UNIVERSITY BULLETIN Texas Woman's University

Charges at the Texas Woman's University are moderate. Tuition for the present academic year (1968-69) has been set at \$100 for residents of Texas and an additional \$150 per semester for out-of-state students, required by Texas law. Required fees for each student average \$70 per semester. Room and board charges vary with the type of accommodation selected and may be paid on an installment plan of four payments each semester.

In addition to the moderate initial expense, TWU points to the many opportunities provided at no added cost from the beginning of the freshman year. And of utmost importance is the fact that all offices are held by women students; you will have the opportunities for participation and leadership available only on a campus like that of TWU. All-University organizations include the Campus Government Association, the Round Table, the Student Council of Social Activities, and the Student Council of Religious Activities. The religious program of the University, in its emphasis on personal needs and growth, supplements and strengthens the religious experiences which a student derives from her own church. Every girl is encouraged and urged to attend the church of her choice in addition to participating in the spiritual enrichment programs of the University.

Typical opportunities awaiting a new student are the following: Membership in departmental or special groups outside the major field which entitle the non-major to professional instruction and participation in programs on and off the campus.

Visitors and guests are always welcome on the campus of the Texas Woman's University. Those desiring information or assistance should go by the Office of the Director of Admissions and Registrar.

The dynamic quality of the intangibles which make us a great institution is supported by our devotion to sound standards, worthy goals, high moral and spiritual principles, and a lofty sense of mission."

Whatever your objectives, you will find in your chosen fields a well-trained faculty, well-equipped laboratories, and complete aids for study and research. Your courses, moreover, are designed to meet the special needs and interests of women, thus utilizing one of the unique advantages of a woman's university.

TWU's physical plant continues to expand. The newest and most exciting residence facility, 21-story Nelda C. Stark Hall, was opened in September of 1967. It houses 640 students. Now under construction are another tower dormitory, a 14-story General Purpose Classroom and Office Building, and a modern Student Center, all to be completed by September of 1969.

Campus recreational facilities include outdoor and indoor swimming pools, 18-hole golf course and clubhouse, tennis courts, athletic fields, and campsites on nearby lakes.

The Texas Woman's University ranks with the finest in the nation. Career specialties have been arranged for you, along with a rich program in liberal arts. The University is famed for the superiority and variety of its extensive career sequences, a number of which are available only at TWU.
