DEAR HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR:

We invite you to read what we students of Texas State College for Women say about our college. And we want you to share our advantages and opportunities.

The faculty, the plant (including more than threescore buildings), the equipment, the undergraduate and graduate programs, the student body, the alumnae corps, the traditions, and other assets which are part of the College rank with the finest in the nation. Aside from any consideration of the unexcelled quality at an institution of higher learning for women, TSCW enjoys wide and favorable renown because it is—distinctively—a great university exclusively for women. The innumerable advantages of the woman's college, or university, have nowhere in the United States been more dramatically demonstrated than at TSCW.

**COSTS ARE VERY LOW.** The College wishes to make it possible for every girl to get a superior college education. TSCW expenses are only \$293 each semester. This includes board and room, tuition, and linen and activity fees. *The College furnishes textbooks without charge.* (Tuition costs for out-of-Texas students are \$50 additional each semester.) For the girls who need very much to economize, the Rusk Cooperative System is available at a substantially lower rate. In all cases, room and board may be paid on the installment plan. While personal expenses naturally vary according to individual tastes, the average requirements are very modest by any standard of comparison. Also, many scholarships are available, not to mention opportunity to qualify for campus employment.

**EVERYBODY PARTICIPATES.** You will be welcomed into all the activities, quickly gaining interesting out-of-class experiences under professional guidance. Your role never is subordinate. You will be called by your first name throughout the 220-acre campus. . . because this is a friendly college where the individual always is most important.

**CAREER SPECIALTIES HAVE BEEN ARRANGED FOR YOU,** along with a rich program in the liberal arts. The College is famed for the superiority and variety of its extensive career sequences, a number of which are available only at TSCW. You will find what you want and need in many specialized fields. On the reverse side—with more comments by students—is a long list of majors leading to degrees, all planned exactly in content and purpose for careers for young women.
