Texas State College For Women

The State University for Women . . . TSCW Station, Denton, Texas

DEAR HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR:

We invite you to read what we students of the Texas State College for Women say about our college. And we want you to share our advantages and opportunities.

The faculty, the plant (four new air-conditioned buildings are being completed in March, 1956), the equipment, the undergraduate and graduate programs, the student body and alumnae corps, the traditions, and other assets which are part of the College rank with the finest in the nation. The many advantages of the women's college or university have been dramatically demonstrated at TSCW.

Career specialties have been arranged for you, along with a rich program in the liberal arts. The College is famed for the superiority and variety of its extensive career sequences, a number of which are available only at TSCW. On the reverse side — with more comment by students — is a list of course groups leading to degrees, all planned in content and purpose for careers for young women. (The College publishes an up-to-date Careers for Women bulletin. If you have not received a copy, ask your school librarian to show you one or write the TSCW Registrar.) Students may register in classes outside their major field and thus use additional facilities and equipment. For example, home economics and education majors may enjoy class piano, voice, speech, dance, journalism, photography, radio-TV, etc.

Charges for attending the Texas State College for Women are among the lowest in the nation. (This fact was commented on by Clarence E. Lovejoy, counselor, in his article, 'How to Choose a College,' in the Nov. 19, 1955, Saturday Evening Post.) The total is only \$586.00 for the nine months' session (two complete semesters). This includes your room and board, tuition, medical and linen and activity fees. The College furnishes your textbooks (which would cost approximately \$50.00) without added charge. Only additional costs are very small fees for laboratory courses (\$2 for a three-semester hour course) and private instruction in music. Girls who need very much to economize may apply for residence in the Rusk Co-operative System, in which room and board is available at a substantially lower rate. The College also has a number of student aids, in the form of scholarships and work opportunities. (Tuition costs for out-of-Texas girls are \$50.00 additional each semester.)

In addition to the low initial expense, TSCW points to the many opportunities provided at no added cost from the beginning of the freshman year. These include membership in departmental or special groups outside the major field which en-

titles the non-major to professional instruction and participation in programs on and off the campus. Examples are as follows: The College Chorus may be composed of majors in all fields, in addition to music, including those who have no previous training or experience in vocal work; Modern Choir, Singing Stars, College Symphony, and Band appeal to majors in Nursing, Occupational Therapy, and a variety of other fields who participated in high school vocal or instrumental groups (practice rooms, instruments, music furnished); Aquatics Club and synchronized swimming programs are enjoyed the year round by beginning or expert swimmers; ballroom, folk or modern dance clubs offer opportunity for learning, practice and proficiency; professional coaching improves skills in new sports in classes and clubs. There are off-campus recreation sites at Lake Dallas and Lake Texoma. Experience in editing and publishing yearbooks, newspapers and magazines is gained by working under the guidance and supervision of professional journalists and teachers (this includes daily newspaper, yearbook and literary magazine of student creative talent in college printing plant.)

Everybody participates at TSCW. You will be welcomed into all activities. You will be called by your first name throughout the 220-acre campus . . . because this is a friendly campus where the individual is most important.

TSCW is located in the Dallas-Fort Worth metropolitan area. These cities offer excellent additional laboratory facilities for many of the college classes as well as additional cultural and social advantages. TSCW students enjoy their leisure time, and dating rules are those of the normal home. Dates are welcomed on the campus and large numbers of men students from Texas A&M and neighboring institutions visit the campus throughout the year. Any student, including freshmen, may bring her auto to the campus.

The Program of Activities and Study at TSCW for 1956-57 will be outstanding in interest as well as quality. It is customary to make reservations early at TSCW, and applications are being received in considerable numbers.
