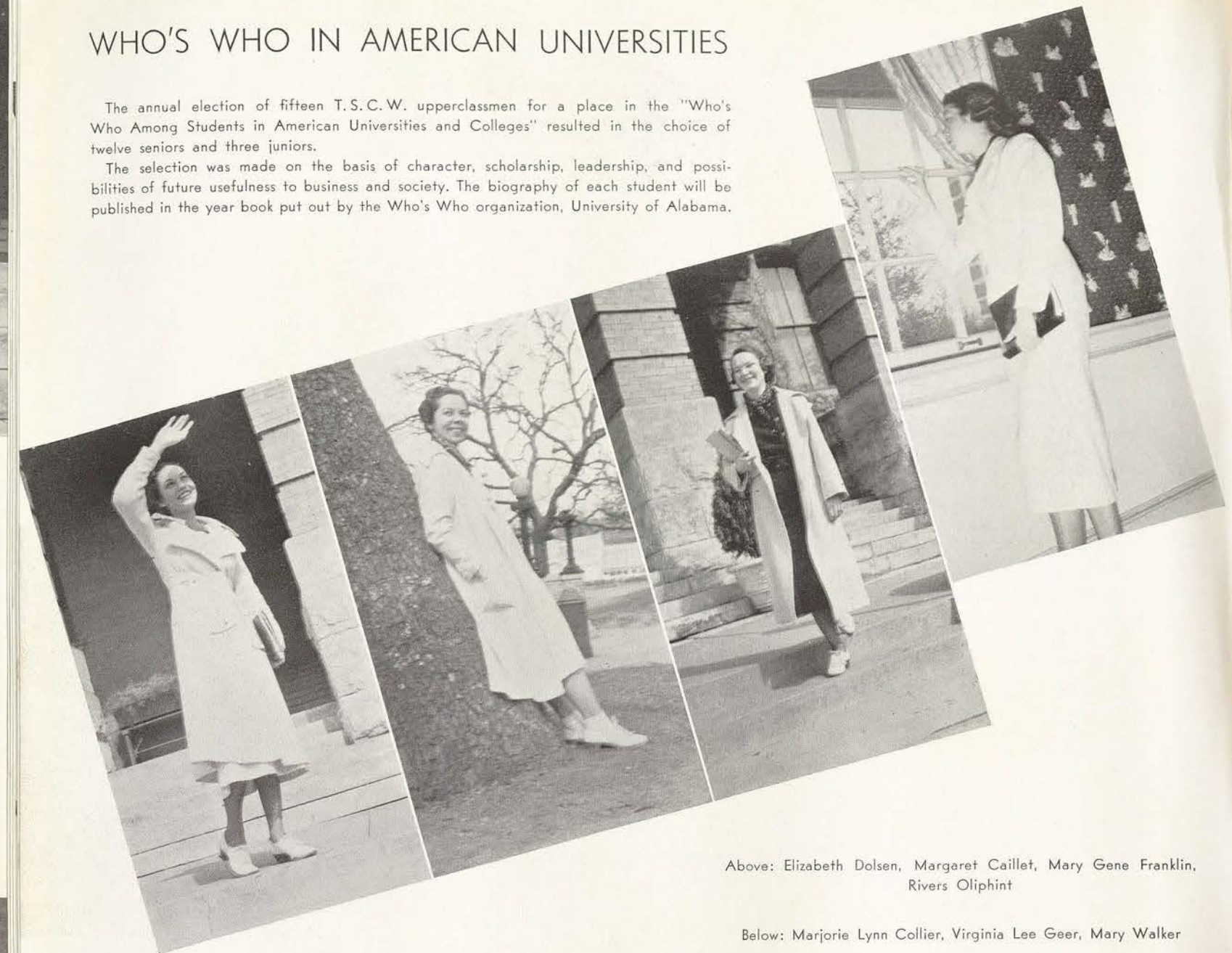
MARY GENE FRANKLIN

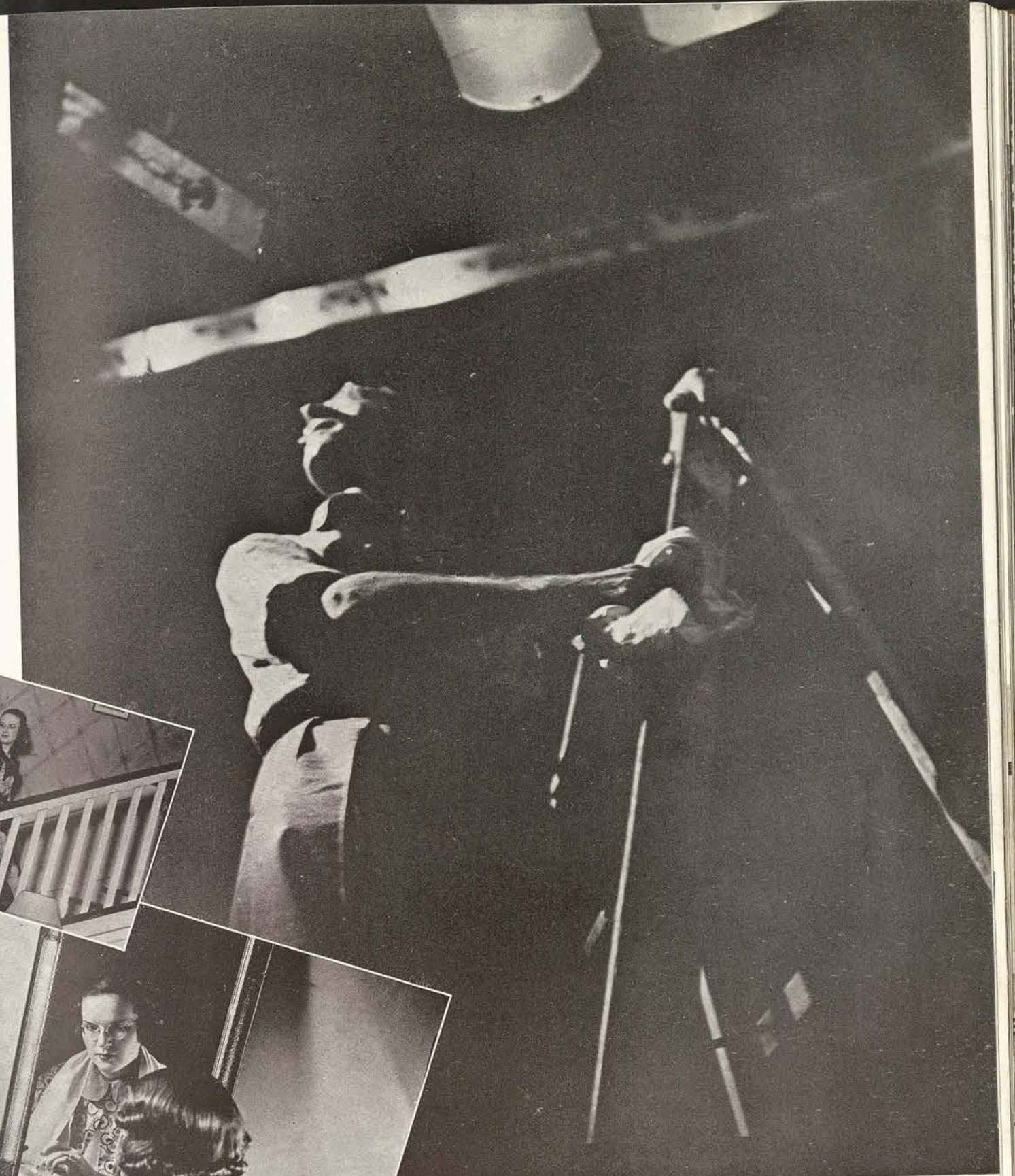
