531 STUDENTS TO GRADUATE AUG. 13

Some 531 students -- 239 undergraduate and 292 graduate -- will receive their degrees during two commencement ceremonies Saturday, Aug. 13, in Margo Jones Performance Hall.

Ceremony I, for candidates from the College of Arts and Sciences and the School of Library and Information Studies, will begin at 9 a.m. Ceremony II, for candidates from the colleges of nursing, health sciences and education and human ecology and the schools of physical therapy and occupational therapy, will begin at 11:30 a.m.

The commencement speakers will be Dr. Timothy Hoye, associate professor of mathematics, Ceremony I; and Thomas Croley, associate professor of physical therapy, Ceremony II.

A reception for candidates and their guests will be held from 10 to 11 a.m. in the southwest dining room of Hubbard Hall.

MUSIC ACCREDITATION EXTENDED; DEGREE PROGRAM APPROVED

The National Association of Schools of Music (NASM) has extended the accreditation of TWU's music programs for another 10 years and granted final approval for a new degree program, the bachelor of arts in music.

TWU is saddened to report the death of Ed Morrison Jr., CEO of Morrison Milling Co., a landmark company for the City of Denton. Mr. Morrison passed away on Tuesday, July 26, while in Houston at the M.D. Anderson Medical Center.

Mr. Morrison and wife Jeane have been very special friends of the university. Mr. Morrison was a charter member of the TWU Foundation President's Council and served as chair for many years. He and his family, as well as the Morrison Milling Company, have generously supported over the years many of the activities and programs at TWU. We will miss our very good friend. His advice as well as good humor were always deeply appreciated.

GRANTS ANNOUNCED

Two faculty members recently received funding for projects in nursing and library and information studies, according to Dr. Sondra Ferstl, associate dean for research in the Office of Research and Grants. The recipients and their awards are listed below.

■ Dr. Peggy Drapo (Nursing), \$22,760 from the Texas Department of Health, for the "Shots Across Texas Denton County Coalition," an immunization program aimed at parents of children age 2 and under living in urban and rural locations.

■ Dr. Keith Swigger (Library and Information Studies), \$144,000 from the U.S. Department of Education, for doctoral fellowships in library and information studies. The grant will enable two fellows from previous awards to continue their studies and provide for the recruitment of six new fellows to begin doctoral study. The new students will include both mid-career librarians and recent master's degree recipients.
