TWU will play host to the second annual Symposium on Second Language Acquisition and Cultural Diversity from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, June 16. The event will take place in the MCL Building.

Dr. Kathy Escamilla, a professor in the department of teacher education at the University of Colorado at Boulder, and Dr. Gwendolyn Webb-Johnson, a professor at the University of Texas at Austin, will join author and storyteller Joe Hayes as presenters. Topics include eliminating barriers for at-risk students,

family literacy, infusing Hispanic culture into the curriculum, and TAAS (Texas Assessment of Academic Skills) strategies with ESL/bilingual students.