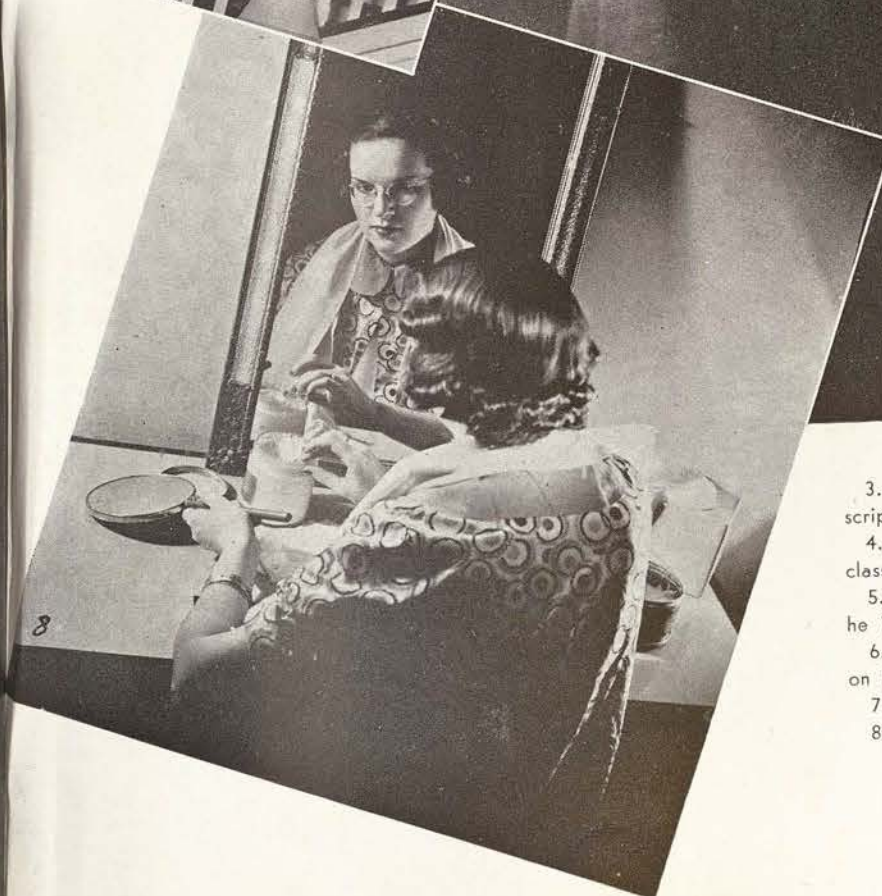
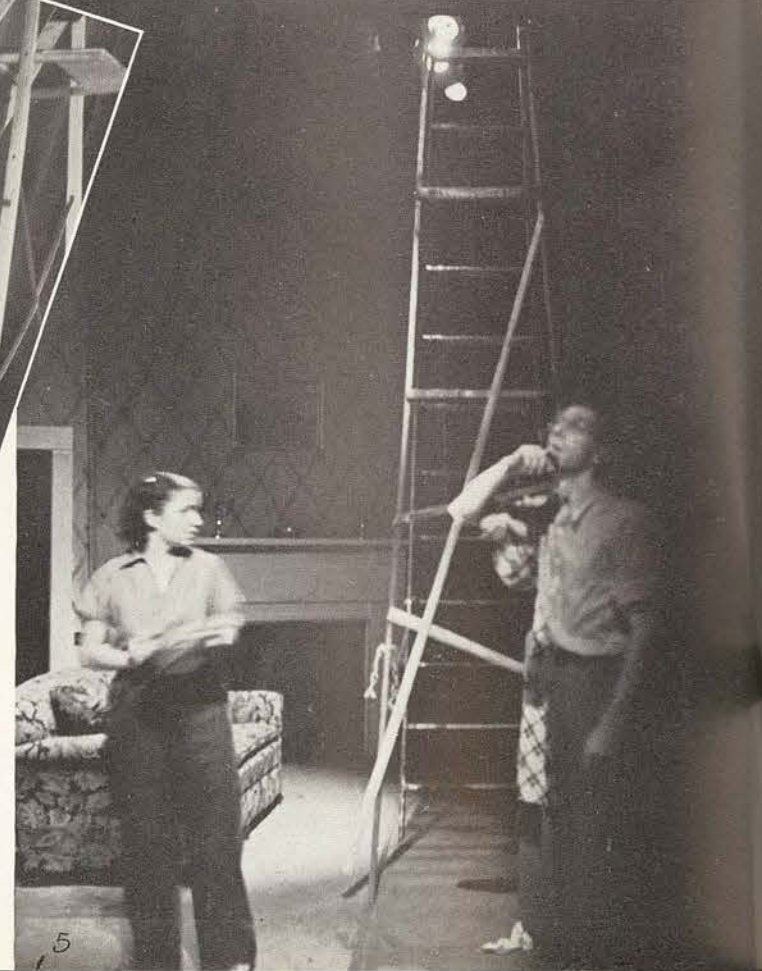
