Founded in 1901, Texas State College for Women is an important nationally recognized, accredited institution, providing superior university training in nearly 70 fields leading to various baccalaureate degrees. Fourteen departments offer the Master of Arts degree. Additional offerings include the degrees of Master of Business Administration, Master of Education, Master of Home Economics Education, and Master of Library Science. Some of the departments, including those of Education, English, and Health, Physical Education and Recreation, have developed programs for students desiring to carry their training beyond the Master's degree. The Doctor of Philosophy and the Doctor of Education are available in the TSCW College of Household Arts and Sciences in all fields of Home Economics.

A curriculum combining specialized career courses and liberal education has been planned — and continually reshaped — to train young women in mind as well as hand to assume with confidence responsible professional careers in today's society.

The word "Career" at TSCW is a wide term. It means what an educated wife and mother gives to family life, or the contribution women in business and the professions make to their community. Or both.

Although many degree sequences in highly technical courses are available at Texas State College for Women, every graduate of the College gets a solid foundation in liberal arts. The liberal arts curriculum, interrelated with the content of the professional courses, is directed toward your balanced development. Your intellectual, emotional, physical and spiritual powers then grow along with your technical proficiency.

Some of you will plan to build a career based on a technical degree program. Others will choose the liberal arts training which is the preferred background for many types of work. In either cases you will have the assurance that your program has been carefully planned to meet your needs, and that your

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TSCW always has been known for its democratic spirit. There are no social sororities on the campus, and each girl is recognized as an individual, sharing the work and play of the entire student body. Students who desire may join the campus social-literary clubs when sophomores. TSCW has 14 junior clubs affiliated with the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs.

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A well-rounded extra-curricular program is available in scores of student organizations. There are clubs and other groups to meet every wish and need.

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TSCW draws its students from a wide area, including many of the states of the nation and a dozen for-

eign countries.

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Leadership and poise are TSCW characteristics.

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The Little Chapel-in-the-Woods, one of the architectural gems of the world, is on the TSCW campus. Much of the work, such as stained glass windows, lighting fixtures and carvings, was done by art students.

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TSCW is widely known for its wholesome spiritual climate. Students conduct non-denominational services each Sunday in the Little Chapel-in-the-Woods, weekly vesper services in the dormitories, and participate extensively in the work of the Denton churches.

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TSCW has a Student Union Building with a ballroom for more than 750 couples and a complete Recreation Room. An outdoor swimming pool of Olympic proportions adjoins.

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The College has splendid recreational facilities, including play-fields for all sports, hard and clay courts for tennis, an 18-hole golf course, outdoor and indoor swimming pools, dance studios, a large gymnasium equipped

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Through the years, TSCW has been known as the "sister college" of Texas A&M. TSCW students have a holiday each fall when the Aggies play football in nearby Dallas or Fort Worth. It is the occasion of the annual TSCW Corps Trip, when a TSCW student is presented as Aggie Sweetheart between halves of the game. Many Aggies also visit the campus for the class and club dances and other occasions.

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The TSCW Concert and Drama Series is outstanding, affording students an unusual advantage in entertainment and culture.

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TSCW has a great variety of attractive scholarships.

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TSCW graduates marry earlier and with greater permanence than the typical woman college graduate.

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TSCW has five regular student publications: *The Daily Lass-O*, only daily newspaper published by stu-

dents of a women's college; *Daedalian Annual*, a 300-page treasure book of memories; *Daedalian Quarterly*, literary publication; *Freshman Writer*, containing works of first-year students, and *Campus Life*, handbook for new students.

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TSCW recognizes its responsibility to train students to be high-minded citizens full of a deep, abiding respect for both the glories and the obligations of American citizenship.

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TSCW is located in Denton, 37 miles from Dallas and 35 miles from Fort Worth. Denton is a pleasant, wholesome and progressive home community with a population of 25,000, surrounded by wooded hills and large lakes. The TSCW campus of 220 acres and more than 60 buildings is in northeast Denton.

