DEAR HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR:

*This is a letter to you from the four Classes of the Texas Woman's University. We invite you to share in our advantages and opportunities.*

The faculty, the physical plant (four new air-conditioned buildings were completed in 1956 and six more now are being constructed), the equipment, the undergraduate and graduate programs, the student body and alumnae corps, the traditions, and other resources which are part of the University rank with the finest in the nation. *The many advantages of the women's university have been dramatically demonstrated at TWU.*

*Career specialties have been arranged for you, along with a rich program in the liberal arts. The University is famed for the superiority and variety of its extensive career sequences, a number of which are available only at TWU. On the reverse side is a list of course groups leading to degrees, all planned in content and purpose for careers for young women. (The University publishes an up-to-date *Careers for Women* bulletin. If you have not received a copy, ask your school librarian to show you one or write the Registrar.) Students may register in classes outside their major field and thus use additional facilities and equipment. For example, home economics and education majors may enjoy class piano, voice, speech, dance, journalism, photography, radio-TV, etc.*

*Charges for attending Texas Woman's University are very moderate. (This fact was commented on by Clarence E. Lovejoy, counselor, in his article, "How to Choose a College," in a recent issue of the *Saturday Evening Post*.)*

The total is only \$648.00 for the nine months' session (two complete semesters). This includes your room in the Regular Dormitory System and meals in the Central Dining Hall, tuition, and medical, activity, and linen fees. The University furnishes your textbooks (which would cost approximately \$60.00) without added charge. A season ticket to all Concert and Drama Series programs is included. The linen fee includes laundering of bed linens (which are furnished by the University) of students in the Regular Dormitory System.

Only additional costs are very small fees for laboratory courses (\$2.00 for a three-semester-hour course) and private instruction in music.

Girls who need very much to economize may apply for residence in the Cooperative System, where room and board is available at a substantially lower rate.

Note: By Texas law, out-of-state girls pay an additional \$125.00 tuition each semester of the 1958-59 long session. This sum is payable at registration. The total for full-time out-of-state and foreign students is \$898.00 for the nine months' session.

*In addition to the low initial expense, TWU points to the many opportunities provided at no added cost from the beginning of the freshman year. And of utmost importance is the fact that all offices are held by women students; you will have opportunities for participation and leadership available only on a campus like that of TWU. All-university organizations include the Campus Government Association, the Round Table, the Student Council of Social Activities, the Student Finance Council, the Women's Recreation Association, and the Student Council of Religious Activities. The religious program of the University, in its emphasis on personal*

*needs and growth, supplements and strengthens the religious experiences which a student derives from her own church. Every girl is encouraged and urged to attend the church of her choice in addition to participating in the spiritual enrichment programs of the University. The university-wide Student Council of Religious Activities presents the Denton clergy and the directors of student activities in the local congregations at the first assembly in September. Religious Emphasis Week, weekly dormitory vespers, and early Sunday services in the Little Chapel-in-the-Woods are only a few events in a continuous spiritual program planned to make religion a daily creative experience.*

*Typical of the opportunities awaiting a new student are the following: Membership in departmental or special groups outside the major field which entitle the non-major to professional instruction and participation in programs on and off the campus. Examples are as follows: The University Chorus may be composed of majors in all fields, in addition to music, including those who have had no previous training or experience in vocal work; Modern Choir, University Symphony, and the Lass-O Band appeal to majors in a variety of other fields who participated in high school vocal or instrumental groups (practice rooms, instruments, music furnished); Aquatics Club and synchronized swimming programs are enjoyed the year round by beginning or expert swimmers; ballroom, folk, or modern dance clubs offer opportunity for learning, practice and proficiency; professional coaching improves skills in new sports in classes and clubs. There are off-campus recreation sites at Lake Dallas and Lake Texoma. Experience in editing and publishing yearbooks, newspapers and magazines is gained by working under the guidance and supervision of professional journalists and teachers (this includes daily newspaper, yearbook and literary magazine of student creative talent).*

*Everybody participates at TWU. You will be welcomed into all activities. You will be called by your first name throughout the 220-acre campus . . . because this is a friendly campus where the individual is most important.*

*TWU is located in the Dallas-Fort Worth metropolitan area. These cities offer excellent supplemental facilities in various curricula, as well as additional cultural and social advantages. Students' dates are welcomed on the campus and large numbers of men students from Texas A&M and neighboring institutions visit the campus throughout the year. Any student may bring her auto to the campus.*

*The Program of Activities and Study in 1958-59 will be outstanding in interest as well as quality. It is customary to make reservations early, and applications are being received in considerable numbers.*
