
Dean of Women

Chairman



Another interesting feature for this year consisted of the large donations made by the local and out-of-town merchants. This factor of the sale increased its assets greatly.



smiles.




Our President Hubbard and former President Work, the first chief executive of C. I. A., meet at the front entrance of the Administration building upon Class Day, and stop for a friendly chat.

ATHLETICS

History of the Women's Athletic Association

In 1911 we find the organization of the Women's Athletic Association in its "cradle days," having only two major sports, basketball and tennis. Throughout the years, until 1921, varsity teams were selected for intercollegiate activities. The old telegrams that were sent to the Association accepting challenges from other colleges are amusing to us today. These challenges are received no more, for "it just isn't being done." Our ideals for physical education and for sports are growing.

As we read old records again, we feel the thrill that comes with the introduction of a new sport to our college. In 1912, one of the most interesting sports was introduced. "Let's hike." And they did, and still do. Today we have added to our repertoire of activities these major sports: Volley Ball, Field Hockey, Tennis, Basketball, Dancing, Swimming, and Life Saving. Our purpose is: To further interest in outdoor sports which add to the aim and the zest of college life, and after college life to develop fair dealing, self-direction, self-control, love of "sport for sport's sake," and "a team for every girl and for every girl a team."

In 1925, the Association joined the first telegraphic swimming meet with other colleges in the state. The championship was made known by wire. Then in 1927, we joined the first telegraphic track meet, competing with Texas University, Southern Methodist University, and Sam Houston State Teachers' College.


Last year we had a tournament in singles only, which was won by Ezma Taylor, who was the first to have her name engraved upon the W. A. A. singles championship cup. Each


year the winner in the singles tournament will have her name placed on this cup.





The Lass-O

THE Lass-O, the college newspaper, is issued weekly by the students of journalism. The paper is printed every Saturday in the College print shop, where all type has been set by students of linotyping.

The staff is elected by the student body every year and has charge of the management of the entire paper. The editor makes out assignments for stories from tips turned in; the student reporter gets the facts and writes the story. After copy has been read by student copy-readers, it is carried to the print shop and set up into type. The editor and her assistants read all proof and mark corrections. After all type has been set, the editor makes a "dummy," or chart, of the position on the different pages that each story is to occupy.

For the past several years, the Lass-O has received no appropriation from the State. Operating expenses are paid by the

advertising which the paper carries. Special classes in ad. writing and merchandising make lay-outs for the ads and sell them to the merchants. In this way, the paper has become self-supporting, paying all expenses from the printer's salary to the upkeep on the typewriters.

The Lass-O occupies a unique position among college publications in that it is used as laboratory material by students of the journalism department and yet has only nominal faculty supervision.

In addition, the student is presented with views of the campus and its buildings, and is allowed to gaze upon the class beauties and favorites, whose names are thus disclosed for the first time. Still another, and a most interesting section is that devoted to our august executives and faculty members, and those less august, but still highly important, members of the Students' Council.

In presenting this matter the editors hope that all the various interests of the College are represented, and that the book will be a true "annal," to which every student may refer, alike for pleasure and for information.


MUSIC and DRAMA


The College Choir and Choral





ACT I

Poor Liza (she will be referred to as "poor Liza" continually throughout the play) clasps her chee-ile more closely to her, and pushes bravely on. Suddenly she faints, but regains consciousness just in time to evade the pack, which is almost upon her. Since the pack was almost upon her when she fainted, it must be got across to the audience that the bloodhounds were suddenly diverted by the beauty of the scenery, thus giving poor Liza time for her momentary weakness.)

Liza (as she bounds across the greensward):
Alas, my chee-ile, that your golden curls and creamy white complexion should thus be exposed to the inclemencies of the roughened gale!
(Note: this is excellent, for in this one sentence you can tell exactly how Liza's chee-ile looks. The fact that a negro should have golden curls and a creamy white complexion may be reconciled in any way the producer sees fit.)

The Pack: Ba-a-a-a-a-a-a-ay! Ba-a-a-y! (the sound effect here is produced by Dorothy Mil

(Poor Liza, hearing them, throws a look over her shoulder. The hounds catch it and seem infuriated, and redouble their pace. So does poor Liza. The hounds re-double it. So does poor Liza. Poor Liza whirls suddenly and stops, hand raised like a traffic cop.) Liza: Stop! (the pack stops in astounded confusion.)

"Who touches a hair of this golden head Dies like a dog! Git fer home!" she said.

(The pack, whose ambition it has always been to die as unlike a dog as possible, turns in utter defeat and slinks away. Liza, forgetting for the moment her terrible curse, smooths her chee-ile's hair, and immediately dies like a dog. The chee-ile is left in bitter grief to bury its mother in the snow. Thus ends Act I in tragedy.)

ACT II

(Simon Legree (Eric G. Schroeder) is shown in his customary attitude, whip upraised and a fierce look on the face. Uncle Tom (the Journalism Department) is crouched on the floor at his feet. The whip descends swishingly. Uncle Tom bends to his labor, and sings a hymn in spite of his pain. Care must be taken to get together on this, so as to secure as much the effect of one person as possible.)

Uncle Tom (singing his hymn): And we won't be home until mo-o-rning—we won't be home at all!

(Simon Legree indulges in some choice epithets which may be modified or exaggerated according to the tenderness or sophistication of the audience. For a C. I. A. audience, the author suggests the greatest exaggeration possible, as otherwise it will seem tame. Finally Li'l Eva's spirit enters in the form of Monia Wilcoxon, and Simon Legree's heart is suddenly softened by her presence.)

Li'l Eva (weeping softly): Thank God I arrived in time! Simon, (taking him by the hand and looking compassionately in his eyes) you won't be a wicked man any more; will you? Come, let us all join hands and, singing, rise to heaven. They do so, having absolutely no trouble with the roof. There is a wait of a few seconds, presumably while the journey is being made to heaven. Then there is a heavy crash, and Simon Legree descends through the roof, picks himself up, and becomes the complete villain again, maligning Saint Peter for at least five minutes before the curtain falls.



Early Natural Gas History:

Natural Gas was known to exist in China, Persia, and British India for many centuries, although it was never put to commercial use. It appeared as leakage from gas-bearing strata through crevices in the ground, and when lighted by the natives, it was worshipped as a Fire God.

In this country, as early as 1775, George Washington dedicated to his country, as a national park, a tract of land which he had preempted, located in West Virginia, containing a burning spring. This, too, was leakage from a crevice in the ground. The first discovery of Natural Gas by drilling in the United States occurred through the drilling in the shallow wells for salt in Ohio and West Virginia, and probably dates back to early in the nineteenth century. The first actual use of Natural Gas for light occurred in 1826, but it was not until 1872 that cities were piped for Natural Gas for domestic purposes.