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Two railroads and four highways serve Denton and TSCW. State Highway 24 borders the northern edge of the campus for more than a mile. U. S. 77 is just one block west of the campus; both State Highways 377 and 10 touch the northwestern corner. Dallas and Fort Worth airports are close.

TSCW believes strongly in personality development along with academic progress. It provides that unbeatable combination — a college with superior facilities, outstanding academic standards and fullest national recognition along with the friendliest of campuses. You will become a part of TSCW your first day in the hubbub of meeting new friends. By the second day everyone is an "old friend." It works that fast.

The College has the most comfortable of dormitories where you can arrange your rooms just as you want it, attractively and conveniently. You will eat in the large air-conditioned central dining hall where food is served cafeteria style so that you may choose what you like.

You will appreciate and enjoy the social life at TSCW, where dating rules are those of the normal home. Your dates will be welcomed on the TSCW campus, and special provisions are made for them.

Education, Philosophy and Psychology

The teacher preparation work by the TSCW College of Education provides a superior liberal arts background. Also, faculty from many different fields are part-time professors in the teacher-training services of the College . . . you learn both how to teach and what you will teach. Among the majors is that for teaching exceptional children. A modern Demonstration School is located on the campus.

Majors are given in General Education, for students who select Education as an academic or cultural subject; Kindergarten-Primary, to prepare teachers for the kindergarten and primary grades; Upper-Elementary, to prepare teachers for these grades; Secondary, to prepare teachers for positions in high school; Psychology, for those interested in academic psychology as such and those desiring professional training in one of the applied fields of psychology; and a major in Special Education for Exceptional Children, meeting the requirements for the special certificate in the field.

Art

If Art is your field, TSCW is your College. Basic art courses in the Department of Art of the TSCW College of Fine Arts start in your freshman year. Major areas of study are: Advertising Design, Art Education, Ceramics, Costume Design and Fashion Illustration, History of Art, Interior Design, Jewelry and Metalwork, Painting, Sculpture. Elective art subjects include photography, crafts, etching and lithography, mechanical drawing, illustration, woodwork and plastics, drawing, painting, design. You will work in a large four-story building devoted entirely to art, with unusually modern and complete equipment, under the direction of teachers who are progressive, friendly and creative, men and women who are professional artists trained in America and Europe.

Music

The Department of Music in the TSCW College of Fine Arts is recognized as having the finest piano division in the South. The department emphasizes development of the individual and offers specialization in piano, voice, organ, violoncello, orchestral music, music education, music therapy, church music. TSCW music study develops personal confidence and professional competence and its graduates are most successful. Music at the College is housed in a beautiful building with spacious and well-equipped studios and practice rooms. A large number of orchestral instruments, including those for a complete symphony, are available to you. Class recitals, in which you will perform for fellow students, are given each week, and there is much opportunity for public performance.

Health, Physical Education and Recreation

With extensive facilities and well-trained staff, TSCW affords professional preparation in its College of Health, Physical Education and Recreation—as well as an all-around program. TSCW was the first college in the South to offer a major in Recreation; the first in Texas to have a degree in Physical Education; its Dance Education has never been excelled by any other college or university in the nation. Many graduates go directly into college teaching. You may elect courses leading to skills for leisure time in a wide variety of activities, including all forms of dance (ballroom, folk, modern and tap); individual, dual and team sports; all phases of aquatics, including swimming, diving, water safety, boating, canoeing, life saving and water ballet; corrective and restricted exercises for postural defects, body conditioning with emphasis on beauty of line and proportion, and modified sports including archery, bowling, golf; health instruction adapted to the needs and interests of young college women with the emphasis upon the physical, mental, social, emotional and spiritual aspects of a vibrant quality of good health. TSCW students are recognized for their good posture, correct walk, personal charm.

