WOMAN'S COLLECTION AWARDS RESEARCH FELLOWSHIPS

The Woman's Collection has awarded two \$500 research fellowships to visiting researchers Dr. Anadelia Gonzales of Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi and Elizabeth Nicols, a graduate student at Texas Christian University.

Dr. Gonzales' study analyzes the significance of the Pan American Association for the Advancement of Women, 1922-1925. Ms. Nicols, a recipient for the second consecutive year, plans to write an institutional history of the Texas Federation of Colored Women's Clubs for her dissertation. She received her master's degree in history from Texas Woman's University.
