TWU SCHOOL OF MANAGEMENT RECEIVES NATIONAL RECOGNITION

TWU's School of Management gained national recognition with its placement in Entrepreneur Magazine's Top Ten Entrepreneurial Colleges — Limited Curriculum.

"This is the second consecutive year we have made it into the top 10," said Sherrie Taylor, a lecturer in the School of Management and director of TWU's Small Business Institute. A total of 124 schools were placed in the limited curriculum rankings.

Taylor attributed the recognition to a combination of the SBI, Students In Free Enterprise (SIFE) and the small business and entrepreneurship minor, as well as a focus within the general business degree.

TWU Custodial Services shined in a recent poll of similar universities and colleges in the Central Association of Physical Plant Administrators (CAPPA). TWU ranked third among the 10 member institutions surveyed in the informal poll. Each TWU custodian maintains approximately 28,500 square feet of space on average, compared to 26,200 square feet per custodian for the 10 institutions polled.