Household Arts and Sciences (Home Economics)

TSCW had the first organized curriculum for Home Economics in Texas and one of the first in the country. Its College of Household Arts and Sciences now is unexcelled nationally . . . one of the four in the nation offering the Doctor of Philosophy in subject matter fields of Home Economics. Objectives of this division are two-fold: to train you for better personal and family living, and to equip you for a career in these fields — child development and nursery education, clothing and textile design, textiles and textile technology, foods and nutrition, home economics education, home economics and journalism, home and family life, home demonstration, home management and housing, institution management. This division of the College has a new four-story building, plus a separate large building for its extensive research. The second building houses the important Nelda Childers Stark Laboratory for Human Nutrition, which contains a large portion of the nation's material on this vital subject.

Bible and Religion

You may elect Bible in any group of courses not to exceed twelve semester hours of credit. A major in this subject is not offered. Bible Chairs are maintained by the Texas Methodist Student Movement, the Baptist Churches of Texas and the Presbyterian Church. The instruction given, however, is entirely non-sectarian, and aims to secure for the students the benefits to be gained from a broader culture and a deeper spiritual life.

TSCW Costs Are Most Economical

The charges for attending Texas State College for Women are among the lowest in the nation — \$293 each semester.

This includes board and room, tuition, and linen and activity fees. The College furnishes textbooks without charge. (Tuition costs for out-of-Texas students are \$50 additional each semester.)

The girls who need very much to economize may apply for residence in the Rusk Cooperative System in which room and board is available at a substantially lower rate.

In all cases, room and board may be paid on the installment plan.

While personal expenses naturally vary according to individual tastes, the average requirements are very modest by any standard of comparison.

Nursing

TSCW's School of Nursing combines the finest of faculties with the finest of facilities. After 11 months at TSCW, the student nurse moves for the major part of her professional instruction to the new \$11,000,000 plant of the Parkland Memorial Hospital in nearby Dallas. This magnificent teaching hospital is so close to TSCW as to allow full integration of your program and continuous participation in campus activities. In your senior year you return to the TSCW campus for the final semester and join your class to receive the Bachelor of Science degree in the regular June Commencement. During your two and one-half years at Parkland Memorial the expense of your room, meals, uniforms and laundry are borne by the hospital. This is your opportunity to get your baccalaureate degree and complete your professional nursing program within four calendar years.

Biology

You can train thoroughly and soundly at TSCW for the Biological Sciences. Medical technologists educated here are in great demand, as are women biology teachers. Many TSCW pre-medical students have distinguished themselves as physicians. Research laboratories welcome women biologists, as shown by the records of TSCW graduates. Student assistantships are available; there is excellent preparation for graduate study.

Business and Economics

TSCW has complete courses in Business and Economics adapted to the interests of women. Majors in Accounting, Business Education, Economics, Foreign Trade, General Business, Merchandising, Secretarial Service. The College has a complete installation of International Business Machines, operation of which is in much demand. Special: one-year and two-year certificate program in Secretarial Training, at costs lower than those of most business schools.

Chemistry and Physics

The Departments of Chemistry and Physics are excellently equipped and well staffed to train students in the physical sciences. Three distinct degree programs are offered in Chemistry, preparing you for: (1) research positions or analytical or technical work in industrial, government or university laboratories; (2) technical secretarial or librarian positions in the chemical industry; (3) and teaching science in secondary schools. The student following the first plan frequently enters graduate school and earns advanced degrees. One degree program is offered in Physics, of particular value to those who wish to teach or carry on industrial work. The TSCW curriculum in General Science is well suited for the girl wishing to prepare for an engineering career. Our country needs scientifically trained women. TSCW offers that training.

Foreign Languages

The Foreign Languages Department offers excellent class instruction, with emphasis on the ability to speak and understand the language. A variety of advanced courses enables you to choose those best adapted to the career you wish: courses in commercial Spanish for majors in foreign trade, for example; courses on cultural lines to prepare for research and advanced studies, etc. Informal classes in conversation; records and recording machines. Majors in French, Latin and Spanish; other courses in German and Portuguese.

