
The board of regents has taken an active interest in student problems and the ex-students association has been unusually co-operative in furthering the development of the college.






## SENIOR RECITALS





Combining the speech and music departments, the Nativity Play was produced under the auspices of the Young Women's Christian Association.



The Junior History of the Drama Class presented a characteristic Chinese play, "Lady Precious Stream," this year which was directed by Miss Mary K. Sands.



Miss Landi was born in Venice, Italy, and has traveled extensively throughout Europe. She has appeared on the stage and screen in the United States, and has played in French and English films.

# THE WELSH IMPERIAL SINGERS

Under the direction of R. Festyn Davis, the Welsh Imperial Singers appeared on the artist course. Called "Britain's greatest male ensemble," the Welsh Singers have appeared with success in Europe, Canada, and the United States. Each member of the group is a brilliant vocalist who has distinguished himself as an Eisteddfod prize winner.

#### LEW SARETT

Lew Sarett has served as a guide and United States ranger in the Northwest several months each year for the past sixteen years. He supplemented his lecture with selections from his "Wings Against the Moon," "Slow Smoke," "Many, Many Moons," and "The Box of God." The title poem from the latter collection is rated by Harry Hanson, literary editor of the New York World-Telegram, as a greater work on Indian life than "Hiawatha."



Edna St. Vincent Millay, America's foremost woman poet, made her second appearance at the college on the drama series. Author of "Wine From These Grapes" and "Conversation at Midnight," she was awarded the Pulitzer Prize for poetry in 1923 for her collection, "The Harp Weaver." Her sonnets, of all her writing, have received the highest praise and it is in this form that she prefers to write.

#### "PETER PAN"

Students of TSCW lived in a world of fantasy for an hour and a half when the Claire Tree Major Company presented James M. Barrie's "Peter Pan" on the drama series. Heading the cast as Peter, Leslie Gorall was the first boy ever to play this celebrated role. 


# THE PLAINSMEN QUARTET

Many of Mr. Chase's better known books have dealt with the waste in this land of plenty.


#### ARTHUR POISTER








# JUNIORS MAKE "HEY"





## SATURDAYS


Patsy Childers, in charge of elections, tells students about voting rules.








# AFTER FOUR YEARS . . .


