TWU DRAMA PRESENTS ‘IF YOU GIVE A MOUSE A COOKIE’

The Texas Woman’s University drama program concludes its Children’s Theater Summer Series with “If You Give a Mouse a Cookie.” Performances are slated July 16-17 and 23-24 on the Denton campus.

Friday performances are at 10 a.m. and 7 p.m., and Saturday performances are at 2 and 7 p.m. All performances will take place in the Redbud Theater Complex, located on the northwest side of historic Hubbard Hall on TWU’s Denton campus. The play, adapted from the book by Laura Numeroff, follows the story of a young boy who wonders what will happen if you give a mouse a cookie. He will want a glass of milk, of course! As the play unfolds, the mouse’s demands get larger and larger, running his young host ragged. The action takes place on a colorful, oversized set designed in conjunction with North Central Texas College.

Graduate student Jennie Patton is the producer for the Children’s Theater Summer series. Cristin Thomas will direct “If You Give A Mouse A Cookie.” The cast features Mallory Bryant-Gawne, Cassie Henderson and Joanna Wesson. Costume design is by Alex Rodriguez; lighting design by Jonathan Felt; and sound design by Stanton Brasher. Cassie Henderson is the prop designer, and makeup design is by Brittany Fowler. Kristen Brasher is the stage manager for the production.
