



For thirty-five years students have entered—each one adding something to our institution, each one leaving with new aspirations, standards, and increased wisdom.


Student life has become more and more democratic—unaffected, sincere; with an attitude, not of worldly cynicism, but of eagerness and enthusiasm for the future and its problems.




To the Members of the Class of 1938:


The aim of the newly organized English Club is to promote interest in English literature through reports given at the regular meetings and to bring about a friendlier relationship between members in the department.







PRIDE AND PREJUDICE
















REGISTRATION




Wispy chiffons and swishy taffetas replaced tailored uniforms for the first time in the history of the college.

to be cooked three times a day. A house manager, in each dormitory, acts as dietitian in planning the meals.

The dorms have two-girl and three-girl rooms, attractively furnished. The newer houses have four-girl rooms, and the fact that each group lives together happily, is an adequate test of the cooperative spirit.




A little brightening of the campus color scheme received its impetus on that Thursday morning when uniforms were officially abolished.















SNOWTIME ...

... took top honors for the fish and won the cup. Theirs was a musical extravaganza with original songs, lots of dancing girls, and a love plot.





Though the glamor of the Senior Formal was dimmed somewhat by the au revoir to uniformed dances, it still remains THE social event of the year for the graduate.