History and Government

The TSCW Department of History and Government gives students a background for understanding present-day institutions, thoughts and problems, and an understanding of how they developed. The members of the department sponsor the International Relations Club and the Campus League of Women Voters for students interested in current affairs and as a training for leadership in community life.

English

The TSCW English Department specializes in developing the individual student through a program uniting literary training with creative activities and coordinating oral and written English. Special features include the Writers' Conference directed annually by a writer of national distinction, the Freshman Writers' program, the English Honors Session for upperclassmen, and the English Workshop on Current Trends in English (summer session) for teachers and advanced students. You will also have opportunity to publish your literary work in *The Freshman Writer* and the *Daedalian Quarterly*, TSCW literary magazine. TSCW's courses in English rank with the best nationally.

Journalism

Students of the TSCW Department of Journalism publish *The Daily Lass-O*, only women's college daily newspaper, as part of their practical and complete four-year course. The Journalism Building has complete facilities for photography, advertising, typography and news. The students have their own engraving machine, for example, and learn to do any or all of the work in the College Press, located in the building. The department is one of two in Texas accredited by the National Council for Education in Journalism and cooperates with the Texas Daily Newspaper Association in the latter's internship program. Majors are News Writing and Editing, Advertising-Management, Home Economics Journalism, Radio-Journalism.

Library Science

Library Science is another field in which TSCW leads; educators say that nearly half of the librarians in Texas are graduates of this College. The department is fully accredited by the American Library Association and offers the courses that will give you the thorough preparation so many schools and public and private libraries require. TSCW offers both a four-year and a five-year degree in Library Science. As an undergraduate you may either major or minor in Library Science; the fifth year is a professional program leading to the Master of Library Science degree. TSCW is one of only three in Texas offering the M.L.S. degree.

Mathematics

The demand for women trained in mathematics for industrial, civil service and teaching positions far exceeds the supply, and the salaries are good. Oil and aircraft companies use an increasing number of computers each year. The Mathematics Department at TSCW prepares you for these positions and also for further study in the field of mathematics. A student who majors in mathematics has time to round out her education by taking courses in other departments.

Occupational Therapy

TSCW is the only College in the Southwest offering undergraduate training in Occupational Therapy. The major was added in 1944 as a result of the demand for more trained people in this profession. It was set up according to the plan of the American Occupational Therapy Association and the American Medical Association, and has continued with their approval. The program is affiliated with the Southwestern Medical College of the University of Texas at Dallas. Training at TSCW consists of courses on theory of occupational therapy, basic sciences, various medical subjects, psychology and design and crafts. Music, drama and sports and games often play a big part in the healing process and you will take part of your work in departments offering these courses.