Producing Spring Dance

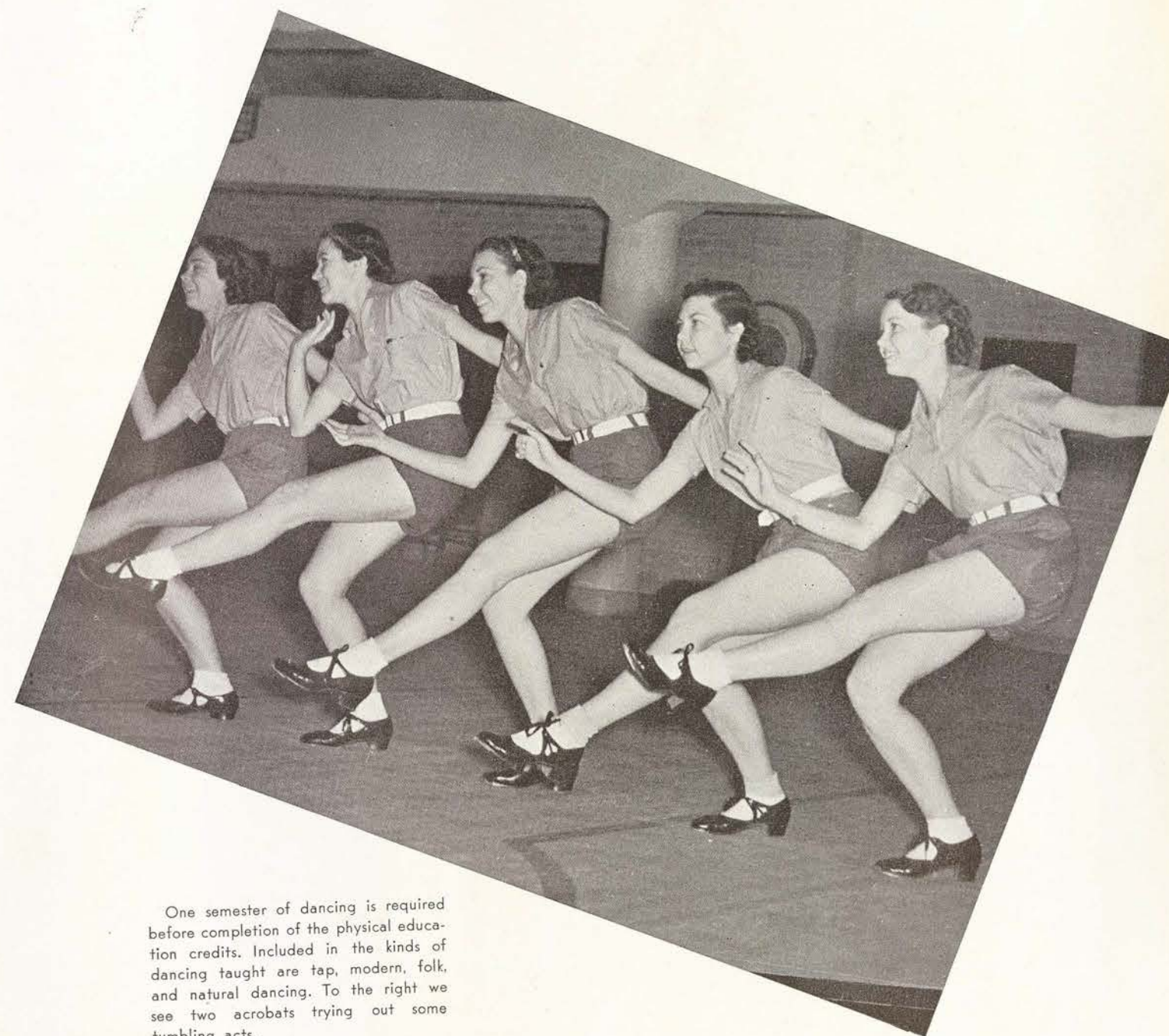