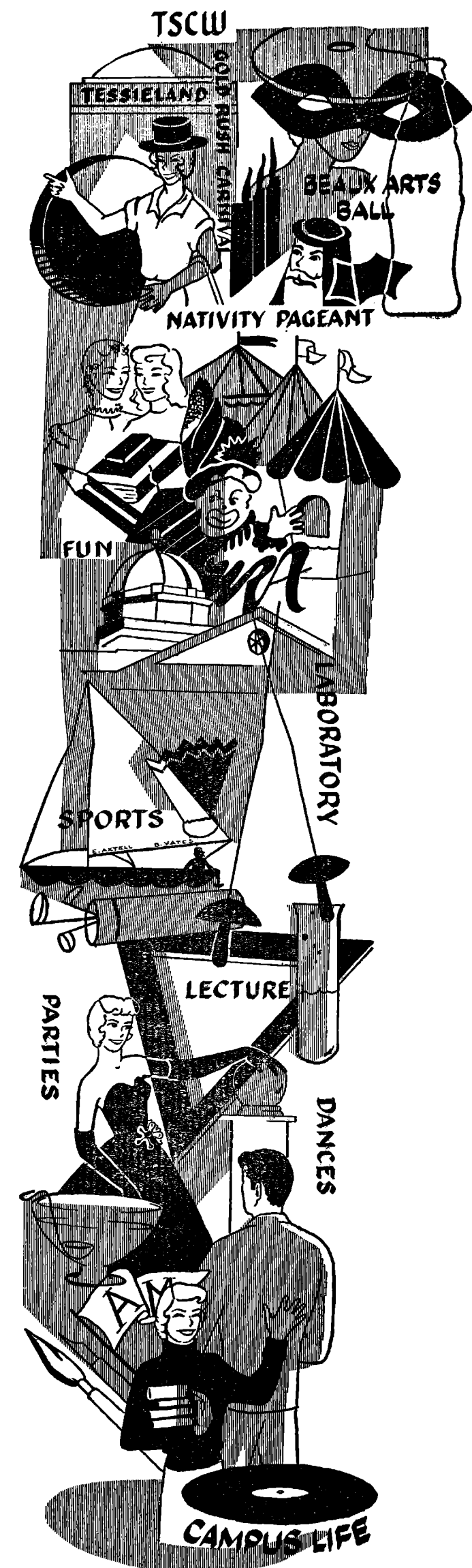

Sociology

If you are interested in people, family relationships, social adjustment or community activities, a sociology major at TSCW offers the training which you need. A sociology major prepares you for many occupations: (1) teaching of sociology, which in public school is often known as Social Problems, Family Relations or Social Studies; (2) positions in industry and government such as "family-relations counselor," "criminologist," "personnel manager"; (3) religious education and church work; (4) social work in fields such as child welfare, public assistance, group work and recreation, programs for prevention and treatment of delinquency. TSCW was the first college in Texas to offer a planned sequence in pre-professional social work and its graduates have always been in demand.

Speech

The TSCW Department of Speech emphasizes Dramatics and Interpretation, Radio, Television, Corrective Speech, the teaching of Speech. At the TSCW radio station you will perform all the tasks and obtain first-hand experience in all phases of radio writing, programming, performing and managing. Students do professional radio and television work with a major Dallas station. TSCW also leads in Speech Therapy, a new field that is becoming more important each year.



Your First Year at TSCW

Just as important as the first step you took in your life or your first date — will be your first year at college. When you decide to go to Texas State College or Women, what will your first year be like?

Before class registration begins in the fall, you will take part in Orientation meetings. The purpose behind Orientation is two-fold: to acquaint you with TSCW and to give the College information about yourself and your capabilities. In reality, Orientation extends throughout the entire first week, with social gatherings and all-college affairs scheduled each night. About the tests—they are not entrance tests; you have already been admitted to the College by the time you arrive on the campus. The results of these tests help your advisers place you to your best advantage in course assignments.

You will discover that college will be quite different from high school. You will not be in class steadily from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. daily, nor will your schedule follow the same pattern.

You will find that some of your classes meet only once or twice a week while others, such as typing and shorthand,

may meet five times. You will be in class (if you have a normal schedule) anywhere from 16 to 25 hours a week, depending upon the number of laboratory courses in which you are enrolled.

A typical freshman schedule may include 8:15, 9:15 and 10:15 classes on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, one or two classes on alternate days and perhaps a laboratory one afternoon a week. So, you see, you will have ample time for the study which will be required, and recreation and extra-curricular activities.

The TSCW General Catalog lists courses available in the various divisions of the College. In general, first semester courses for freshmen are numbered 111, 121, 131 and 141. The first number of each indicates the course is for freshmen, the second gives the number of semester hours credit, and the third indicates whether the course is offered the first or the second semester. For example, you would take English 131 during your first semester and English 132 during your second. You would receive three semester hours credit each semester, a total of six in all for your first year of English study.

The normal course load is 16 semester hours plus physical education. First-year students also take the unique one-hour Personality course and may also elect one hour of applied music, choral speaking, modern dance, freshman drama, home economics, French or Spanish. You must take at least 12 semester hours unless the Dean of the College gives you special permission to carry less.