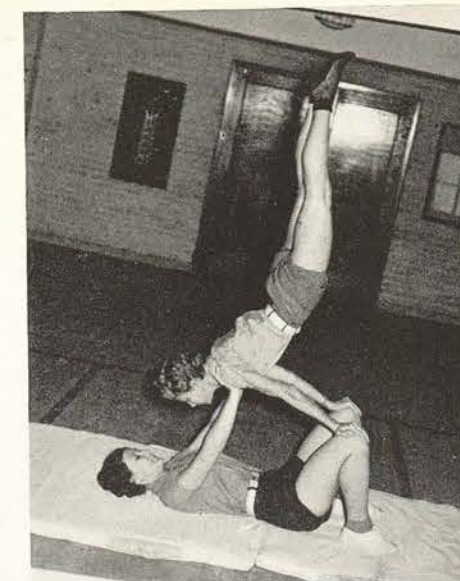
New ranges and equipment are available to students who take part in the classes. It won't be the gun's fault if these girls don't hit the bull's eye.

ERNEST HUTCHESON

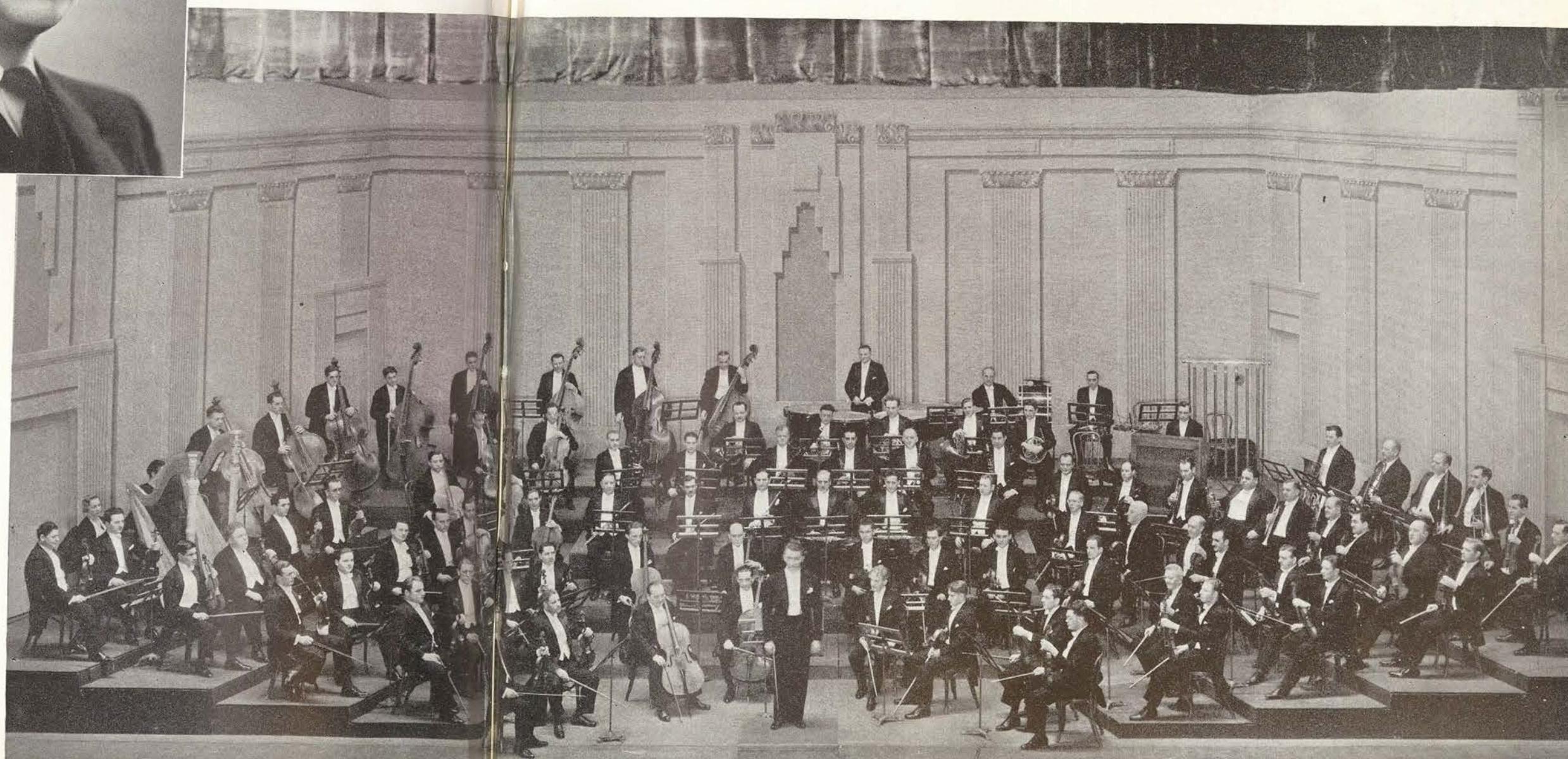

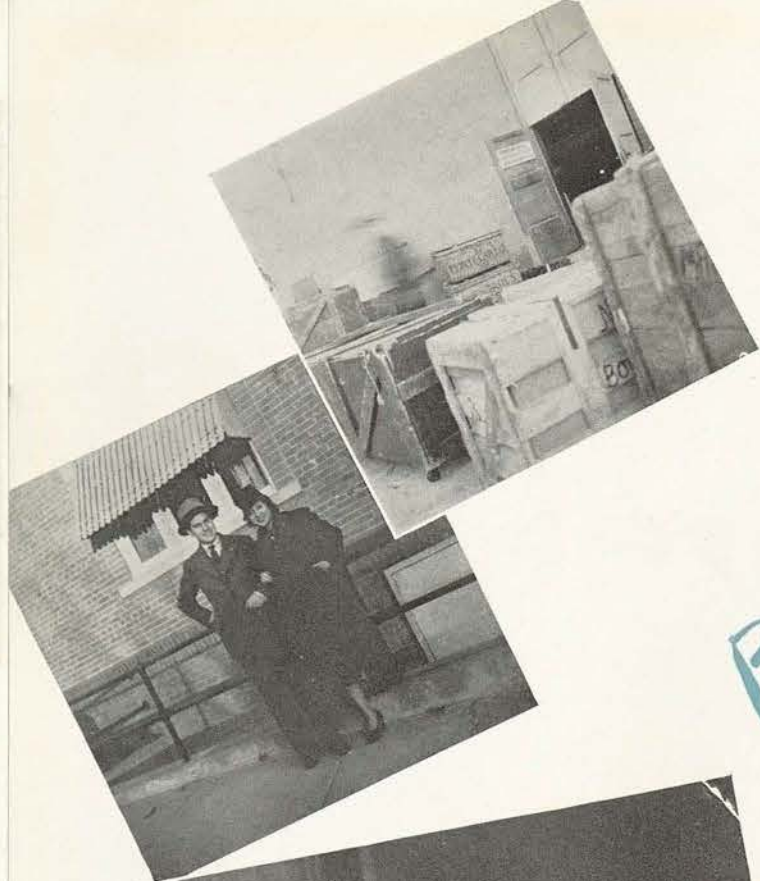
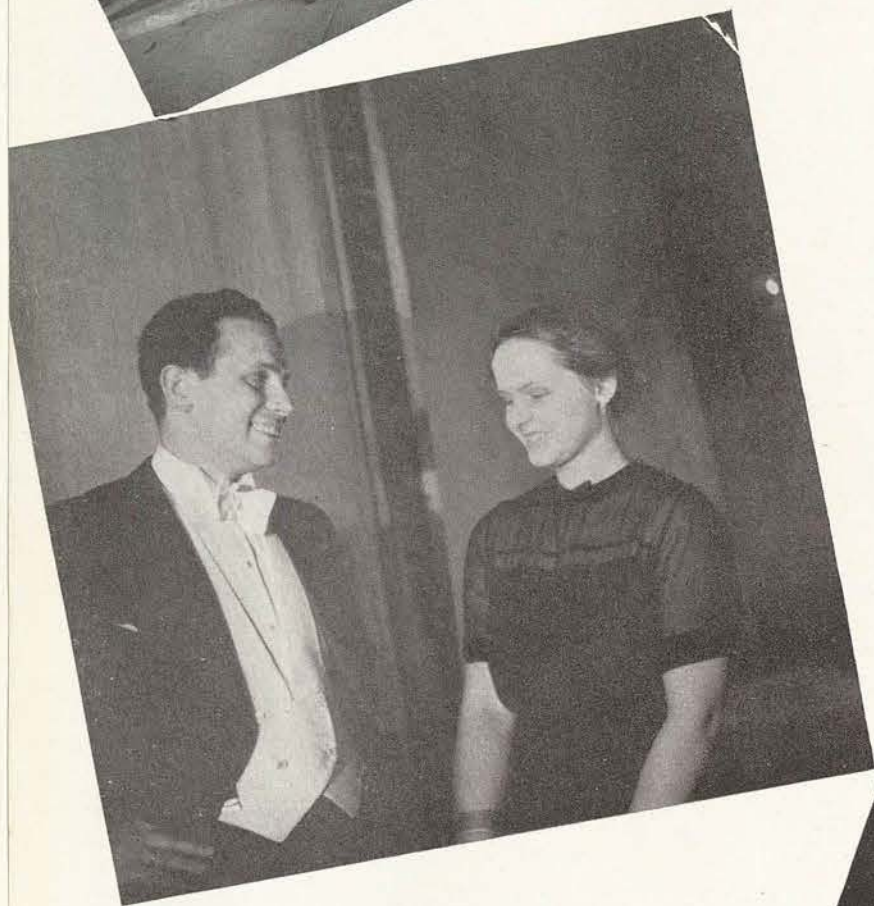
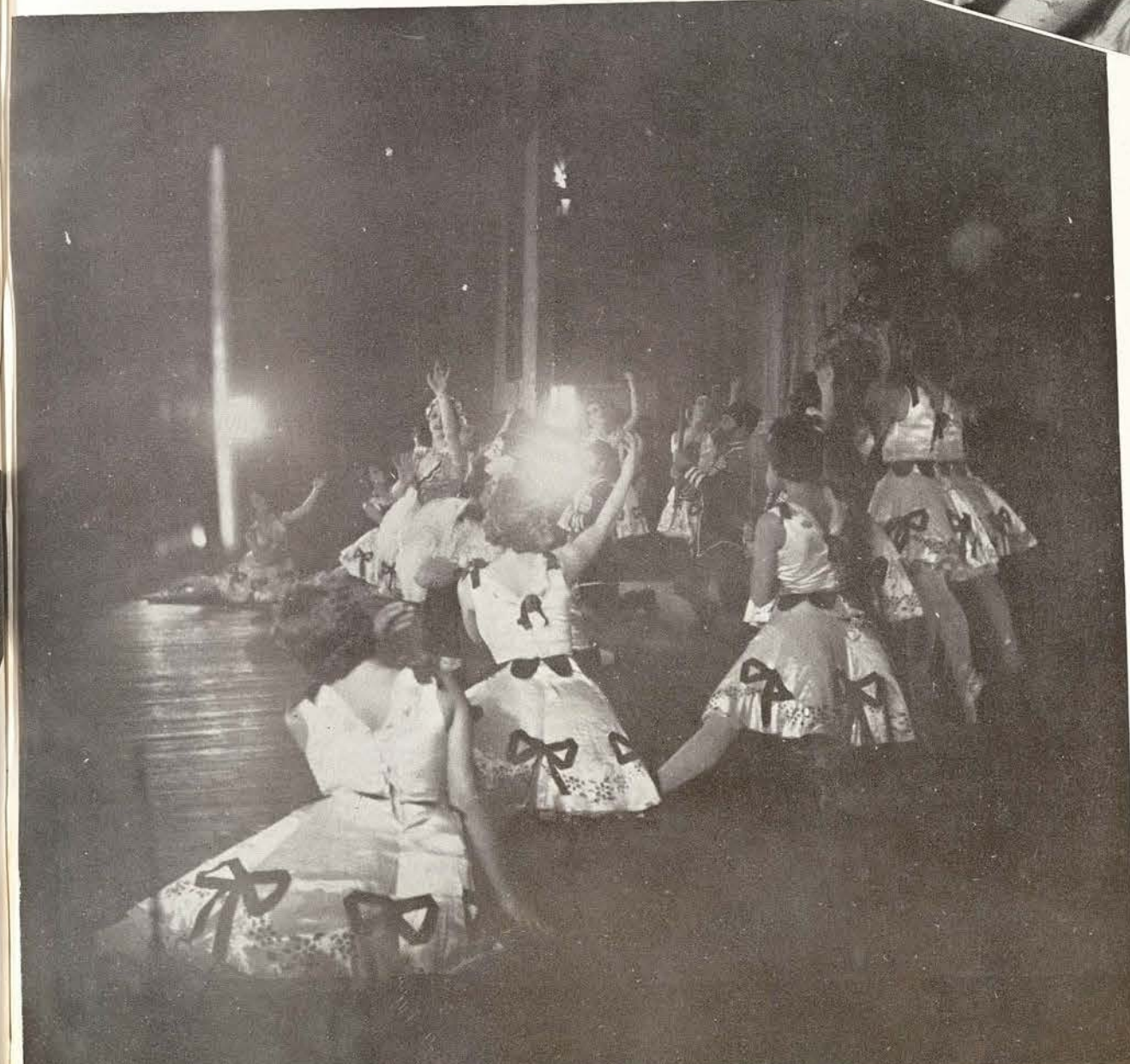
Backstage with

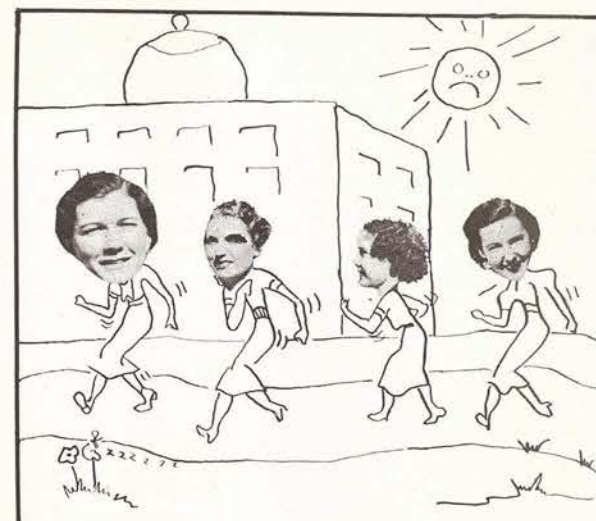
ACT III: COMMITTEE MEETING AGAIN
